Dear Parishioners,

Sometimes less is more. This is particularly true when the "less" is less of us filled up with our own selves and the "more" is the space we create and allow for the Spirit within us. Recently we celebrated the Solemnity of the Birth of John the Baptist. The quote best known from St. John might be "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29). *Indeed we hear these words in the prayer of Mass as gaze upon Jesus fully in the Eucharist. Less familiar may be his words "He must increase; I must decrease." (John 3:30) He also knew less is more.*

We were reminded that we too are called to become less to become more recently at daily Mass when Fr. Ben suggested to us the way to enter through the "narrow gate" (Matthew 7:14) *may be to become "little". How do we do this? It is by looking to Jesus, by allowing us to be filled by his Spirit. While Jesus is God, he was also the perfect man through surrender to the Father. Indeed "though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather he emptied himself..." (Philippians 2 2:6,7) Jesus indeed was the greatest example of becoming "little" in obedient love to the Father.*

This week, in and through Jesus, let us become "little", to become "less" so that we are "more". May we become **more** deeply in relationship with Jesus, **more** filled with the Holy Spirit, **more** expressions of God's love. Sometimes less is more.

Summer Catholicism 101: Encountering Jesus in the Gospel of John

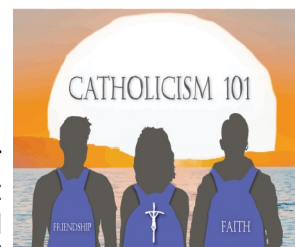
Mondays from 7-8 pm

Lesson plans and supplies are provided for you!

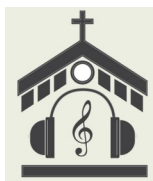
