

Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever been in a hospital waiting room or doctor's office, waiting for news from the doctor and hoping for a miracle, while praying like crazy and making promises to God? Heal my loved one, get them thru this surgery and I promise I'll do this or that. Then the doctor comes out and you know right away by the look on his face that it's bad news. At that point, you feel as though God has let you down.

That's probably the same way Martha felt in today's gospel. She's mad at Jesus. "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." It sounds polite, but in reality, she was very upset. He had healed so many people, the majority of them he didn't even know. Now when his best friend needs him, he's nowhere to be found.

Could Jesus have kept Lazarus from dying? Absolutely! However, he explains his delayed arrival by saying "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

In other words, what Jesus is about to do is meant for Martha and Mary and those who mourn with them; for John's community of believers; for the generations of Christians inspired by this story; and for each of us reflecting on this Gospel today.

Jesus says to Martha, "Your brother will rise again." She answered, "I know he will rise again, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. **Do you believe this?**" Martha's response, especially in her grief, is one of the strongest professions of faith in the New Testament.

Then to confirm Martha's faith, Jesus does the unexpected. He orders that the stone be rolled away from the tomb. Then He calls out loudly to Lazarus, "Come out." To the astonishment of everyone there, Lazarus appears out of the darkness of the tomb. This was arguably the greatest miracle ever performed by Jesus. In raising Lazarus, Jesus shows that he is indeed the resurrection and the life!

Do you believe this? That question was not only asked of Martha. It's asked of all of us who have stood at gravesides, who have mourned loved ones, and who struggle with grief and hope. The question is the epicenter of our faith.





THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

MARCH 25

Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and considered in her mind what sort of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus.

He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end."

And Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no husband?" And the angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, your kinswoman Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For with God nothing will be impossible." And Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." And the angel departed from her."

Angels by their nature are above humans, yet the angel Gabriel shows great respect to Mary: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!" Jesus did not have to take on our nature to save us, neither did he have to cooperate with a humble Jewish woman in Nazareth. He chose both. Without Mary's approval to bear Jesus in her womb, there is no telling what the state of our salvation would be. God willed to entrust His plan of salvation into the hands of a woman. This is also our role when we are open to God's will. With the Annunciation, we see the great things that God can bring when we cooperate with Him.

In the Annunciation, God also gave Mary her vocation as the mother of God. This is a huge responsibility and can lead to temptation to be afraid or want to not embrace God's calling. We need to see Mary as an example of how to embrace God's mission in our lives, particularly in our vocation. The Annunciation is something we need to constantly ponder. Good ways to meditate on this moment are to regularly pray the Angelus prayer or the joyful mysteries of the rosary. Whenever you need courage in saying "yes" to God, look to Mary as your best example.

The Woman at the Well

In the story of the woman at the well, as told in John 4, one thing is very clear. The Samaritan woman is changed by her encounter with Jesus. As I close this series on her story, I'd like to conclude by exploring a couple ways this is true.

Worship. First, we see how her understanding of worship has been transformed. Jesus has revealed to her the nature of true worship with these words: "Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshippers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kinds of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." True worship will no longer be bound to a particular place, like the temple in Jerusalem (a place where the Samaritan woman would have been unwelcome), but it will be possible for everyone in every place. Not only this, but she also comes to know the one who will make this possible – Jesus, the Messiah, the Savior of the world!

Witness. Second, the Samaritan woman finds a new boldness and courage. Her past failures would have made her an outcast in her community. Her encounter with Jesus inspires her to return immediately to share with this very community about the One who "told me everything I ever did." She is unafraid to give witness to the good news that the Messiah has come. In bearing witness, we see clearly that Jesus has changed her life. His priority – to do the will of the Father and reap a harvest of souls (see verses 24-38) – has become hers. Jesus tells the disciples that his "food is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." The Samaritan woman, who was once so very thirsty for love, has experienced that love in Jesus and wants others to as well. Jesus' thirst for souls to know the love of his Father has become her own.

In these final days of Lent, when we have been seeking to examine our lives and change for the better, the Samaritan woman provides a good examination for our hearts. Are we as deeply concerned about worship as she is? Are we longing to worship the Lord in the same way and grateful that we have encountered the One who makes true worship possible? Have our lives been changed by Jesus to such an extent that we feel compelled to tell others about him? Do we share Jesus' thirst for souls and want to see others come to know his love? Are we willing to talk about our experiences of him when the opportunity arises? If we find ourselves feeling lukewarm about all this, that is a sign that Jesus wants to encounter us more deeply. The transformation of the Samaritan woman is one we can experience by knowing his deep and abiding personal love for us.

Lord Jesus, please reveal your love for us!






Sister Parish Update




