Many of the details about Jesus' encounter with Zaccheus are well-known, such as the tax collector being vertically challenged. (Since the average height of Judean men back then was 5'5", being described as short proves he was indeed a "wee little man.")

Another detail, the sycamore-fig tree he climbed to see Jesus, has a connection to an ancient prophet:

Amos answered Amaziah, "I was neither a prophet nor a prophet's son, but I was a shepherd, and I also took care of sycamore-fig trees. But the LORD took me from tending the flock and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'"

(Amos 7:14-15)

That passage in Amos foreshadows of the coming of the Messiah because it describes God reaching out to save the people of Israel, despite the difficulties that are coming their way. Here's what Amos says:

This is what the Sovereign LORD showed me: He was preparing swarms of locusts after the king's share had been harvested and just as the second crop was coming up. When they had stripped the land clean, I cried out, "Sovereign LORD, forgive! How can Jacob survive? He is so small!" So the LORD relented. "This will not happen," the LORD said.

This is what the Sovereign LORD showed me: The Sovereign LORD was calling for judgment by fire; it dried up the great deep and devoured the land. Then I cried out, "Sovereign LORD, I beg you, stop! How can Jacob survive? He is so small!" So the LORD relented. "This will not happen either," the Sovereign LORD said.

This is what he showed me: The Lord was standing by a wall that had been built true to plumb, with a plumb line in his hand. And the LORD asked me, "What do you see, Amos?" "A plumb line," I replied. Then the Lord said, "Look, I am setting a plumb line among my people Israel; I will spare them no longer. The high places of Isaac will be destroyed and the sanctuaries of Israel will be ruined; with my sword I will rise against the house of Jeroboam."

(Amos 7:1-9)

Notice the parallel as Amos pleads for God to forgive Jacob, referring to Israel, because "he is so small!" Before God could forgive his people, they needed to repent so he places a plumb line in their midst to show them what is straight and true. The plumb line is God's righteous and holy standard that Israel failed to adhere to, leading to them being punished.

When Jesus came, he adhered perfectly to God's plumb line and made forgiveness possible for those who place their trust in him. His righteousness can become our own by faith after Jesus offered himself to satisfy God's punishment upon sinners. Jesus was headed towards Jerusalem to do exactly that when he passed through Jericho and encountered Zacchaeus.
