Dear Parishioners,

Thank you for the warm welcome to St. Raphael during these first few weeks! As I shared with many of you during my first weekend of Masses here, I was at this parish five years ago while working at Fr. Carr's Place 2B for a summer during my second year of seminary. At that time, I could not have imagined that I would be back here as a priest, but it has been a joy to return here and, in many ways, I already feel very much at home!

In this first column, I would like to take the opportunity to share a little more about myself with all of you. I was born in Green Bay and was raised by my parents in De Pere with my two brothers and two sisters. I graduated from Notre Dame Academy in 2018. I spent one year studying at St. Norbert College before applying to seminary. As a seminarian, I then studied for three years to earn a BA in Philosophy at Immaculate Heart of Mary College Seminary on the campus of St. Mary University of Minnesota in Winona and then four years of theology studies at St. Francis de Sales Major Seminary in St. Francis, WI near Milwaukee.

These summer months have always been a special time with my family. As early as I can remember, we would take a week each summer on a family camping trip at one of the Wisconsin State Parks (lately this has been at Devil's Lake) and we would spend as many days as we could together with my grandparents on Lake Winnebago, just south of Calumet County Park. It was on the East Side that my grandpa first taught me how to fish for walleye and perch on the Big Lake. My love for fishing continued to grow from there, and I enjoy its many forms: ice fishing, bow fishing, topwater fishing for bass and pike, spearing; I have even dabbled fishing for muskie from time to time. In recent years, I have especially enjoyed fly fishing for trout in the many little streams and rivers of our beautiful state. The water has been a place of solitude and serenity for me, especially in these more remote and intimate bodies of water. If you are ever in need of a priest to go fishing with you---fly fishing, walleye fishing, or otherwise---just let me know!

Please know of my daily prayers for all of you in these first weeks of my ministry here. As I continue to settle into the flow of parish life here at St. Raphael, I would also like to ask for your prayers for me, especially through the intercession of Saints Padre Pio, Norbert, Faustina Kowalska, and Therese of Lisieux. All of these Saints have been powerful intercessors throughout my time in seminary and I know they will continue to be in my priesthood.

Thank you again for welcoming me into your parish family, and I look forward to continuing to get to know each of you. May the Lord bring each of us closer to himself during these beautiful (and hot) summer days!

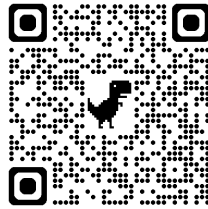
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Finding God in Ordinary Moments

It's easy to imagine that we encounter God only in church, during prayer, or on special occasions. While these are special moments of grace, God also meets us in the ordinary moments of daily life. Every moment of our day offers an opportunity to recognize His presence.

Jesus spent most of his life on earth in ordinary circumstances. Before His public ministry, He lived quietly in Nazareth, working, praying and sharing family life. He showed us that holiness is found not only in extraordinary acts but also in faithful living.

Parents caring for children, students studying for exams, people working their jobs, neighbors helping one another, and families sharing a meal all have opportunities to reflect God's love. A kind word, a patient response, a helping hand, or a moment of forgiveness can become a witness to Christ's presence in the world.

One way to grow in awareness of God's presence is to pause throughout the day and simply ask, "Lord, where are you in this moment?" You may find Him in a beautiful sunrise, the laughter of a child, the encouragement of a friend, or even in the challenges that invite us to trust Him more deeply.

At the end of each day, take a few moments to thank God for the blessings you receive and ask Him to help you recognize Him more clearly tomorrow. This simple habit can help us see that God has been walking with us all along.

Holiness is not reserved for a select few. It starts in the ordinary moments of everyday life. When we offer our daily work, our joys, our struggles, and our relationships to God, the ordinary becomes extraordinary through His grace.



I pray that you will open your hearts to the Lord each day, discovering that He is always near, waiting to be found in the simple moments that make up your lives.

Discernment & the Holy Spirit: The Examen Prayer

Last week, we started to ask the question: “How do we know it’s the Holy Spirit working in our lives?” As we continue this series on discernment and the Holy Spirit, we’ll draw upon the wisdom of St. Ignatius of Loyola, whose “rules for discernment” have helped many address that question.



Before we get to those “rules” in the weeks ahead, let’s begin with the prayer that St. Ignatius encouraged his followers to pray before any other. He had learned by experience that this prayer was essential to good discernment. It is a prayer that helps us pay attention to what is happening in our lives and especially within us, so that when we consider the Holy Spirit’s presence and work with us, we have some data upon which to draw. It’s called the Examen Prayer.

The Examen Prayer is different than the examination of conscience that anyone who has prepared for the Sacrament of Reconciliation would be familiar with. In an examination of conscience, we are looking specifically at our sins, so that we can make a good confession. In the Examen Prayer, our attention is more holistic. We are looking at the whole of our lives to notice those movements of heart that I wrote about in last week’s column – the sometimes joyful, sometimes difficult responses within us that impact our growth (or diminishment) in faith, hope, and love and also impact our choices to follow Jesus.

Here is a simple overview of how to pray the Examen Prayer, which can be done in as little as 5 minutes a day.

- 1- **Remember God’s love for you.** Always, at every moment, God is with you and loves you. Pause for a moment to receive this love. If there are no feelings, remember that his love is still true no matter what we feel.
- 2- **Give thanks to God.** What two or three things are you especially thankful for today?
- 3- **Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your review of your day.**
- 4- **In your mind’s eye, review your day.** Pay attention to moments where you had a strong response, positive or negative. What was happening there? What were you feeling? How did you respond? How did you sense God with you? Or were there times when God felt absent?
- 5- **Make a resolution for tomorrow.** Was there a time when you really felt like you were living out God’s desire for you? How can you continue to do that tomorrow? Was there a time when it seemed like you were being led by something other than God (for example, your own sinful inclinations, your selfishness, your fear or anger)? What help do you need from God to live differently tomorrow? What different choices could you make?



As we pray this way, more and more we begin to notice how our lives align with God and his will – as well as how they don’t. This self-knowledge is a valuable tool as we grow in noticing the Holy Spirit’s work in us.

Making Room for the Holy Spirit



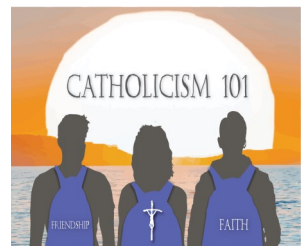
