The Door Way Effect or The Sankofa Bird, Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson

Do you walk into a room and forget why? It is very common and there is a scientific name for it, The Door Way Effect. In this workshop we will discuss what the church forgot when it walk through the doorway into the Christian Era and why now in the post Christian era we need to go back before Christendom to find what we have lost. The Sankofa Bird is a Ghanaian symbol. The bird's head is turned backward while its feet are facing forward carrying an egg in its mouth. The Sankofa proverb states: "It is not wrong to go back for that which you have forgotten." This going back to reclaim and bring into the present may be the way we can discern our next most faithful courageous steps as a church and a synod.

FX Round 1: Fresh Expressions of the Church

Fresh Expressions of Church: Reaching new people in new places in new ways.

Come and hear about fresh expressions of church that invite us to join in with what God is already up to in our communities. Hear how Lagers with the Lord and Wildchurch are reaching new people in new places in new ways.

I Love to Hear the Story Told

In the early church, most people encountered the Scriptures not through reading them, but through hearing them. Come and experience the liveliness of God's Word when it is performed from memory. Pastors Lori and Phil Ruge-Jones will engage you with a passage of God's Word through Biblical Storytelling and invite you into this way of interpreting Scriptures.

Synodically Authorized Ministers SAMs

SAMs are authorized by the Bishop to serve specific congregations or ministries with full ministry duties including presiding at Communion, weddings, and funerals. In this workshop you'll hear about how the now over 30 SAMs in our Synod are serving their congregations and communities, and you'll learn how you or someone in your congregation(s) who feels a call to ministry but not ordained ministry can become a SAM. This is relevant for any congregation struggling to find a new pastor or in need of additional professional ministry but without the means to call another pastor. This workshop will be led by The Rev. Dr. Bob Giese, who has been teaching pastoral care to and mentoring our SAMs for over four years and The Rev. Randy Olson, whose Synod Staff duties include working with congregations seeking to have a member become a SAM. Current SAMs will be present to share their stories.

FX Round 2: Fresh Expressions of the Church

Fresh Expressions of Church: Reaching new people in new places in new ways.

Come and hear about fresh expressions of church that invite us to join in with what God is already up to in our communities. Hear how the people of Faith Lutheran church and Rock Creek Lutheran Church are on the look out for Mustard Seed Reports. Hear how creative dinner church in Poplar is reaching out to new people in new places in that community. "John Sutherland will tell the story of how Cross Lutheran in Roberts has reached out to the recovery community with Recovery Church."

Installing a Solar Panel Array in Your Church: Benefits and Challenges

Solar panels producing clean energy is a great example of living God's Call to Care for Creation. They can reduce the church's carbon footprint and the cost of electricity. It can be a challenge to help church leaders and the congregation support the project. What design will work and how will we fund it? Bring your questions and join us for a workshop that will outline how two Synod congregations completed solar panel array projects.

How Can Lutherans Respond to the Climate Crisis?

"Twenty years ago, the Lutheran Church responded to growing ecological concerns with the social statement, Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice. Since then, our perception of climate change has shifted from a distant threat to future generations to an existential menace that haunts weekly news cycles. In response, ELCA leadership has released a new social message on Earth's Climate Crisis. While it is significant that our church join the countless other faith communities in officially recognizing this reality, more important is how it informs how we can respond faithfully. In this workshop, we'll glance through this exciting new document, briefly considering its context, then skip to the end so that we can discuss meaningful actions that individual congregations can pursue."

Mission Tellers: Telling the Story of Our Hands Doing God's Work in the World

Each of us has a unique story and we are all part of a much larger story - God's story. When we understand our baptismal identity we share our stories of how God works in our lives and in the lives around us. Learn to bring your stories to life and to tell the stories of God's work through our hands throughout the world.

Quilt of Justice

We have opportunities to address injustice in our synod, in our communities and across communities. Knitting them together into the Kingdom of Heaven seems impossible. A series of stories, of various opportunities and challenges in our small area of the world, and things large and small that we can do to love our neighbors.

Reconciling in Christ Journey

Join Deacon David Behling at a workshop that provides an overview of the Reconciling in Christ [RIC] journey for ministries. Since 1974, ReconcilingWorks: Lutherans for Full Participation has advocated for the full welcome, inclusion, and equity of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and asexual/aromantic (LGBTQIA+) Lutherans in all aspects of the life of their Church, congregations, and community; and since 1983 has hosted the RIC journey as a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions in the Lutheran church. As the Program Coordinator for ReconcilingWorks, Deacon David will be walking participants through some history and values of the organization, context around why welcome matters in the life of your faith community and larger world, an overview of the Building an Inclusive Community workshop, and how you can get started in your own faith community by building and strengthening relationships.

A Community Church — Walking With Our Neighbors

What might happen if a faith community shifted its focus from trying to stay alive to that of simply loving God + People? Might we find a deeper purpose than simply surviving? Join us in this open panel discussion workshop as we cover a few key things that have worked for us.

ELC, like many churches, has been through some major changes post covid. One of them is the way we engage with each other and our neighbors. We made a shift from focusing on ourselves and how we will get people to "come back to church" so that we can have enough offering to pay our bills, to that of taking the church to the people by simply loving God and loving People. Because of this, we have tapped into one of our core values: community. Through this we continue to get to know our Ho-Chunk neighbors more deeply, we show up time and time again in the community where there are needs, and we do all of this without the expectation of people needing to "join" or do something to experience God's love. We do it because we are called to simply love.

Because of this, people are coming to church, the Holy Spirit is gifting us a season of growth and depth. While numbers are not our measuring tool for success, it helps people to see growth: our Sunday School has grown from 10 kiddos to 60, and our weekly worship has gone from 50 to 175 average in just two years. We found ourselves in the position of needing to build leaders and multiply as God's love has outgrown our current leadership compacity. More importantly, lives are being changed and people are hearing about the love of God and the transformative power that can only come from Jesus!

Until All Are Fed

More than 820 million people in the world are hungry, even as we live in a world of abundance. Learn how ELCA World Hunger, Feed My People Food Bank, and other emergency food organizations work globally and locally to make it possible for everyone to have enough to eat. And learn what you can do to be part of the solution

How to be an Ally for 2SLGBTQIA+ people: Ministry. Learning. Action.

This workshop will start from a shared understanding of God's welcome and unconditional love for all people. We will explore ways to deepen and expand ministry to and with 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals and families. We will learn how to support people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions while recognizing how sexuality and gender intersect with other identities that also marginalize many of God's children. We will integrate what we learn into our lives and work on building relationships with other people , both allies and Queer folk.

Divine Ecology

We are never EVER alone. It doesn't matter which system we look at, all the relationships are interconnected, from the utterly microscopic to the vastly cosmic — we are in relationship, whether we want to or can acknowledge it or not. This is a divine ecology of which we are privileged to be part of, which we have the delight to discuss, and can wonder and worry at. I'm sure the crows and octopodes do too, but I'm not privy to those conversations. Divine Ecology asks some basic questions Where do I fit? Where do I fit NOW? Who are you? Where do you fit? And how is the Spirit at work in these relationships.
