God's Golden Chain of Salvation

"We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.

For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he might be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. And those he predestined he also called; and those he called he also justified; and those he justified he also glorified." (**Roman 8:28-30**)



Sisters and Brothers, I want us to focus on the second reading from today's Mass, **Romans 8:28-30** (see above). Bishop Robert Barron, theologian and evangelist, suggests that this short scripture verse offers profound comfort and peace amid the world's brokenness. Bishop Barron reminds us: *"God has a massive, providential plan. He went to the 'bottom of our dysfunction' to set things right, ensuring that every circumstance works toward the ultimate goal of conforming us to the image of His Son."* (**Word on Fire Sermon: July 30, 2017**) Bishop Robert goes on to outline how this works:

God's Providential Goodness: In commenting on *"God works for good with those who love him"* (8:28), Barron explains that this isn't a promise of an easy or materially prosperous life. Rather, the "good" is God's eternal plan to heal and elevate humanity, transforming our broken lives into a share of the divine life.

The "Golden Chain" of Salvation: When Paul speaks of those whom God *"predestined"* (8:29-30), the Bishop interprets this not as a deterministic destruction of free will, but as an expression of God's immense, active love. God's providential journey stretches from eternity to eternity, pulling believers toward salvation by His unbroken chain of love through Christ.

Conformed to the Son: The ultimate purpose of everything we experience is to mold us into the *"image of his Son"* (8:29). For Bishop Barron, this means the **Christian life** is entirely about **centering oneself on Jesus Christ and letting His transformative grace replace the fearful, ego-driven psyche with the self-giving love of Christ.**

Children over the age of reason (age 7) may receive if significant health conditions exist. The Sacrament may be repeated if there is a more serious relapse in the condition.

The Sacrament offers to the sick the grace of the Holy Spirit, by which the whole person is helped toward salvation, is lifted up by the faithfulness of God, and is strengthened against the temptations of evil and the anxiety of death.

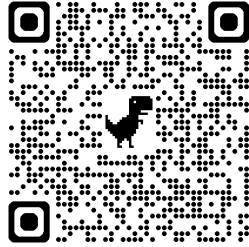
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Screen Time and Scared Time

Technology has become a valuable part of our daily lives. It helps us stay connected, learn new things, and accomplish tasks with greater ease. Yet, if we are not careful, screens can quietly consume the time and attention that God desires us to give Him and to one another.

Jesus often stepped away from the crowds to pray. He understood the importance of silence, reflection, and communion with the Father. In our own busy lives, we also need moments to disconnect from our devices so we can reconnect with God.

For families, this can be as simple as putting phones away during meals, praying together before bedtime, reading your Bible for a few minutes each day, or spending Sunday focused on worship, rest and family time. These small choices create space for meaningful conversations and strengthen our relationships with both God and one another.

Children learn by watching the adults in their lives. When parents make prayer a priority, attend mass faithfully, and set healthy boundaries on technology, they teach a powerful lesson: our relationship with God deserves our first attention.

It doesn't mean that technology is the enemy. In fact, it can be a wonderful tool for faith formation through Catholic podcasts, online Bible studies, prayer apps, and livestreamed events for those who are homebound. The key is making sure that our use of technology serves our faith rather than replacing it.

When trying to create balance, we might ask ourselves: How much time do I spend looking at a screen compared to looking toward God? Even setting aside ten or fifteen minutes each day for quiet prayer can transform our hearts and remind us that God's voice is often heard most clearly in moments of stillness.



May our homes be places where both technology and faith have their proper place, where screens connect us with the world, but sacred time keeps us connected to Christ, who is the source of lasting peace and joy!

Discernment & the Holy Spirit: Become Aware, Understand, Take Action (Part 1)



Last week, I offered St. Ignatius of Loyola's favorite prayer – the Examen – as a way to grow in attentiveness to what happens inside us. This **awareness** is the first of three steps that Ignatius says will help us discern and respond to the spiritual realities, good and bad, that are seeking to influence our souls. Becoming aware of our interior spiritual experience is essential; it is “the gateway to all discernment” (Fr. Timothy Gallagher, *The Discernment of Spirits*, p. 17).

Developing this spiritual awareness does not come easily though. We often prefer to be distracted, rather than to look within. Will we like what we see? Do we have the courage to take a closer look at our hearts? Often it is easier to pick up our phones or turn on the TV than to spend five minutes praying the Examen Prayer. Even if we find it hard (I know I do!), let's keep trying!

As we become more aware of what is happening in our souls, the next step is to seek to **understand**. “Everything in spiritual awareness is directed toward this next step, the moment in which we move from noticing to *understanding the spiritual meaning of the interior movements we have noticed*” (Fr. Gallagher, p. 23).

An example here might be helpful. Ignatius shares one from his own life to help us grasp this idea. Before his conversion to becoming a devoted follower of Jesus, Ignatius had great ambitions to succeed on the battlefield and in romance. He fought bravely as a soldier and was seriously wounded. While convalescing, he asked for something to read, hoping to distract himself with some chivalrous medieval romances. The only reading material to be found in the castle was a book about the saints and another about the life of Christ.

Besides reading to pass the time, Ignatius spent a lot of time daydreaming. After all, there was no YouTube or social media or podcasts in the 16th century! He would dream of victory on the battlefield and winning the heart of the princess; then, inspired by the only reading material he had, he would dream of following Jesus and living like the saints. Over time, he began to notice that, when he allowed his imagination to wander to worldly pursuits, it was temporarily delightful, but afterwards he felt empty. To the contrary, his daydreams about Jesus and becoming a saint were joyful, and he remained in this sense of joy and peace even after they had ended. He was **becoming aware** of how he was impacted by his daydreams.

As he reflected on what was happening within him, Ignatius began to see that two different “spirits” were working on his heart through these daydreams. The first spirit, which was influencing him to seek worldly pursuits, left him depleted. The second Spirit, the Holy Spirit, inspired him to think about things of God, and as a result he noticed himself growing in faith, hope, and love. Like Ignatius, **we come to understand our spiritual, interior experiences when we are able to identify their source**. We'll look at this more closely in a future column, but first, next week we'll get to the final step after becoming aware and understanding: taking action.

Reducing Anxiety in Your Life with Kari Reindl

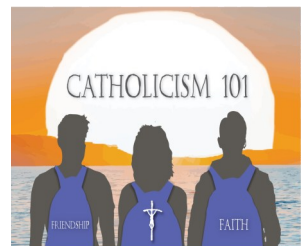

Join us for a weekly time of prayer and conversation about Acts and the role of the Holy Spirit in the church at its founding and today in our own lives.

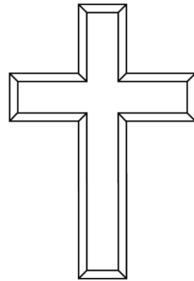
