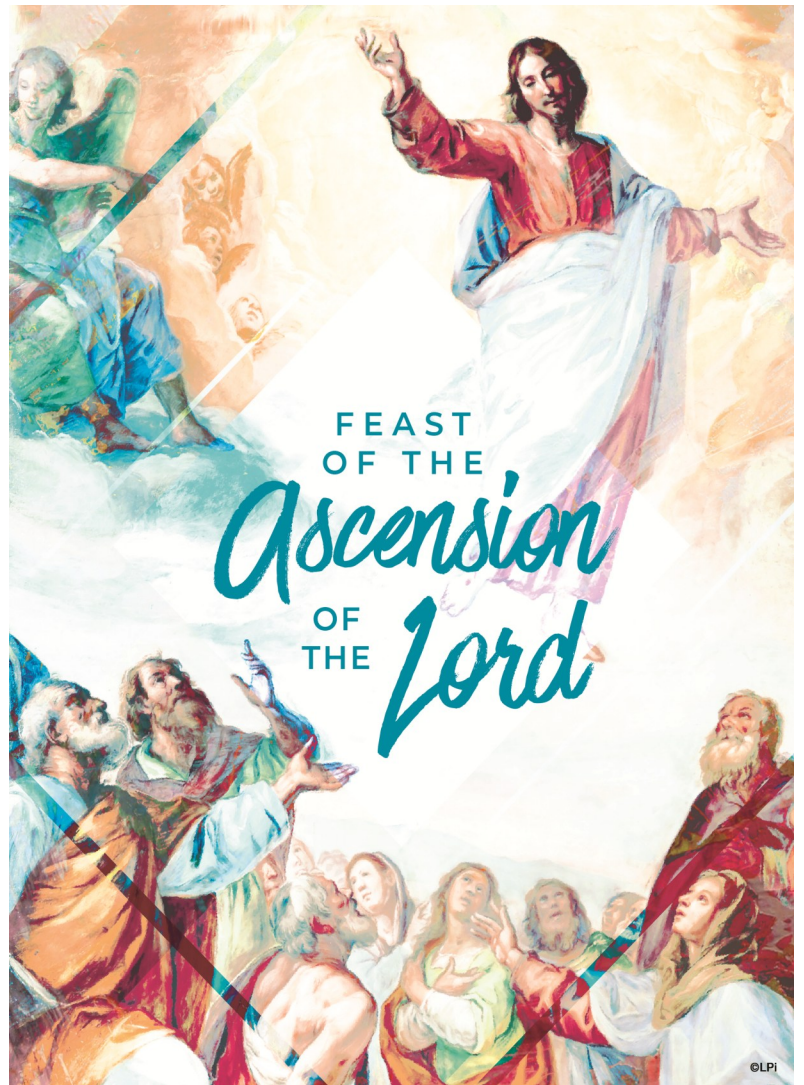

Dear Parishioners,

In sharing the testimony of my faith, I am quick to speak about the role of my siblings. My brother and sister, while attending UW Madison, had deep encounters with the Lord that transformed their lives. It noticeably impacted their outlook on life, giving them a new perspective and purpose. Their growth in faith showed me the road I wanted to take. I thought, “I want that,” and “Living the faith seems like something I can achieve.”

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Forty days after His Resurrection, Jesus was taken body and soul into heaven. His apostles were left with his promise, “I will not leave you Orphans.” We too await a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit, “another Advocate,” on Pentecost next Sunday.

That said, today we can rejoice in what Christ’s bodily Ascension indicates: “The irreversible entry of [Jesus’s] humanity into divine glory” (CCC659). Where his humanity has entered, our human nature is destined to follow.

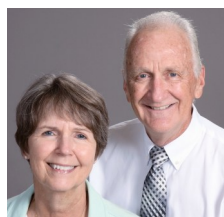
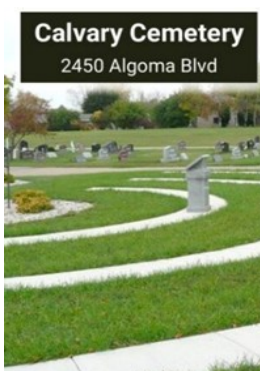
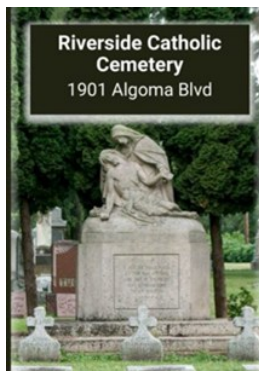
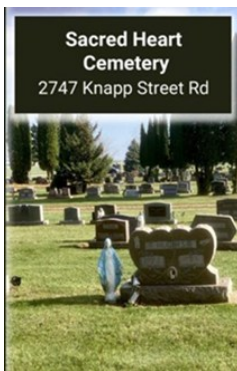

TRUSTEE ELECTION

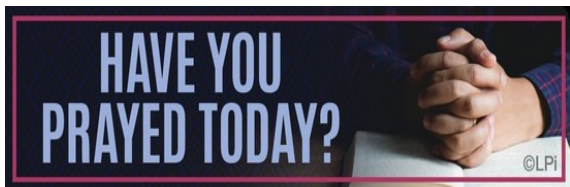

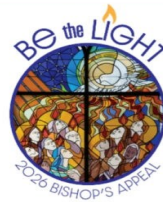

May is the month dedicated to Mary. This month to celebrate Mary, we will focus on a different apparition, the key details for kids, and the ways in which families can live Mary's message. This weekend we will focus on Our Lady of Knock

Marian Apparition: Our Lady of Knock

About the Apparition: : On August 21, 1879, in Knock, Ireland, a bright light appeared on the side of a church. 15 people saw Mary wearing a crown, an elderly St. Joseph, and St. John, holding a book. Behind them was an altar with a lamb (representing Jesus) and a cross. Angels surrounded it. Known as the "silent apparition," Mary didn't speak, but her presence brought comfort during hard times.

Key Details for Kids:

- **Silence:** Mary didn't speak. She showed that we don't always need words to talk to God—we can pray in our hearts, especially at Mass, just as she was doing.
- **The Rain:** Even though it was pouring rain, the ground where the saints appeared stayed completely dry.
- **Message:** Although silent, she reminds us that in hard times, we should look to Jesus in the Eucharist, who is our comfort and hope.

3 Ways to Live the Message:

- **Reflect:** Talk about how we can spend time with God in silence, just like Mary.
- **Create a "Silent Vision":** Use watercolor paints to create images of the apparition, focusing on the golden light described in the story.
- **Eucharistic Adoration:** Spend time as a family praying before the Blessed Sacrament as a family. Talk to children about what it means to say that Jesus is the lamb of God who takes away our sins.

The Ascension: Jesus is with us Forever



The Feast of the Ascension is celebrated on Sunday, May 17. Forty days after Easter, we commemorate the day Jesus ascended or went up to Heaven. On the Ascension, Jesus and his disciples gathered together for the last time. While they were together, Jesus was taken up to Heaven and disappeared into the clouds.

Forever With Us

We say in the Apostles Creed:

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come to judge the living and the dead.

When Jesus ascended into Heaven, two angels appeared to the apostles and told them that Jesus will come back the same way He went up. At the end of time, Jesus will return again! But in the meantime, are we alone? Of course not! He is closer to us than ever.

He himself promised:

Behold I will be with you always, to the end of age.

In the Acts of the Apostles, it says, in Jesus’ own words, that he went to prepare a place for us:

And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be.

Jesus did not leave us alone because He sent the Holy Spirit. At the right hand of the Father, Jesus intercedes for us and is with us as He promised. When he ascended, He left the authority of the Church in Peter’s hands, this authority has been handed to Popes throughout history.

How do I know it's the Holy Spirit speaking to me? Part 2

Last week, we considered three markers of hearing from the Holy Spirit. Is what we are “hearing” (whether that’s a word, phrase, image, feeling, nudge, etc.) . . .

- **Brief?**
- **Deep?**

In line with Scripture and what the Catholic Church teaches?

To this list, I would like to add two more criteria. When the Holy Spirit speaks to me, I have also found that the message is:

- **Free of accusation.** It is the enemy of our souls who accuses us and others. The Holy Spirit may help us to see the truth and convict us, and even do that in a way that is direct and gets our attention, but the Spirit does not condemn or accuse us. The Spirit speaks the truth out of love for us to set us free.
- **Surprising, but also perfectly fitting.** When the Spirit speaks, I often feel an element of surprise. What I “hear” is not something I could come up with on my own. Yet, while I often find the message surprising, at the same time it feels perfectly fitting — like exactly the response I needed.

An example I often think of comes from the life of St. Francis of Assisi. In prayer, he heard the words, “Rebuild my Church.” If we consider our criteria for hearing from the Holy Spirit, we can see this message was brief, but also deep in meaning. Francis first took the message literally and began rebuilding the physical church in which he had been praying. In time, he came to see the greater depth of God’s message – that he was being called to rebuild the people of God through his mission and ministry.

This message to Francis was also in line with the Scriptures, which call us to “encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing” (1 Thessalonians 5:11). While the church at that time was in a difficult state, the call was free of accusation and full of hope that Francis, by God’s grace, could make a difference. And, finally, while Francis may have been surprised when he discovered the deeper meaning of the message, which went so far beyond his original interpretation, yet at the same time it was a call that fit him perfectly, one to which he devoted the rest of his life.

Come, Holy Spirit! Help us to listen well. Give us the gift of discernment to know when you are speaking and to understand your message.

Come, Holy Spirit! An Invitation to Pray

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he told his disciples to return to Jerusalem and to pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit. Nine days later, that gift was given on the Feast of Pentecost, which we celebrate this year on **Sunday, May 24.**

Since that time, Christians have remembered these nine days of prayer through the practice of praying novenas (from the Latin *novem*, which means nine).

In this season of special focus on the Holy Spirit in the Diocese of Green Bay, **we invite you to join us in praying a novena to the Holy Spirit this year, starting Friday, May 15,** and ending the day before we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

There are two popular versions of this Novena to the Holy Spirit. One asks for an increase of the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, fortitude, counsel, etc.). Another asks for an increase of the fruits of the Spirit (love, joy, patience, etc.). A quick Google search should bring up either option pretty quickly. Or the website praymorenovenas.com will send a daily reminder to your inbox for this novena (and many others).

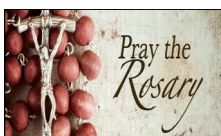
