5. How do we do a fall stewardship campaign?

- a. Gather a committee-decide on your goal-For example:
 - i. last year we received 59 pledge cards-this year we want to increase it by 20% to 69 pledge cards.
 - ii. Last year 87% of our members gave exactly the same amount as they did the year before. This year we are challenging all our members to take a STEP UP in Giving and give 1% more than last year and encourage our member to grow toward tithing. We will send a letter in a specially colored envelope, an email, and if necessary, follow up with a phone call to from our stewardship committee, to invite them to attend Consecration Sunday celebration

b. Make a plan-how will you accomplish your goal?

- i. How many weeks?
- ii. Will the pastor have a special preaching series?
- iii. Will you use personal stories?
- iv. Who will write and send the letters? Emails? Make phone calls?
- v. Who will organize the food, decorations, setup and clean up for the celebration dinner?
- vi. Who will hand out pledge cards, collect and tally them?
- vii. Who will write the thank you notes? Report to council? Write the annual report?

STEWARDSHIP/Generosity Team-MAKE A DIFFERENCE MOMENT A Formal stewardship program isn't always possible for every congregations.

The SRT recommends that every Sunday right before collecting the offering, the pastor or usher, makes a one minute "Make a Difference" announcement about how the money that goes in the plate or the money that is given electronically is making a real difference in the life of someone else here at our church, in the surrounding communities, in the state of Wisconsin, in the USA, in the world. You aren't asking for money, you are thanking them and reminding folks about the good things that their money is doing that they might have forgotten or never knew. You fill in the blanks below and get a volunteer to say thank you and remind people how their offering and gifts make a difference. See the Faith in Action booklet for ideas. Brainstorm 52 ways to say "thank you" and share how their offering is making a difference.
