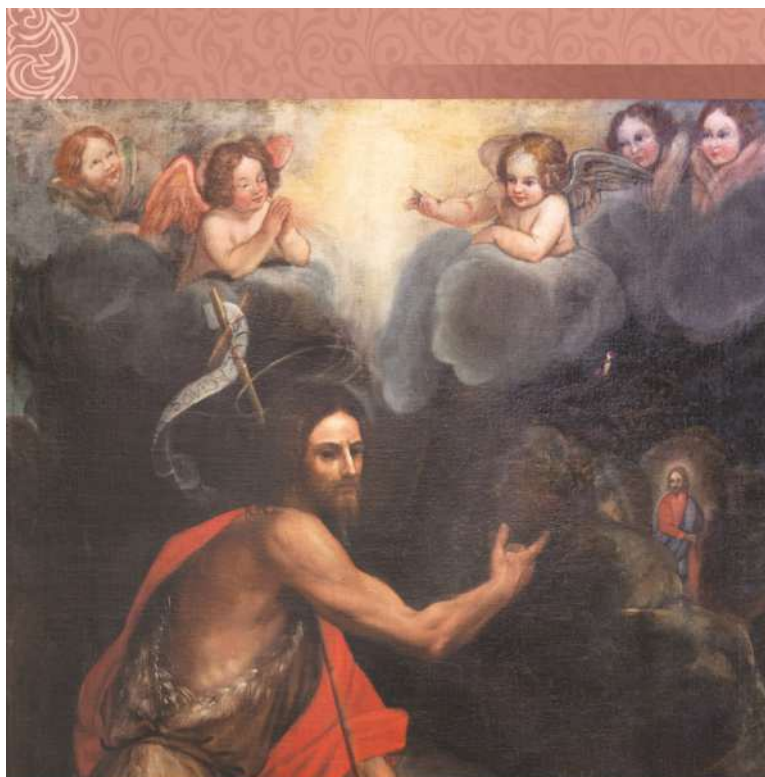

Dear Parishioners,

In this recent season of Advent and Christmas we enjoyed the anticipation of the arrival of Jesus both yet to come and His birth over two thousand years ago in Bethlehem. Infant Baptism

Infants accept the faith through the faith of their parents. Our parish offers group sessions to prepare parents for the baptism ceremony and for leading their children in a life of faith. Sessions are held twice per month, all year round. It may be easier to participate in a session before the child is born. Please call or email to register for the Baptism Preparation session and to schedule your child's baptism.

One **Catholic godparent** is needed, who must be a **Confirmed, practicing Catholic** at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, there should be **one male and one female**. There should not be more than two godparents. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness in addition to the Catholic godparent.

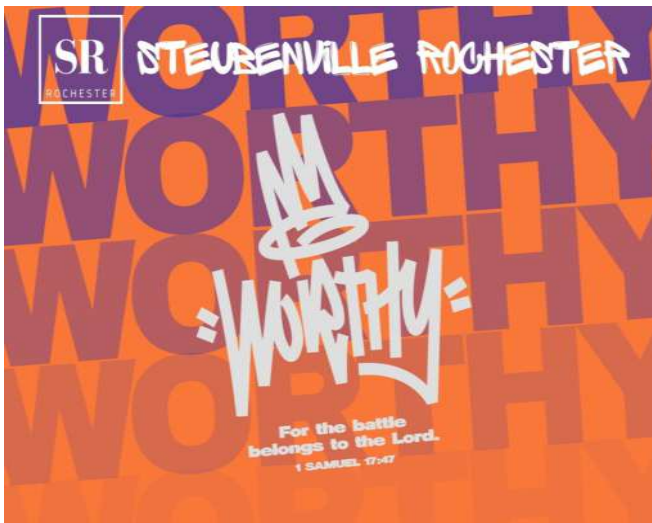

Understanding the Sacraments God's Grace Guaranteed!

As I said last week, a Sacrament is not just a symbol. It does something! It actually conveys grace to the soul when you receive it. If you're properly disposed (ready to receive it), the grace is guaranteed because the Church, established by Christ and given His authority, promises that. The Bible does too.

Because of their effects, Sacraments are organized into three categories.

First, the **Sacraments of Initiation:**

Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.

We are born anew by Baptism. We are strengthened in Confirmation and nourished by the Eucharist. That is why daily Mass is encouraged. You need food every day to move forward physically, and so your soul needs the spiritual food of the Eucharist.

Next, we have the **Sacraments of Healing:**

Reconciliation (Penance or Confession) and the Anointing of the Sick.

If we go to the doctor to heal, why wouldn't we believe we need to go to a doctor for our soul (the priest) in Confession? Anointing of the Sick, heals the soul and, hopefully, the body as well.

Lastly, the **Sacraments of Service:**

Matrimony and Holy Orders.

If you are married, your service is to your spouse and your family. If you are an ordained priest, your service is to your congregation. A priest's service is also to educate you in the faith and offer the Sacraments, so you can know God more to love Him more and ultimately get to heaven.

St. Thomas Aquinas said that all Sacraments are directed to the Holy Eucharist: "The highest place belongs to the sacraments whereby man is sanctified: chief of which is the sacrament itself of the Eucharist. Baptism is the beginning of the spiritual life, and the door of the sacraments; whereas the Eucharist is, as it were, the consummation of the spiritual life, and the end of all the sacraments."

Each Sacrament leads us to the heart of life in Christ, the Eucharist: the "source and summit of our Catholic faith" (*Catechism*, 1324). All Sacraments give us grace. But the Eucharist gives us Jesus Himself. Which is why it's the greatest of the seven Sacraments. Each time we receive the Eucharist we're implanting Jesus Himself into our body and soul; He comes to strengthen and nourish us spiritually.

Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy

Matthew Kelly makes some interesting observations about Jesus in his book, *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy*. He notes, for example, that “Jesus was never in a hurry.”

I remember the first time that this thought occurred to me. I was in my mid-20s and working for InterVarsity Christian Fellowship, a ministry to college students and faculty across the country. I had spent over a year partnering with a small team to prepare for and host a conference for about 1,200 graduate students, held in between Christmas and New Year’s. It had been a labor-intensive fall leading up to the event, and at the conference itself, I don’t remember getting much sleep. I was so tired by the end that I fell asleep (unintentionally) in the baggage claim of the airport while I was waiting for my dad to pick me up.

The last talk of the conference was given by Dallas Willard, a Baptist pastor and philosophy professor at the University of Southern California. I don’t often remember quotes from talks, but Dallas said something that caught my attention that evening: “Jesus was the most relaxed person who ever lived.” I’m sure it stood out because I had been living the exact opposite! At that moment, I felt a lot more like the most stressed person who ever lived. I wondered if there was any way I could learn to be like him.

Both Matthew Kelly and Dallas Willard noticed the peace and purposefulness of Jesus. I am still learning how to live that way, but I have learned a couple things in the 20 or more years since that conference. If I want to try to live with the kind of peace and purposefulness I see in Jesus, I need to know what my truest “yes” is, so that I can also know when to say “no.”

Most of the time when I am stressed it’s because I have said “yes” to too many things – good things, but ones that don’t fit the big “yes” of my life, the one God is inviting me to say. When I start to feel frazzled or frayed around the edges, it’s become a sign to me that I need to stop and listen again to God’s quiet voice. What is really most important? Where does God want me to focus my time and energy? What do I need to say “no” to, so that I can say “yes” to the right things?



Jesus, help us to know, like you did, what our truest “yes” is for each day – to do only what the Father wills, nothing more and nothing less – and to trust that will be more than enough.
