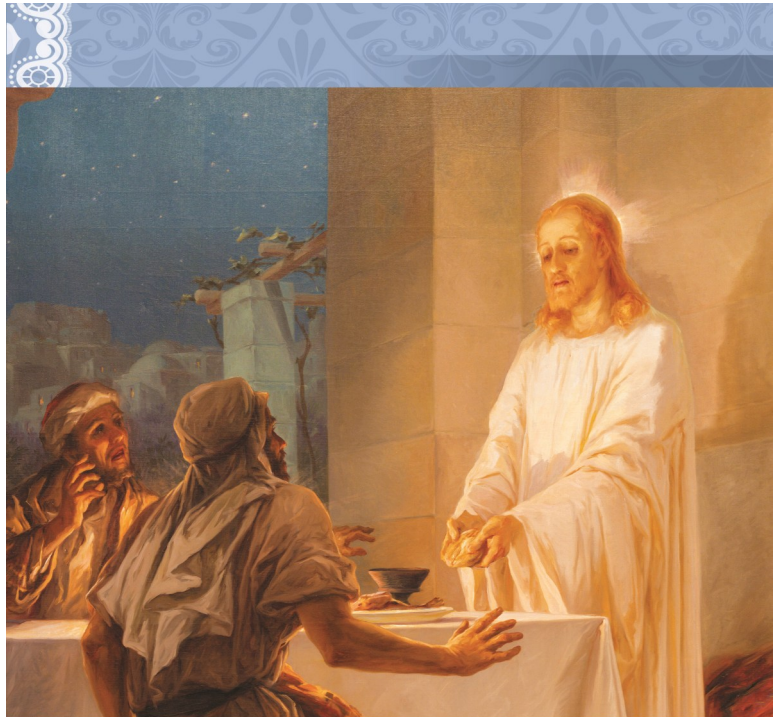

Dear Parishioners,

A lot of change is ahead for the leadership of our area parishes and school.

We continue to search for a new President of Lourdes Academy as **Dr. John Dinegan** will be retiring the end of June. **Karen Boehm** will also be stepping back from her role as Director of Advancement.

Fr. Jerry Pastors is being transferred from **Most Blessed Sacrament Parish** to Stella Maris Parish in northern Door County. **Fr. Ryan Starks** will become the Pastor of MBS on July 1. Fr. Ryan is currently the Pastor of St. Therese Parish in Appleton, which is one of our hubs for Hispanic ministry.

Fr. Louis Golamari will begin moving to Two Rivers to lead St. Peter the Fisherman Parish there. **Deacon Brad Gallenberg** will become the Pastoral Leader of **St. Jude the Apostle Parish** when Fr. Louis moves. Deacon Brad has served as Business Manager of St. Jude for about ten years.

Deacon Paul Vidmar will be concluding his service as Pastoral Coordinator at **St. Mary Parishes in Omro and Winneconne**. Bishop will be appointing an **international priest** to serve those parishes. This will be the first time in 19 years that they will be led by a priest.

Fr. Ben Pribbenow, as we already know, has been appointed to serve as **Vocations Director** for the Diocese of Green Bay. He will work closely with Bishop Ricken and Fr. Kevin Ripley in this role.

Bishop intends to appoint a **newly ordained priest** to serve as Parochial Vicar at our parish as well as Chaplain of Lourdes Academy High School. The appointment is not made until his ordination on May 30.

The newly ordained priest and I, with assistance from Fr. Zach Weber from the UWO Newman Center, will serve as Priest Celebrants of St. Jude Parish in a way like we have been serving in Omro and Winneconne. I will become the Priest Moderator of St. Jude, which is a behind the scenes role to support Deacon Brad there. I will also be the Temporary Administrator of Omro and Winneconne parishes in July and August until their new priest arrives.

So ... lots to pray for. Please keep our areas parishes and their leaders, both those ending their roles and those beginning, in your prayers. Most of these changes will happen on July 1.

In the end, we desire to be led by the Holy Spirit. Hopefully those of us who serve as leaders do not get in the way of the Holy Spirit. Changes in leadership are reminders of that reality. Through our obedience to the Bishop, we seek to be led by the Holy Spirit.

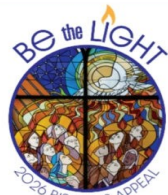

We are looking for Leaders (18 and older) and Assistants (14 and older) for CLOW.

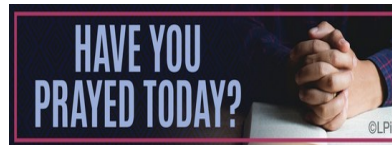
CLOW happens during the 10am Mass and is for children in 4K-2nd grade. Lessons and supplies are all prepared for you.

Do we think of the Holy Spirit as a person with whom we can have a relationship? What does that look like in our daily lives? How might the Holy Spirit be inviting us to deepen that relationship? Let's all pay attention to that together this Easter season and anticipate with joy the coming of the Holy Spirit into our lives each day and especially as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost this year!

Summer Catholicism 101: Encountering Jesus in the Gospel of John

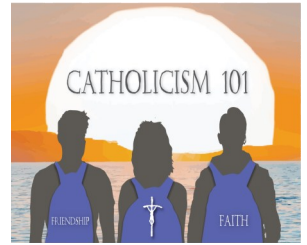

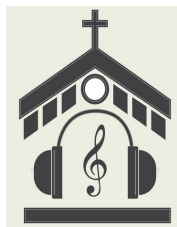

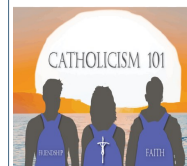

Infant Baptism

Infants accept the faith through the faith of their parents. Our parish offers group sessions to prepare parents for the baptism ceremony and for leading their children in a life of faith. Sessions are held twice per month, all year round. It may be easier to participate in a session before the child is born. Please call or email to register for the Baptism Preparation session and to schedule your child's baptism.

One **Catholic godparent** is needed, who must be a **Confirmed, practicing Catholic** at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, there should be **one male and one female**. There should not be more than two godparents. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness in addition to the Catholic godparent.

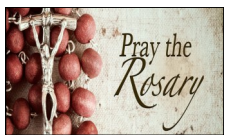
