Dear Parishioners,

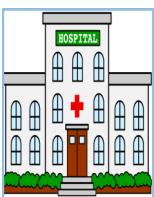

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Heavenly Hero for the month of August: Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein)

Born: October 12, 1891

Died: August 9, 1942

Feast Day: August 9

Patronage: Europe, philosophers, and loss of parents

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross was a brilliant German philosopher, a brave wartime nurse, and a Carmelite nun. Born into a devout Jewish family, she spent years searching for the meaning of life before discovering the Catholic faith, eventually giving everything to follow Jesus.

Edith was born in Breslau, Germany. Her father passed away when she was only two years old, leaving her mother to raise Edith and her seven older brothers and sisters while running the family business.

Edith was incredibly smart and loved to learn. As Edith grew into a teenager, she began to have many deep questions about life and the world. Because she could not find the answers right away, she stopped praying and decided she was an atheist.

She went to college and studied philosophy, and she became a famous writer, but her heart was still searching for a deeper truth that books alone could not give her. During World War I, she paused her studies to serve as a Red Cross nurse, taking care of wounded soldiers.

The turning point in Edith's life happened when she was visiting some friends. One evening, she picked up a book from their shelf: the life story of Saint Teresa of Ávila. Edith started reading it and could not put it down. She realized that Jesus was exactly who she had been looking for her whole life.

On New Year's Day in 1922, Edith was baptized into the Roman Catholic Church. In 1933, she entered the cloistered Carmelite convent in Cologne, Germany, and took the name Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. After the Nazis took power in Germany, Edith was in danger because she was born Jewish. Eventually, the Nazis captured Edith. Even in the prison camps, Edith was known for her incredible kindness, gently comforting the scared children and helping the other prisoners. On August 9, 1942, she was taken to the Auschwitz concentration camp, where she died.

Talking Point with Children: Saint Edith Stein teaches us that no matter how lost or confused we might feel, God is always guiding our steps. She showed the world that true strength comes from seeking the truth, loving others, and trusting in Jesus.

Action Step for Children: St. Edith Stein had a great love for reading. As a way to honor her, visit a bookstore or the library and pick out one book on a Catholic saint that you have never learned about before.

Prayer Time

"For the battle belongs to the LORD"

~1 Samuel 17:47

Last month I attended the Steubenville Youth Conference in Rochester MN with a group of high school students. They gave us a prayer card that can be used as a personal prayer guide. My first thought was, I should share this with other people!

Prayer is simply a conversation with God, much like we would have with a friend. This guide can help you build a habit of prayer. Find a spot where you can pray without disruption and follow the steps below!

Acknowledge (2-3min)

Take some time to acknowledge what is going on in your heart and mind right now. Be aware of what's on the surface and what's going on at the deepest level.

Relate (5min)

Talk with God. Share what's on your heart and mind, whether through journaling, speaking out loud, or praying silently. If you're scared, thankful, or joyful, tell Him. The most important thing is to be honest and authentic. Don't say what you think he wants to hear, just be real, like you would with a friend.

Receive (3-5min)

Prayer is a conversation, meaning we must also allow God to speak to us. Now, it's our turn to listen and receive whatever God desires to give us. If you've shared your heart fully, you're ready to listen. This part can be hard and feel awkward, it requires waiting and learning to recognize His voice. But don't skip it. Sit in silence.

Respond (5min)

This is a time to respond to what you've just received. Let it be as simple and natural as saying "thank you." Your response should come from the heart, honest and real, not just something that sounds "holy." If all you can say is "thank you," that's enough. You can respond by journaling, speaking to Him aloud, or simply praying in your heart.

How could this prayer time impact you today? Are there any changes that God might be asking you to make? How is he strengthening you by what he has given you in prayer today? What does it seem that God is asking you to focus on today?

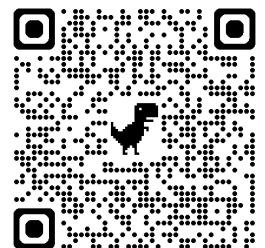


Attention Lourdes Academy Families:

Discernment & the Holy Spirit: Become Aware, Understand, Take Action (Part 2)



Last week, we looked at the first two steps given to us by St. Ignatius of Loyola to discern and respond to the sources that are influencing our souls. Are our thoughts, feelings, and interior experiences being influenced by the Holy Spirit – or by something else seeking to lead us astray? We seek to determine this by **first becoming aware** of what is happening within us through reflective prayers such as the Examen (described in this column a couple weeks ago) and **then by understanding** and identifying the source (more on this to come next week).

The third and final step is to **take action**. When we have become aware of what is happening within us and understand its source as being either the Holy Spirit or an unholy spiritual influence, we must **take action, either to accept what is good or to reject what is not good (or downright evil)**.

Let's return to the example from Ignatius' own life, given in last week's column. First, a brief recap: While convalescing from a serious battle wound, Ignatius passed the time daydreaming. He dreamed first of fulfilling all his ambitions by winning a great victory on the battlefield and wooing the fair princess. Then, inspired by the only reading material he had available (on the life of Jesus and the saints), he would dream of following Jesus and living like the saints.

Over time, Ignatius began to notice that, when he allowed his imagination to wander to worldly pursuits, it was temporarily delightful, but afterwards he felt empty. To the contrary, his daydreams about Jesus and becoming a saint were joyful, and he remained in this sense of joy and peace even after they had ended. He was **becoming aware** of how he was impacted by his daydreams.

As he reflected on what was happening within him, Ignatius began to **understand** that two different "spirits" were working on his heart through these daydreams. The first spirit, which was influencing him to seek worldly pursuits, left him depleted. The second Spirit, the Holy Spirit, inspired him to think about things of God, and as a result he noticed himself growing in faith, hope, and love.

How was Ignatius to respond to all of this? He came to believe that if he wanted to have a life of true joy, he must **take action and accept** the life being offered to him by the Holy Spirit. It was time to become serious about following Jesus and doing God's will. At the same time, he also needed to **take action and reject** the unholy spirit that was still seeking to allure him to worldly ambitions. He needed to stop seeking pleasure, honor, and wealth, which seemed delightful at first, but would ultimately only leave him empty.



In the same way, if we are serious about living for God, we must also take action to accept the inspirations of the Holy Spirit and reject all others. But how can we begin to identify if it's the Holy Spirit or not? We'll turn to that topic next week.
