

With a deeper connection to God, the Holy Spirit will then inspire us to find ways to Share Jesus with others.





Sunday, January 11 a group from our parish attended the Youth Rally in De Pere. We had fun playing games, heard from a couple of speakers, worked on a project for the homeless community and ended with music.



Holy Baptism is the basic of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water and in word." ~*Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1213*

At one time or another, we have been asked, "Are you saved?" Until recently, I never really knew how to answer this question, "Yes, of course, I know Jesus. But now I respond, "Yes, I've been baptized 'in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.' I have been saved through the Sacrament of Baptism, and as long as I stay true to those vows of Baptism and living my Christian faith, I will have eternal life." It's as simple as that.

To "baptize" means to "immerse" but not just in water, the one who is baptized is immersed into the death of Christ and rises with him in new life. Jesus said, "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit" Baptism is the *true* born-again experience.

There are three elements that give Baptism it's unique character, matter, minister and form. The *matter* is the physical sign, water. Nothing can live without water and our souls need the water of Baptism to live, to have eternal life. This water is also a sign of the cleansing of our souls of original sin, in God's mercy.

The *minister* of Baptism is a priest, deacon, or bishop. The *form*, or ritual, is simply the words that are spoken during a Sacrament. The words "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" are spoken at Baptism, as water is poured on the forehead three times, one for each person of the Trinity, by the priest or deacon. This is called the trinitarian formula and must be said exactly, or the Baptism is invalid.

Anointing with sacred chrism oil on the forehead in the shape of a cross is done by the priest or deacon. Candles and white christening gowns are wonderful additions to the ceremony, but not necessary.

For the grace of Baptism to unfold, the parents' help is important. So too is the role of the godmother and godfather, who must be firm believers, able and ready to help the newly baptized, child or adult, on the road of Christian life. The whole community bears some responsibility for the development and safeguarding of the grace given at Baptism.

SLowing Down to the Speed of Joy

In his book, *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy*, Matthew Kelly tells us that the “one thing” that will change our lives, when it comes to the frantic pace we keep, is Sabbath.

He writes: “I promised you one very specific form of leisure that will change your life. Sunday is it. The wisdom of the Sabbath will teach you how to slow down to the speed of joy. It’s the one thing that will help you restore your capacity for leisure and lead you to flourish like never before. Sunday will create margin to love like never before and carry out the great human mandate to love God and neighbor wholeheartedly. Sunday is the one thing from which so many other good things will flow.”

God invites us to true rest, and keeping a Sabbath – a day focused on worship, relationships, and things that renew us – is one of his greatest gifts to us. Unfortunately, we often reject this gift and think we have a better way of organizing our time. I don’t know about you, but things don’t go so well for me when I ignore a weekly Sabbath rest.

For some of us, Sunday is not the easiest day to rest, especially if our jobs require us to work. Is there another day of the week that could become our day to pause and step off the treadmill of the daily grind?

For all of us, it is very challenging to make the countercultural decision to set Sunday apart for God.

One of the most powerful stories of Sabbath-keeping I’ve ever heard is of Eric Liddell, a Scottish athlete and devoted Christian, who competed as a sprinter in the 1924 Olympics. He was favored to win the gold in the 100-meter race. However, when he learned that the race would be held on Sunday, he refused to compete. Many people tried to persuade him otherwise. His archrival ran and won the race instead.

Instead, Liddell switched to the 400-meter race, a length he had not trained for, but which was not run on Sunday. Not only did he win the gold medal, but he also set a world record.

The same devotion to the Lord that Liddell showed in the 1924 Olympics led him to become a missionary to China. After many years of sharing the Gospel there, he died in an internment camp at the end of World War II, to the very end inspiring his fellow prisoners with his faithful witness to Jesus, holiness of life, and love for them.



We may not be ready for an Eric Liddell-level act of devotion to God, but what is one more step we could take to honor the Lord on Sunday? Being faithful in small things will help us to be faithful when the bigger opportunities come.






