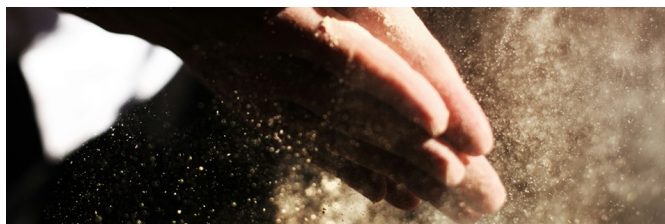

Choosing how to be Salt and Light

"You are the salt of the earth ... You are the light of the world. Whoever is salt and light gives glory to my heavenly Faith." (Matthew 5:13-16)

This Sunday's Gospel by Matthew is a continuation of his recounting of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount from last weekend's scriptures. As I was praying and discerning in which direction I was going to take this "Dear Parishioners" column, I came across a homily from one of my spiritual fathers, Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM that comes from a different perspective. So, I decided to share it with you.

Fr. Richard wrote in his homily that *"The great temptation of Christianity has always been to think that if we were in control, if we had power, we would 'win,' but that's exactly what Jesus warns us against. In Matthew's Gospel Jesus tells us to be salt—not the meat, the potatoes, or even the vegetables—just the invisible but very effective salt. Salt is what gives zing and taste to food and Jesus is calling us to be people who give purpose, meaning, and desire to life. If we look at the history of Christianity, whenever we were 'in charge,' that's when we became the most corrupt. Christianity operates best in a resistance position, in a position where we can discern and choose how to be salt, how to be light.*

Likewise, the metaphor of light as Jesus uses it here is not controlling or forceful. As Alcoholics Anonymous says, it's not moving forward by self-promotion, but by attraction. Just set the light on the lampstand and if it's good, and if it's real, and if it's beautiful, people will come. This is very different than what we expect. We basically think we can only move the world by being in control. Yet both of the images that Jesus offers here warn us against wanting to be in control.

That is so contrary to our common sense. We think "if only we had the power, if only we had the majority, we could create the kingdom of God," but it's never been true. I know from my years of traveling that when Christians are a minority in a country, and they have to choose and decide to be the salt of the earth, to be light on a lampstand, they make a real difference.

Jesus calls us to give the world taste, meaning, purpose, direction, desire. It's a humble position, isn't it? We'd much sooner be in charge. But whenever someone or something has all the power, they mostly misuse power. Jesus warns us against power, because very few people can handle it. Most of us use it for our own aggrandizement, our own promotion and advancement in the ways of the world, which usually means more money and more power.

Either we learn how to be the salt of the earth, a true alternative to the normal motivations and actions of society, or as Jesus put it very clearly, we might as well throw it out and trample it underfoot. We have to find our inner authority through Christ in us; we have to find our purpose in our love of God and neighbor, and actions of mercy and justice. Otherwise, we're not offering anything that the world doesn't already have or can't find in other places."

Heavenly Hero for February: St. Paul Miki and Companions

Born: 1562 in Japan
Died: 1597
Feast Day: February 6th
Patronage: Japan



Paul Miki was a martyr of Japan, with twenty-five companions. Paul was a member of the noble Miki family, a samurai clan. He was educated by the Jesuits in their missionary seminary and joined the Society of Jesus in 1580, with hopes of becoming a priest. Paul, famous as a preacher and evangelist, was arrested by the commanding general of Japan, Hideyosh for sharing his faith, which was forbidden. Paul and his companions were taken to a hill called Nishizaka, just outside of Nagasaki. There they were bound to crosses and pierced with two lances in the abdomen.

While hanging upon a cross, Paul Miki preached to the people gathered for the execution: *"I am a true Japanese. The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ...I thank God it is for this reason I die. I believe that I am telling only the truth before I die. I know you believe me and I want to say to you all once again: Ask Christ to help you to become happy. I obey Christ. After Christ's example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain."* This martyrdom was witnessed by several thousand Japanese people, both Christian and non-Christian.

The hill upon which Paul and his companions died is now called "the Hill of the Martyrs." A stone cross and twenty-six trees stand upon the summit. The martyrs were canonized on Pentecost Sunday in 1862.

Talking Point with Children: St. Paul Miki is an example of both great courage and forgiveness. He stood up for his beliefs, even though he knew that he would be put to death. Just like Jesus, he forgave the people who hung him on a cross. His final words were a prayer that others would come to know Jesus through his example.

Action Step for Children: Paul Miki wanted everyone to hear the Good News of Jesus. This week, share your faith with one other person. You can do this by praying before you eat lunch at school, inviting someone to church with you, or by wearing a crucifix or saint medal each day.

Holy Eucharist

The Holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation. Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation participate with the whole community in the Lord's own sacrifice by means of the Eucharist. ~*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1322

Baptism and Confirmation initiate the individual into Christianity, but Holy Eucharist, or Holy Communion completes this initiation. The Eucharist connects the person with the rest of the Church at the wedding feast of the Lamb.

We hear all the time about the importance of the Eucharist, but we sometimes don't understand why. Well, it's all about mercy. There is nothing the world needs more today than Divine Mercy, as Pope John Paul II told us, and there is no greater manifestation of the mercy of God than in the Most Holy Eucharist. Our bodies need food, so it is logical to conclude our souls do as well. That's Holy Communion; it is true soul food. Our Lord leaves His Body and Blood in the form of a Host so He can remain with us until the end of time.

Sadly, even Catholics often state that they believe that the Eucharist is only a symbol of the Body of Christ, not actually the Body of Christ. That is incorrect. John 6 is a treasure of grace explaining the Eucharist. In that chapter Jesus says, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh" ~Jn 6:51.

Why did Jesus call himself the Bread of Life in the Gospel of John? It also ties to the Trinity, specifically the father, and we can see connections to God's Word given to Israel across its history. The idea of the Word of God as bread was common in Jewish thinking. We aren't to just live "live on bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD". Who came from the mouth of God the Father? Jesus, so we are to live on Him, and we do so in the Eucharist.



Bread is the very staple of life. We could not live without food for very long. That's why we have Mass! Mass comes from the Latin word missa, "dismissal" which implies a "mission." Be fed and go!

Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy

For the last several weeks, we have considered some ways that we can make more room for God in our lives. If that is going well for you, awesome! If not, keep trying! It is hard to change our habits, especially when everything in the world around us seems to work against us. But little changes build to bigger things over time. Even our failures have a lot to teach us about ourselves and about God's love for us, no matter what. So let's not be discouraged by any setbacks we experience. The goal of a more fully human life with God is too important to give up on.

Instead, when we fall short, let's follow the very simple advice of a priest who lived about 200 years ago. Venerable Bruno Lanteri always encouraged his followers to **"begin again."** Here are a couple quotes from him that I hope will inspire us not to give up.

"If I should fall a thousand times a day, a thousand times a day I will begin again, with new awareness of my weakness, promising God, with a peaceful heart, to amend my life. I will never think of God as if he were of our condition and grows weary of our wavering, weakness, and negligence. Rather, I will think of what is truly characteristic of him and what he prizes most highly, that is, his goodness and mercy, knowing that he is a loving Father who understands our weakness, is patient with us, and forgives us."

"Be on guard against discouragement and lack of trust. Strive to do well all that you do, but do this with respect for your humanity, without striving for an impossible perfection, focusing simply on the day at hand. Remember that 'The just man falls seven times a day,' and so you will find blessing in beginning not only every day, but every hour."



As Lent approaches, may we all seek and find God's grace to begin again every day and every hour to love him more and more.

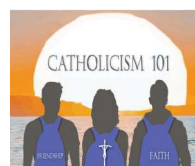

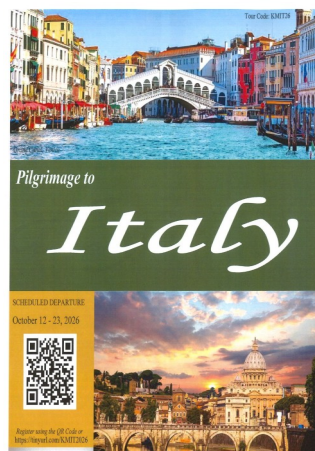

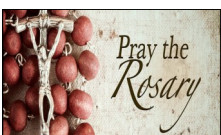
