

Dear Parishioners,

As you all know, **Bishop Ricken recently asked me to become the Vocations Director for the Diocese of Green Bay beginning July 1st, 2026**. Many of you have asked me, *“What does the Vocations Director do?” Having never held this position before, I will attempt to answer that question here.*

1. The Vocations Director fosters a Culture of Vocations - One of Bishop Ricken's priorities over the last 5-10 years has been to promote Vocations to the Priesthood. The Vocations Director helps to ensure that there is a culture in the Diocese of Green Bay that makes young people feel comfortable saying “yes” to a call to the priesthood or religious life. He does so in many ways including traveling the diocese, preaching on Vocations, encouraging prayer for Vocations, organizing Vocational discernment events, and spending time in diocesan schools.
2. The Vocations Director is the supervisor for the Diocesan Seminarians - The Vocations director walks with potential seminarians through their discernment, their application process, and then guides them through seminary. Working with the Bishop, the Vocations director decides where our seminarians are sent to be formed and how the seminarians spend their summers. He also keeps in touch with the seminarians via regular phone calls and visits to the seminaries.
3. The Vocations Director is the Master of Ceremonies for the Bishop - As Bishop travels the diocese to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Vocations director serves as his Master of Ceremonies. Essentially, the Vocations director makes sure that the Confirmation liturgy runs smoothly.

Other duties as assigned! I look forward to serving the diocese in this role. Please let me know what other questions you have. Let's enjoy the next five months together at St. Raphael.





CONFIRMATION



It must be explained to the faithful that the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace. For "by the sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized are more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit. Hence, they are, as true witnesses of Christ, more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." ~*Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1285*

Few people know that Confirmation completes and strengthens Baptism. Confirmation brings a "confirming" or deepening of baptismal grace. Saint John Henry Newman said that "Confirmation seals in their fullness, winds up and consigns, completes the entire round of those sanctifying gifts which are begun, which are given in Baptism.

I like to call Confirmation the *Sacrament of Battle*, where you become a soldier of Christ. In a way, you become an "adult" in the faith, which is not dependent on your age (and perhaps that's why the age of Confirmation varies so greatly around the world). Confirmation is the most underrated of all the seven Sacraments and often overlooked. And yet it increases the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord which were received at Baptism and allow us to fight this battle and be victorious.

We don't have a prayer of winning this battle and finding salvation if we are not armed with these spiritual weapons. At Confirmation these gifts of the Holy Spirit give the recipient the power to overcome occasions of sin and rise to a new level of holiness.

Canon law states that it is the parent's role to see that their children are properly instructed. Confirmation is part of that instruction. You probably could force your child to be confirmed, but you can't force them to have the proper disposition or openness to receiving those graces flowing into their life and into their hearts. For that to happen, we can only pray and help them prepare their hearts as much as possible. You have the right and obligation as a parent to see that your child is educated in the Catholic faith, just as you have the right and obligation to see that they are educated at school. This way, they are best prepared for life and the life after this life. Thus, if you want to get to Heaven, Confirmation gives you the tools to get there.

Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy

In this new year, with the help of the Matthew Kelly book we gave out at our Christmas Masses, we have been focusing on the theme of slowing down our lives so that we can find true rest and joy in God.

February is about the time when most of us abandon our New Year's resolutions. If you made a resolution to find a more balanced rhythm of life for yourself and your family, I encourage you not to give up! The world is not on your side; it rarely is when it comes to the things that matter most. Making time for God in our 24/7 culture will always be a struggle. But it is worth it.

Like many struggles, the internal one is the hardest. There are many competing demands on our time, and most of us could use a personal assistant to help us keep track of our calendars. But when I think about what makes it hardest for me to rest, the internal expectations I carry within me are, by far, the most demanding. I often have an "ideal" image of what my life "should" look like, and somehow it makes my life as it is always look like it's not enough. When I find myself operating from that place of "living up to my ideals, and expectations," it's become a warning sign that I am off track.

When I was talking about this once with my spiritual director, he made a comment that I return to as a compass that helps me get back on the right path. "Sara, what if you sought to live from invitation, instead of expectation?" Invitation. Not expectation.

Contrary to how we sometimes think, God does not bury us in expectations. God is not standing next to us with a check-off list to make sure we've completed all our tasks for the day. Instead, God invites, and we are given the opportunity to say yes. I've learned that the expectations I place on myself tangle me up in knots and kill the joy in my life. The invitations that come from our Lord bring true freedom, peace, joy, and life.

If you are having a hard time slowing down, I would encourage you to take a few minutes in prayer today to make a list of the invitations and expectations you have in your life. Ask Jesus for his help to say yes to what will bring greater freedom, peace, and joy – and to say no to the expectations that are not from him. What one step is he inviting you to today?
