Dear Parishioners,

Summer always goes way too quickly. As we transition from summer to school and fall, I would like to bring you up to date on the **transitions** that have happened in our Catholic community in the Oshkosh area this summer.

First, thank you for your warm welcome of **Fr. Nathan Budde**. He has jumped right into priestly ministry and our Oshkosh area. It is great to have him with us.



On July 1, **Fr. Ryan Starks** became the Pastor of **Most Blessed Sacrament Parish**. Fr. Ryan moved here from St. Therese Parish in Appleton. He is already bringing great insights into how we can best serve the people of our area. Fr. Ryan is fluent in Spanish and will be able to serve the Spanish-speaking members of our parishes.

Deacon Brad Gallenberg became the Pastoral Leader of **St. Jude Parish** on July 1. Deacon Brad had already been serving St. Jude as Business Manager, and so it has been a smooth transition as he leads the parish now.



Fr. Erwin Obias from the Archdiocese of Caceres in the Philippines will begin to serve the parishes in **Omro and Winneconne** on September 1. Fr. Erwin has been helping at Masses around our area in preparation of his coming role. Fr. Erwin brings a love of life and the priesthood, and we look forward to having him in our area.



Fr. Budde and I have been doing most of the weekend Masses in **Omro and Winneconne** this summer. The priests from St. Raphael have been serving in Omro and Winneconne since 2007. Come September, we will end our time there and instead celebrate the weekend Masses at **St. Jude Parish** instead.

On the weekdays, we have adjusted pieces of our schedule, moving the **Friday Mass** from St. Raphael to St. Jude, and moving **confessions** from Tuesday to Thursday. That allows us to cover one of the three weekday Masses at St. Jude, as well as add a third Mass most weeks with the **Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother**, whose chaplain, Fr. Bill Hower, recently died.



Meanwhile, **Mr. Zach Zeckser** is now serving as President of **Lourdes Academy** and looking forward to meeting the faculty and staff this week, and then our students and parents.



Let's continue to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to lead and guide us.

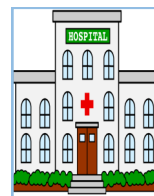

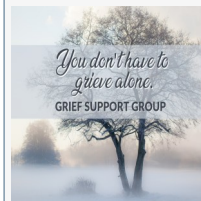

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



The Heavenly Hero for the month of August is **Saint Edith Stein**. Edith believed strongly that reading Bible stories leaves a deep, beautiful mark on a child's imagination. Today, as a family read the Sunday Gospel together (**Matthew 16:13-20**) and use the following to guide your discussion:

In today's Gospel, Peter, "the rock" who became the first pope and leader of the Church, announces the core of our faith, that Jesus is God's only Son. The family, as the domestic church, has this same faith as its foundation.

As you gather together as a family, talk about people who have led you to Jesus and talk about what you have learned from leaders in our Church today. Next, discuss how your family can help lead others to Christ in the coming week. End your time together by praying the "Our Father."

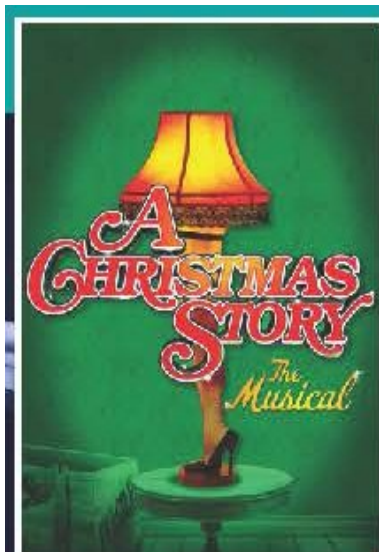

Sending Your Children Back to School with Faith

As Summer comes to an end and a new school year begins, backpacks are filled, school supplies are purchased, and families begin adjusting to new schedules. Whether your children are starting preschool, elementary, middle school, high school, college, or even a new career, this is an important time to pause and place them in God's loving hands.



For parents and grandparents, sending a child off to school can bring many emotions, excitement, pride, hope, and sometimes a little worry. We can't always be there to protect them or guide every decision they make. But we can pray for them, encourage them, and remind them that God is always with them.



Our children and grandchildren need more than good grades and academic success. They need wisdom to make good choices, courage to stand up for what is right, kindness toward others, and faith to carry them through difficult days.

This school year let us pray not only for our youngest children but for students of every age.

- Pray for the child entering kindergarten who may be nervous about being away from home.
- Pray for the middle school student trying to find his or her place.
- Pray for the teenager facing academic, social, and personal challenges.
- Pray for the college student discovering greater independence.
- And pray for young adults as they begin jobs, apprenticeships, or other new chapters in life.

And grandparents, remember that your prayers are a beautiful gift to your grandchildren. You can place their names before the Lord each day. Pray for their teachers, their friends, their decisions, their safety, and especially their relationship with Jesus.

As we send our children back into the world of learning, let us remember that education is about more than filling their minds. It is also about forming their hearts. May they grow not only in knowledge, but in faith, compassion, courage, and love.

Discernment & the Holy Spirit: What Happens When We're Headed in the Right Direction

As we seek to understand the spiritual sources that influence our thoughts, feelings, and interior movements – what St. Ignatius calls the “discernment of spirits” – it is important first to know what direction our lives are headed in. This is important because the spiritual influences in our lives, whether that is the Holy Spirit or an unholy one seeking to lead us astray, act differently depending on what direction we are going.



Last week, we noted that, for those moving away from God, the Holy Spirit stings our conscience, like a biting fly, to encourage us to return to God, while the enemy of our souls works in a contrary manner, providing all kinds of encouragement to stay on the wrong path.

For a soul moving toward God – seeking God and his will and moving away from sin and toward virtue – the strategy is now reversed. The Holy Spirit seeks to encourage, “to give courage and strength, consolations, tears [of true repentance], inspirations, and quiet, easing and taking away all obstacles, so that the person may go forward in doing good” (St. Ignatius, Spiritual Exercises, Week 1, Rule 2). Meanwhile, any spirits seeking to lead us away from God now act like that biting fly, putting up road blocks of false reasoning or sadness to convince us that staying on the right path is a bad idea.

Let's return to last week's example of John, our UWO college student. Let's say that John followed the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to come home early from the party and go to Mass on campus the next day. At Mass, he feels a peace he hasn't felt in a long time. He meets some friendly people who are genuinely interested in him for who he is, and they invite him out to lunch afterwards. He goes back to his residence hall feeling better than he has in a long time and decides he is going back again next week.

The following Friday, as he is thinking about his plans for the weekend, John remembers his resolution to go to Mass that Sunday. He remembers how peaceful he felt at Mass and even for a few days afterwards. He feels excited about going back. But then other thoughts come to him: what about his friends who will be partying this weekend? Won't he miss them? And he has a big test on Monday. Does he really have enough time to go to Mass? He starts to doubt his resolution and feels confused about what to do.

John's life is currently headed back toward God. He has made the choice to go to Mass and has been looking forward to it. He remembers the peaceful feeling he had last time, and that sense of peace returns when he thinks about it again. The Holy Spirit is working through this positive interior experience to encourage him to keep his resolution to return to Mass.

On the other hand, another spirit is at work too, one that is trying to bring up all the reasons going to Mass would be a bad idea. This creates doubt and confusion within John about something that would help him stay on a good path in his relationship with God.

Ignatius tells us this dynamic is true for anyone headed toward God. The Holy Spirit encourages the person, so that he or she will remain on the right path; the evil spirit wants to discourage the person by raising false objections about the goodness of that path and creating an interior dark cloud of confusion, doubt, or sadness.

How are we to respond when we notice these dynamics at play in our lives? Stay tuned for some advice from St. Ignatius in future articles.



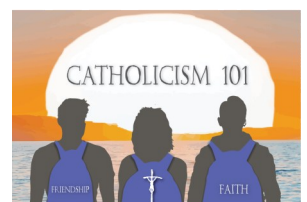

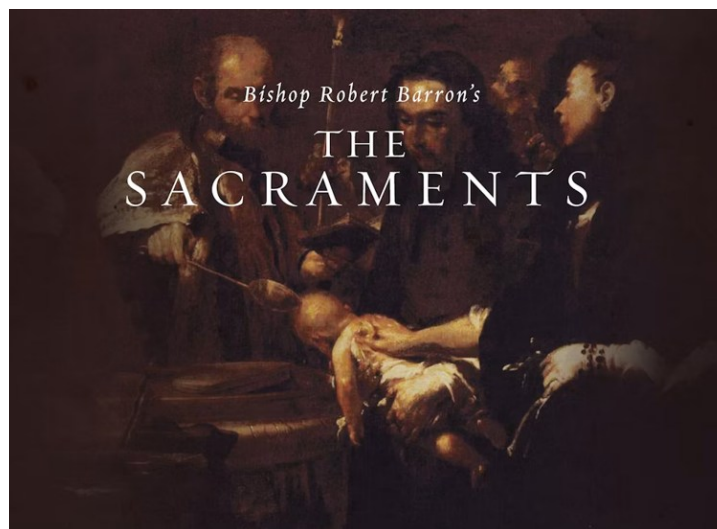

This course is for those who have ever felt confused or uncertain about prayer, and for those who want to deepen their own prayer life.

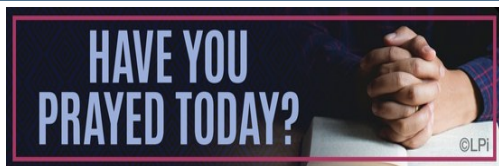
Sessions:

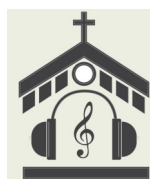

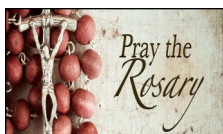
