we are devoted to fostering households and

Dear Parishioners,

Near the beginning of each Mass, the priest says "Let us pray" and then offers a prayer called the "Collect" or Opening Prayer. During Ordinary Time, the Church provides a Collect for each week which is said both at Mass on that week's Sunday and weekdays. They are very theologically rich prayers---and grammatically confusing at times!---drawn from a variety of ancient sources from the Early Church. However, if we listen closely to the Collect each Sunday, we can learn more about how God is at work: in the Mass, in the world, and in our hearts!

This week's Collect, for the 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time is as follows (omitting the ending):

"God of might, giver of every good gift, put into our hearts the love of your name, so that, by deepening our sense of reverence, you may nurture in us what is good and, by your watchful care, keep safe what you have nurtured."

The ancient Roman grammar of the prayer is convoluted enough to give any English teacher nightmares! If we break this prayer into bite sized pieces, however, we will not only be able to better understand what is being said at Mass but be able to make the prayers of the Mass part of our own personal prayer!

"God of might, giver of every good gift..."

The prayer of the Mass is addressed to God the Father, who Jesus tells us gives good gifts to his children—that's us! (Matthew 7:11)

"...put into our hearts the love of your name, so that, by deepening our sense of reverence..."

Each Collect has a petition, something that we ask for from the Father. This week, we ask the Father to place in our hearts the love of His name, which we express by our acts of reverence. This is also the time in which we might call to mind our own personal petitions and intentions for Mass, joining our prayers to the prayer of the Church.

"...you may nurture in us what is good, and by your watchful care, keep safe what you have nurtured..."

In this final part of the Collect, we explain the reason behind the prayer's petition: so that he may fill our hearts with good things and keep safe what he has given. In this last part, we are reminded of our dependence on our Father's providential care for us as his beloved sons and daughters. He is the one who gives us every good gift, and he is the one who protects us. What great hope his fatherly care gives us!

I encourage all of us (even us priests) to pay extra attention to the Collects at Mass. When the priest says, "Let us pray," may it be an opportunity for us to call to mind our own personal intentions and a reminder to listen closely to the prayer of the priest, that it may be our prayer, as well.

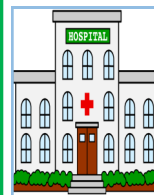

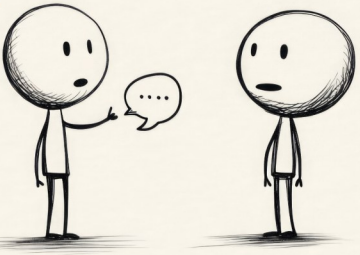

Bringing the Saints into Family Life



When we think about our family's faith, a lot of times we think about Sunday Mass, bedtime prayers, or teaching our children about Jesus, but there is another beautiful gift the Church gives our families: the Saints.

The Saints are our brothers and sisters in faith who followed Jesus in their own unique circumstances. They remind us that holiness is possible for everyone, including children, parents, grandparents, and families.

Saints can become wonderful companions for our children. Share stories with them about saints who were children, such as, St. Dominic Savio, St. Therese of Lisieux, or St. Maria Goretti. Talk about saints who served the poor, cared for others, prayed faithfully, or remained strong during difficult times. Their stories help children see that following Jesus is something they can begin doing right now. Most importantly, remind your children that the Saints point us toward Jesus. They show us what it looks like to love God, serve others, forgive, pray, and persevere.

Your family doesn't have to do anything complicated. Start with one saint, one story, and one prayer. Over time, your children may discover that the Saints are faithful friends who encourage us on our own journey toward heaven. Invite them into your homes and families and allow their example to inspire us to grow closer to Christ.

Discernment & the Holy Spirit: Consolation and Desolation

For the past several weeks in this column, we have been following the insights of St. Ignatius of Loyola, seeking to understand more deeply the interior movements and influences on our hearts. Soon we'll get to the practical advice he gives to help us take action to reject what is bad and accept what is good among those influences. But first, we need to define two words that will be helpful to us in future columns on this topic: consolation and desolation.



Spiritual consolation is a movement within our souls in which our heart is “inflamed with love of its Creator and Lord”; we then love everyone and everything else rightly in light of this love for God. Consolation might be felt as a deep peace or joy, or as true and healthy sorrow for our sins or for Jesus’ suffering and death. In consolation, our capacity for faith, hope, and love grows; we are joyfully attracted to God and find our peace in him.

Spiritual desolation, on the other hand, is the opposite. We feel a darkness or disturbance in our soul, we are drawn to low and earthly things, and we are disquieted and agitated, lukewarm, sad, and slothful when it comes to the things of God. In these moments, we are being influenced negatively by a spirit other than the Holy Spirit, and this spirit is trying to pull us away from God.

We all love times of consolation and wish we could stay there forever! In these moments, we find it easy to pray, God feels close to us, and there is joy in serving him and others. These moments are a gift to be grateful for and to savor. But we all also face times of desolation. What are we to do then? We'll spend several weeks considering what St. Ignatius has to say about this, starting next week.



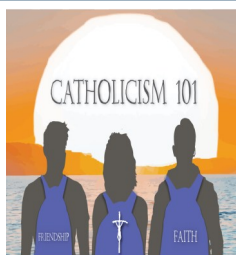

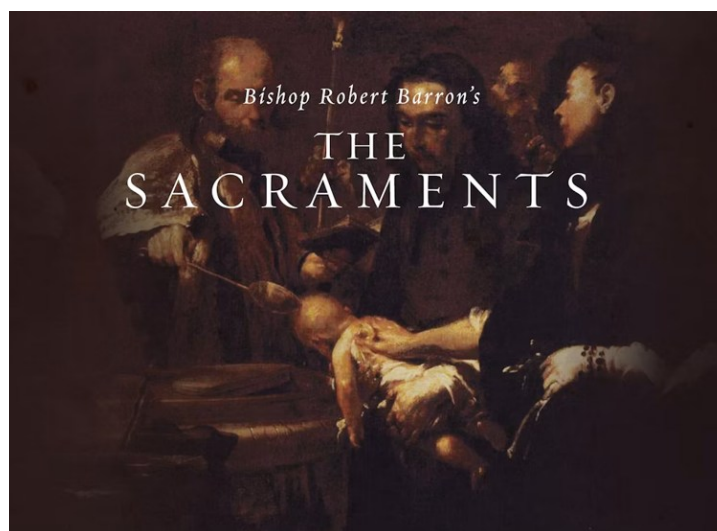

A Surge of the Heart:

*Moving from saying our prayers
to a life of prayer*

it is a simple look turned toward heaven,
it is a cry of recognition and of love,
embracing both trial and joy.”

St. Therese of Lisieux called prayer “a surge of the heart” – the soul’s response to the gentle pull towards communion with God. In this five-session course, we will explore the rich vision of Christian spirituality and the place of prayer within it, seeing prayer not merely as a practice but as a growing relationship with God. From this wider perspective, we will consider practical ways of praying and the challenges that often accompany the journey.

This course is for those who have ever felt confused or uncertain about prayer, and for those who want to deepen their own prayer life.

Sessions:

1. The context of prayer – where prayer happens
2. Temples of the Spirit – desire, longing, and sacred hearts
3. How we talk to God – methods of prayer
4. How God talks to us – listening for the still, small voice
5. Dealing with common obstacles in prayer

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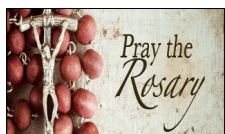
