Dear Parishioners,

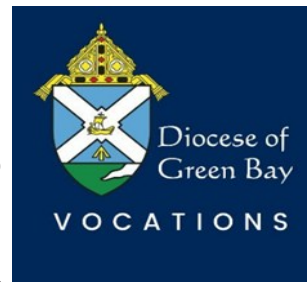

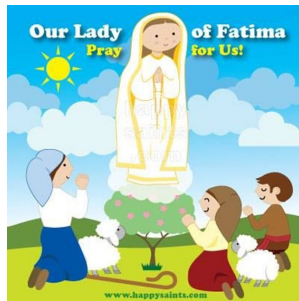

May is the month dedicated to Mary. This month to celebrate Mary, we will focus on a different apparition, the key details for kids, and the ways in which families can live Mary's message. This weekend we will focus on Our Lady of Fatima.

Marian Apparition: Our Lady of Fatima

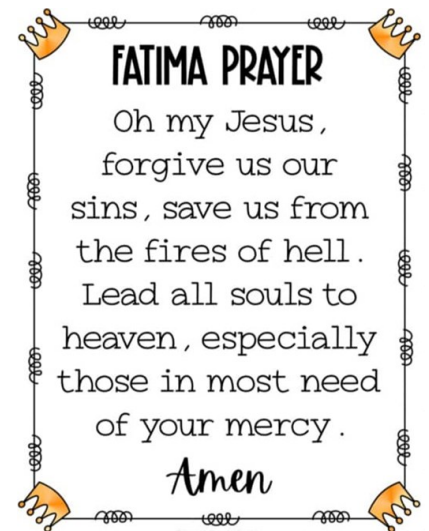
About the Apparition: In 1917, Mary appeared to three shepherd children: Lucia (9) and her cousins Francisco (8) and Jacinta (6) in Fatima, Portugal. Over six months, she asked them to pray the Rosary daily for world peace. On October 13, 1917, a "Miracle of the Sun" occurred, where the sun danced and zigzagged, witnessed by thousands to confirm their story.

Key Details for Kids:

- **The Message:** Mary asked the children to pray for peace, pray for sinners, and offer sacrifices to God.
- **The Rosary:** She identified herself as the "Lady of the Rosary" and asked that it be prayed every day.
- **The Miracle of the Sun:** On a rainy day, the sun appeared to spin and change colors, drying the ground instantly.
- **The Vision:** Mary showed the children a vision of heaven and also a vision of a "sea of fire" (hell), urging them to pray to save souls.

3 Ways to Live the Message:

- **Pray the Rosary:** Pray for peace in families and the world.
- **Offer Sacrifices:** Do small good deeds and offer up daily struggles for those who do not know God.
- **Fatima Prayer** Say the Fatima Prayer each day this week.

What Human Emotions Did Mother Mary Feel?

Mother Mary, the mother of Jesus, is one of the most revered women in Christianity. She is often depicted as a symbol of purity, grace, and devotion. However, Mary was also human and experienced many emotions throughout her life, just like us.

One of the most significant moments of Mary's life was when she learned that she would be the mother of Jesus. According to Luke Chapter 1, the angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and told her that she had been chosen to bear the son of God. Mary's initial reaction was one of fear and confusion. She was a young woman who had never been with a man, the idea of becoming pregnant with the son of God was overwhelming.

As Mary's pregnancy progressed, she likely experienced a mix of emotions. She may have felt joy and excitement at the prospect of becoming a mother but also anxiety and uncertainty about what the future would hold.

Mary gave birth in a stable surrounded by animals, Mary likely felt an overwhelming sense of love and protectiveness for her newborn son. She may have felt a sense of vulnerability. Yet she found the strength to give birth to her son and care for him under difficult circumstances.

In all of these moments, Mother Mary experienced the full range of human emotions. Yet, through it all, she remained faithful and devoted to God, and her unwavering faith and strength continue to inspire people today.

Mary's story reminds us that even in the midst of difficult circumstances, we can find hope and strength in our faith. We can look to her example of unwavering devotion and trust in God as a source of inspiration and comfort in our lives.

This year our parish was blessed to prepare **53 children** to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist. A big shout out to Lois Reischl and Ann MacPhetridge (catechists) and Kathy Baehman (Family Outreach Coordinator) for all they did to help prepare our youth to encounter Jesus through the sacraments this year!

How do I know it's the Holy Spirit speaking to me? Part 1

I hear this question a lot – and it's a good one! To be in relationship with someone requires communication. Most of the time in our human relationships, we are able to “use our words” (as we sometimes say to the little ones in our lives) to share what we think or how we feel. When verbal communication isn't possible, we can rely on visual cues and non-verbal communication. But all this necessitates having a body. It is hard for us to imagine what communication looks like with someone who doesn't have a body, like the Holy Spirit!

It's probably not an exaggeration to say that millions of pages have been written on this topic. The mystery of how the Holy Spirit communicates to us is one that we will explore for a lifetime, getting to know the Spirit better over time as we pay close attention. What I share here today is just a taste.

Sometimes as we are praying or even out of the blue, a message might come to us. It could come in different forms – a word or phrase, an understanding of Scripture that is new to us, an image, a feeling, a nudge, a gut feeling. Someone once taught me that these inspirations, if they are from the Holy Spirit, are most often characterized by three things. They are:

- (1) **Brief:** For most of us, the Holy Spirit doesn't give us a dissertation, but a brief message. A little goes a long way and is often more memorable than something elaborate.
- (2) **Deep:** While the message is usually brief and simple, it is also deep and rich in meaning, something we can come back to again and again, receiving a little more understanding each time.
- (3) **In accordance with Scripture and the teachings of the Catholic Church.** The Holy Spirit will not say something that fails to accord with Divine Revelation. It is good to talk with others about what we hear, checking what we think we are hearing against the wisdom of the Church. Talking with someone we trust, a person who is faithful to Jesus and his Church, is very helpful here.

To this list of three markers of the Holy Spirit's voice, I have a couple more things to add. Stay tuned for next week's column!

Come, Holy Spirit! An Invitation to Pray

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he told his disciples to return to Jerusalem and to pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit. Nine days later, that gift was given on the Feast of Pentecost, which we celebrate this year on **Sunday, May 24.**

Since that time, Christians have remembered these nine days of prayer through the practice of praying novenas (from the Latin *novem*, which means nine).

In this season of special focus on the Holy Spirit in the Diocese of Green Bay, **we invite you to join us in praying a novena to the Holy Spirit this year, starting Friday, May 15,** and ending the day before we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

There are two popular versions of this Novena to the Holy Spirit. One asks for an increase of the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, fortitude, counsel, etc.). Another asks for an increase of the fruits of the Spirit (love, joy, patience, etc.). A quick Google search should bring up either option pretty quickly. Or the website praymorenovenas.com will send a daily reminder to your inbox for this novena (and many others).

Summer Catholicism 101: Encountering Jesus in the Gospel of John

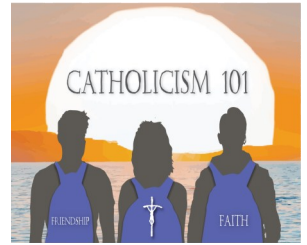

Novena for Deacon Nathan Budde

Join us in praying a novena for Deacon Nathan Budde, in preparation for his ordination to the priesthood on Saturday, May 30, at Saint Francis Xavier Cathedral in Green Bay.

Beginning on Friday, May 22- (*the feast of Saint Rita who is the kindred Saint of the Impossible along with our very own St Jude!*) and concluding on Saturday, May 30, let us pray one Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be each day for the following intentions (*based on the promises priests make upon their ordination*), and ending with the prayer below.

We pray for our ordinand, Deacon Nathan, that he may have the grace:

Day 1: To discharge without fail the office of priesthood as they care for the Lord's flock.

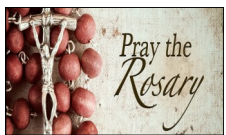
