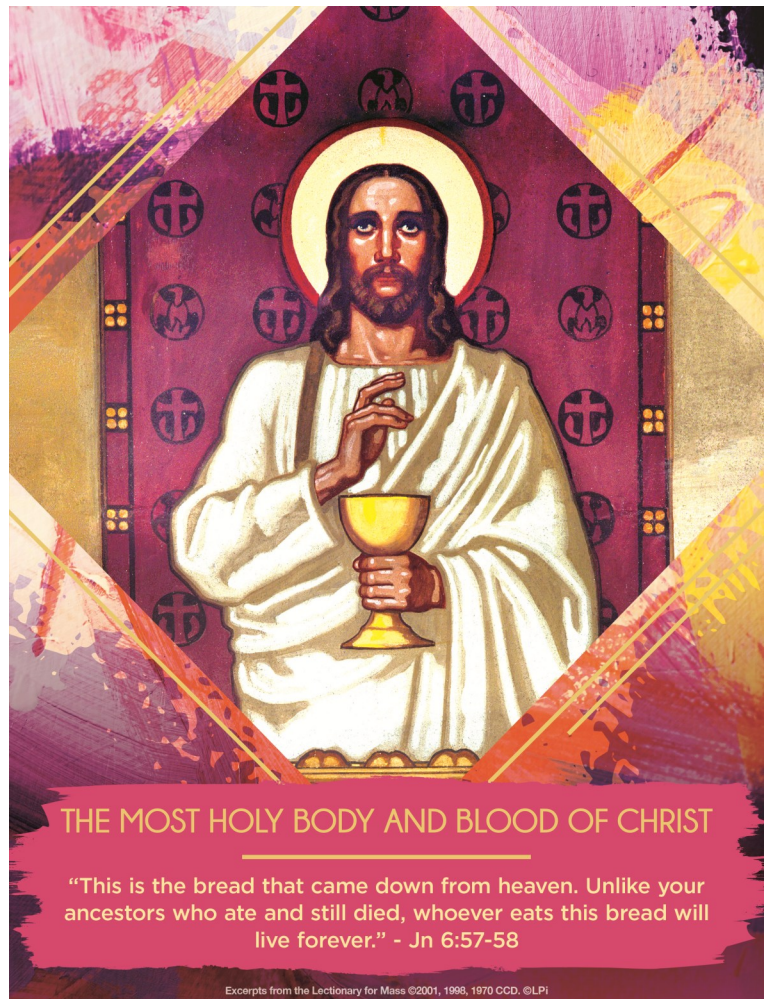

Dear Parishioners

Sometimes to get the real sense of the Gospel, you have to dive into the language it was written in: Greek! Let's examine two Greek words from the Corpus Christi Gospel that help to solidify the Church's teaching of and our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

John 6:51 reads: "...whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Jesus uses the Greek word phago or phagein which we translate into "eats." It indicates that we have to take and eat what Jesus feeds us, namely his teaching and way of life. We are to follow him. Yet, he indicates that the bread we are to eat is his flesh, beyond simply listening to him. The Jews clearly take Jesus's words literally: his words cause the Jews to "quarrel" (Jn. 6:52)! Just wait, it gets better.

John 6:54 reads: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life..." Jesus changes the word he uses for "eats" throughout the next several verses. Instead of phago or phagein Jesus uses trogo or trogon. This word, trogo or trogon, translates literally as "to gnaw" or "to chew." Thus, Jesus is doubling down and even more concretely illustrating our need to literally **eat** HIM. We know that we do so in the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is truly Jesus: body, blood, soul, and divinity offered to us at each Mass and in every tabernacle in the world. Let us rejoice today in his presence among us that we may "experience in ourselves the fruits of His redemption."

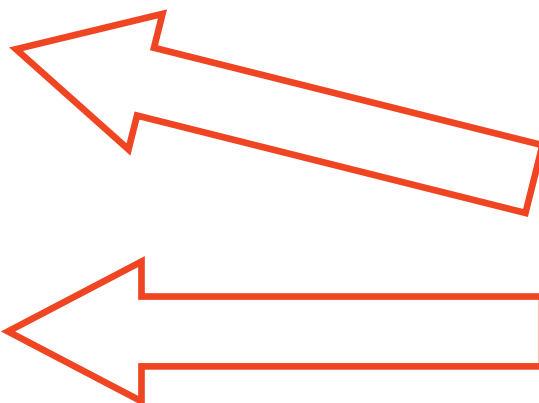

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



**Heavenly Hero for the month of June: Saint Josemaría Escrivá**  
**Born:** January 9, 1902 in Spain  
**Died:** 1975  
**Feast Day:** June 26  
**Patronage:** Opus Dei and people with diabetes

Born in Barbastro, Spain, on January 9, 1902, Josemaría grew up in a happy and faithful Catholic family. When he was a boy three of his little sisters passed away, and his father lost his job. Instead of complaining, his parents trusted God, which taught young Josemaría how to be brave and kind during hard times. When he was a teenager, he saw footprints in the snow left by a monk walking barefoot to visit the sick. This made him think, "If a monk can do that much for God, what can I do?" He decided to become a priest to serve God and others. The "Work of God"

On October 2, 1928, while on a prayer retreat, God gave him a special mission. Josemaría saw that regular people—like moms, dads, doctors, teachers, and children—are all called to be holy. He started an organization called Opus Dei (which means "Work of God" in Latin) to help people pray and offer their everyday work to God.

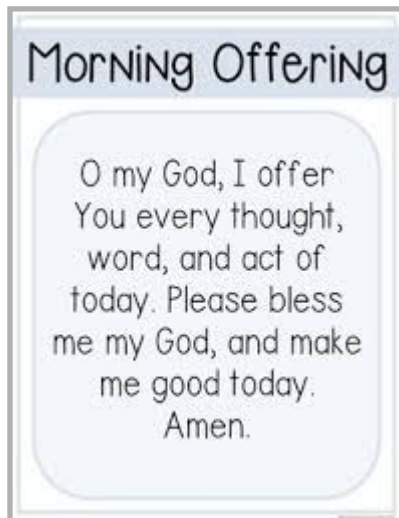
St. Josemaría spent his whole life traveling and reminding people that they are deeply loved children of God. He passed away in Rome in 1975. Years later, in 2002, Pope John Paul II declared him a saint so that Catholics all over the world could remember his wonderful message

### Talking Point with Children:

Saint Josemaría Escrivá is known as the "saint of ordinary life" because he taught that you don't have to be a monk or nun to be a saint. By doing your daily chores, homework, and being kind to others with love for God, you can become holy right where you are

**Action Step for Children:** To honor Saint Josemaría Escrivá start each day this week with a simple morning offering, dedicating your work and play to God.

St. Josemaría often emphasized doing "ordinary things extraordinarily well" as a way to grow in holiness.

## Easy Ways to Grow Your Faith Over the Summer



Keeping your faith growing over the summer can be as easy if you have some ideas and daily practices already put in place for your family. Summer is typically a time filled with rest, relaxation, and new adventures but it can also be a time to nurture and grow deeper in your faith, especially as a family. Embrace the summer months as a season of grace and thanksgiving. Here are a few ideas for you to grow in your faith this summer.

### Take a Family Rosary Walk

Take the whole family outside and pray the Rosary. Walk around your neighborhood, a local park, or even the beach. Have each child, teen or parent (or grandparent) say a Hail Mary or decade of the Rosary along the walk. This is a great way to get some exercise and pray along the way.

### Start a "Saint of the Week" Tradition

Each week, choose a specific saint and learn about them. There are different ways to teach your family about the saints through reading stories, visiting a spiritual site, or watching an educational program detailing their life stories.

### Create a Gratitude Job

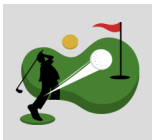

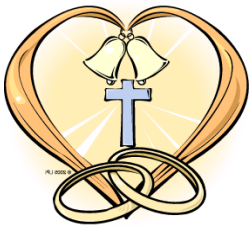

## Marriage Information

### Getting Married?

Congratulations! We would like to help prepare you for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Please call the parish office at least six months prior to your desired wedding date to begin preparation. Marriage preparation prepares you and your future spouse to live a sacramental marriage that is free, faithful, permanent, and fruitful. The grace of God gives strength to live out the sacrament.

### Already married but not married in the Church?

You may call to meet with one of our priests to discuss the possibility of entering into the Sacrament of Matrimony in addition to your civil marriage. This would be a new step in your relationship, asking the grace of God to be at work, and binding you and your spouse to vows before God.

### Previously married?

If you have been married and divorced, you may want to discuss the possibility of an annulment. An annulment process looks at whether the prior marriage had conditions missing for it to be a sacramental marriage. The annulment process is concerned mainly with the personal and spiritual aspects of marriage. It does not “erase” the civil contract, and it does not render children illegitimate. It merely states that after thorough investigation, the Church has decided that a marriage, as the Church understands marriage, was not valid. Deacon John Ingala and Fr. Tom from our parish are trained to assist people in this process. Please call the parish office to set up a time to discuss this with one of them. If an annulment is granted, the person is then free to enter into a sacramental marriage.

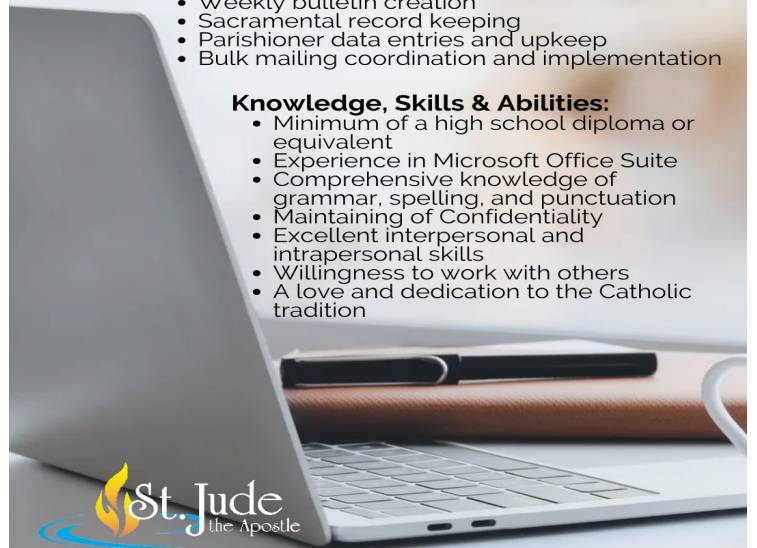

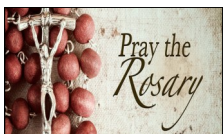
