Dear Parishioners,

He is risen! He is risen indeed! While the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday may be behind us we are invited to continue to celebrate this joyful Easter season. Recently at a daily Mass, Fr. Ben reminded us that while Jesus had risen from the tomb on Easter what followed was a time of encounter for the early disciples with the risen Christ. We too are invited to encounter our risen Lord. Some of our most powerful encounters with Jesus are that of his loving mercy.

I share with you an encounter I had with Jesus, undeservedly receiving his merciful love. After years of not praying, of not attending Mass, of not listening to God, I responded to his quiet voice, the stirrings of the Holy Spirit. As I turned to Jesus, as I cracked the door open ever so slightly, what I experienced was not condemnation, not accusation and fear, but mercy and unconditional love. Saying “yes” to Jesus’ calling changed my life.

The disciples, locked in a room for fear of the Jews, had also abandoned Jesus. They deserted him on the night of his betrayal by Judas. Only one knelt before Jesus as he suffered upon the cross. Yet the disciples' first encounter with him after his resurrection becomes one of joy. Jesus appears before them not in condemnation and anger, but in merciful love as he says “Peace be with you.” In perhaps an even greater expression of merciful love, Jesus later comes to Thomas who openly expressed his doubts and even placed conditions on his faith. Jesus meets Thomas where he is, as he so often does with us, inviting him into a deeper relationship.

Let us also respond to Jesus' invitation to encounter him. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we have a wonderful opportunity to place our broken sinfulness before him, to be healed in the outpouring of his mercy. At each Mass we can offer our woundedness to be joined in and through Jesus to the Father. As we voice together “Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed” we recognize our need for his mercy and accept the gift of his great love.

This week let us go forward joyfully as Easter people encountering the risen Jesus. May we accept the undeserved gift of his mercy and love. May we be expressions of his great love to all those we meet. He is risen! He is risen indeed!

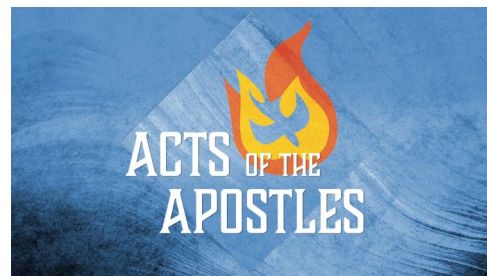

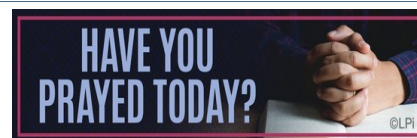

## Heavenly Hero for April: St. Bernadette of Lourdes

**Born:** January 7, 1844 in Lourdes, France.

**Died:** April 16, 1879

**Feast Day:** April 16

**Patronage:** Shepherds, the sick, and those persecuted for their faith Saint Bernadette Soubirous was born into a very poor family and she suffered from severe asthma. Despite her poor health, Bernadette helped her mother around the house and took care of her siblings.



In 1858, when she was preparing to receive her First Communion, Bernadette, her sister, and her friend went to collect firewood. The other two girls crossed the stream to a grotto. Bernadette, however, stayed on the other side because she did not want to make her asthma worse by walking through the cold water. The girls insisted she join them, and Bernadette began taking off her shoes when she heard a rustling sound. Bernadette looked around and then in the grotto, she saw a beautiful lady.

The lady she saw looked like a girl of sixteen or seventeen. She was dressed in a white robe with a blue ribbon around her waist, and was wearing a white veil. She held a rosary of white beads with a chain of gold.

After the lady left, Bernadette asked her sister and friend if they had seen anything. They said no but later Bernadette's sister told their mother about her vision. Her mother commanded Bernadette to stop day-dreaming and ordered them not to go to the grotto again.

Bernadette's mother eventually allowed Bernadette to return to the grotto and Our Lady appeared to her 17 more times. She promised Bernadette happiness not in this world, but in the next. She also asked Bernadette to drink from a spring in the grotto. During the sixteenth apparition, on March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation, Our Lady told Bernadette that she was the Immaculate Conception.

Bernadette was ridiculed by the authorities and the clergy, but she remained determined, loving, and courageous despite her constant hardships. Many of the townspeople believed that Mary was appearing to Bernadette, and they came down in large numbers to the grotto to pray. The spring that the Lady asked Bernadette to drink from quickly revealed itself to be blessed water with miraculous healing properties.

In 1866, when she was 22 years old, Bernadette entered the Sisters of Charity of Nevers and spent the rest of her life praying for sinners, serving as a sacristan, and helping out in the infirmary. On April 16, 1879, Bernadette died. She was only 35 years old. She was canonized a saint on December 8, 1933.

### Talking Point with Children:

Saint Bernadette is remembered for her perseverance in bearing wrongs patiently. She trusted in God even when other people made fun of her, and did not believe she saw Our Lady. She teaches us to lean on God when we face challenges.

**Action Step for Children:** To honor St. Bernadette, have a family movie night and watch a movie about her life and her vision of Our Lady of Lourdes. Three options are: *Bernadette: The Princess of Lourdes*, *St. Bernadette of Lourdes* or the classic film *The Song of Bernadette*. (All available on FORMED.)

## Divine Mercy Sunday: The Greatest Gift

### Humble Beginnings

Divine Mercy Sunday originated when our Lord appeared to Saint Faustina, a humble, Polish sister. During these visions, Jesus asked specifically that the Feast of Divine Mercy be established so that all people would turn to the Lord and find refuge in him and in his unfathomable mercy.

Jesus told Sister Faustina: *This Feast emerged from the very depths of my mercy, and it is a sign for the vast depths of my tender mercies. Every Soul believing and trusting in my mercy will obtain it.*

He also told her: *“Let All mankind recognize my unfathomable mercy. It is for the end of times; after it will come the day of justice.”*

Jesus told Sister Faustina of his great desire to have a Feast of Mercy established on the first Sunday after Easter. He also instructed that the Feast be preceded by a Divine Mercy Novena that begins on Good Friday and ends the day before Divine Mercy Sunday.

### The Image of Mercy



During one of the visions, Jesus asked Sister Faustina to paint the image of Divine Mercy pouring forth from his heart:

*“Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the signature: Jesus, I Trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish.*

In the Divine Mercy image, Jesus is portrayed with one hand outstretched blessing the world, while his other hand rests on the side wounded by the soldier’s spear. From the wound in his side stream blood and water. Below most images of the Divine Mercy are the words, “Jesus I Trust in You.”

*“Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush is the greatness of his image, but in My grace.*

### Spreading the Devotion

Devotion to the Divine Mercy was spread and promoted by Pope John Paul II. On April 30, 2000, Sister Faustina Kowalska was canonized and given the title “Secretary of Mercy” and the Sunday after Easter was officially designated as Divine Mercy Sunday.

Pope John Paul II died on the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday and he was beautified and canonized on Divine Mercy Sunday. He was truly a Pope of Mercy and he used to say: *“Apart from the mercy of God there is no other source of hope for mankind”*



There are three main components to the devotion of Divine Mercy: asking for and obtaining the mercy of God, trusting in Christ’s mercy to others. Divine Mercy Sunday is not just about God’s mercy towards us, but about the mercy we show towards others as well. We are all in need of God’s love and mercy but then we are called to give the love and mercy we receive to others.

## Blessed Divine Mercy Sunday!

This weekend, we remember the gift of God's measureless mercy. On Sunday afternoon until about 3 pm, the priests of Oshkosh will be hearing confessions at St. Mary's on Merritt Avenue. If you haven't been to confession in a while, this is a great opportunity to return.

While we won't offer our usual Second Sunday Holy Hour today, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will also be part of this citywide celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday. All mysteries of the Rosary will be prayed throughout the afternoon, with a sung-version of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3 pm.

We celebrate God's mercy for many reasons, but one is that it changes us. I am reminded of a story I heard from an old Franciscan priest when I was on retreat last December:

A man in a village had stolen some sheep, a very serious crime in those days. As part of his punishment, he was branded on the forehead with ST for sheep thief. He did not want this to be the only thing he was remembered for, so he devoted himself to doing good for God and others. Many years later, the children of the village asked their parents what the ST on his forehead stood for. In reverent tones, they said, "It stands for saint."

Our greatest sins do not define us. God's love and mercy do. But we must respond. The first step is to confess our sins. The next is to live, by God's grace, in such a way that we are one day known as saints. Jesus, we trust in you to forgive us! Jesus, we trust in you to make us saints!

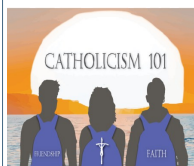

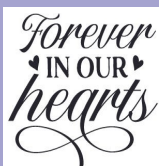

## Summer Catholicism 101: Encountering Jesus in the Gospel of John

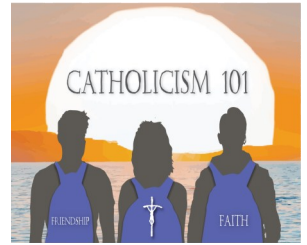
