

Lenten Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday, February 18, marks the beginning of Lent. The following fasting and abstinence regulations are observed:

Abstinence from meat is observed on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent by all Catholics 14 years and older.

Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may only take one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted as necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Dear Parishioners,

Lent begins this week! To get ready, let's remember the purpose of Lent. Lent makes us ready to more fully celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, which we call the Paschal Mystery.

For those to be baptized, Lent is a special time of immediate preparation. They have been preparing for at least a year and now they enter into these final weeks. We pray with them special rites (at the 10 AM Mass at our parish) to help them let go of anything not of God and to receive the graces ahead. They will be baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.



For those of us already baptized, Lent is a time of repentance so that we may more fully live out our baptismal promises. We reject sin and Satan and evil, and we renew our promise to follow Christ in his Church.

Whatever we "do" during Lent is meant to help us to draw closer to Christ. I encourage us to limit the amount of promises or goals during Lent, and instead focus on making room for Jesus and the Holy Spirit.

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are all intended to help us create space for God. We do less eating to train ourselves that we do not need so much stuff (food or otherwise) in our lives. This makes room for us to be more generous in giving time and money to the poor and those in need. As we fast from our screens and other things, we make room for God in prayer.

Let us pray for one another during this coming 40 days as we make room for Jesus and the Holy Spirit.



On February 8 we held the Rite of Sending. At the Rite of Sending, the sponsors testify that the candidates and Catechumens are ready for the Sacraments they will be receiving. This Rite offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the candidates have made and send them forth to Bishop Ricken with the parish's support and prayers.

On February 22 they will go to the Rite of Election at the Cathedral in Green Bay. At the Rite of Election the sponsors and mentors will again testify, in the presence of Bishop Ricken, to the candidates and Catechumens intention to receive Sacraments along with all of the other members of OCIA in different parishes of the Green Bay Diocese.

Reconciliation (Penance or Confession)

Those who approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation obtain pardon from God's mercy for the offense committed against him, and are, at the same time, reconciled with the Church which they have wounded by their sins and which by charity, by example, and by prayer labors for their conversion.

~Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1422



The Sacrament of Reconciliation, also called penance (or simply Confession), is not a human invention. Once we sin, we must not seek pardon on our own terms, but on God's terms, as we explain. This is why He gave us Confession.

Saint Faustina holds the key for us in her *Diary*. Jesus told St. Faustina that God's mercy primarily flows to us first in Scripture, but then in Reconciliation, the Sacrament of forgiveness and mercy.

God's mercy flows to us in the Eucharist, which Jesus says is love greater than death. In the Image of Divine Mercy, the rays coming from our Lord's Sacred Heart represent the Precious Blood of Holy Communion (the red ray) and the cleansing waters of Confession and Baptism (the pale ray). Satan's only two tools, sin and death, are wiped out by these two rays found in the image of Divine Mercy.

Jesus said “When you go to Confession, to this fountain of My mercy, the blood and water which came forth from My heart always flows down upon your soul. Every time you go to confession, immerse yourself entirely in My mercy, with great trust, so that I may pour the bounty of My grace upon your soul”



St Padre Pio taught the value of regular Confession. He urged all believers to confess at least once a week. “Even if a room is closed,” he said, “it is necessary to dust it after a week.” He added, “God runs after the most stubborn souls. They cost him too much to abandon them.”

Jesus heals the body in Anointing of the Sick (next week's topic), and he heals the soul in Confession. These are the Sacraments of Healing. Christ, the Physician of our body and soul, instituted these Sacraments because the new life that He gives us in the Sacraments like Baptism can be weakened and even lost because of sin. The new life of grace does not abolish the weakness of human nature, nor the inclination to sin. So, we can return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation whenever needed! This is incredible!

Making Room for Jesus

“What are you doing for Lent?” If someone hasn’t already asked you this question, they probably will soon. I’d like to suggest that we ask another question this year: “How are you making room for Jesus this Lent?” The gift of the Church’s penitential seasons, like Lent and Advent, is that we are invited to slow down and make space for God. Unfortunately, most of the time we do the opposite and overload ourselves! We get caught up in “doing” things, instead of focusing on making space simply to be with Jesus.

This Lent, I invite you to make room for Jesus in these ways. But if you feel the gentle nudge of the Holy Spirit to do something else, of course, pay attention to him!

1- Make room for Jesus through daily prayer. We’ll have some resources available in the Gathering Space, starting on Ash Wednesday, to help, including the **Word Among Us** (with daily Scripture readings and meditations), our **Little Black Books** (a favorite Lenten devotional), and a **selection of books** to encourage you in your spiritual reading. Please take whatever will help you, and enjoy it or pass it along to a friend.

2- Spend time with Jesus through our parish’s Lenten prayer opportunities. More details are available in this bulletin about our weekly mini-retreat in March, Stations of the Cross, Second Sunday Holy Hour, and our Lenten Taize Service.

3- Stop in at church daily or weekly to visit Jesus, who is present to us here in the Blessed Sacrament. Spend 10 minutes in silence with him with no agenda. See how he might want to surprise you!



As we focus more intentionally on Jesus and make more room for him in our lives, may we become more aware of his love for us and experience the joy of being with him.






