As a church grows, organization is essential. Though some may prefer the way the church existed after Christ's ascension when they had only 120 people, God's plan is that the church expand as the Gospel is shared and more people accept his grace through faith in Jesus. As that happens, some structure will become necessary so that God's work can continue to prosper.

After Moses led God's people out of Egypt, his fatherin-law came to visit him. Jethro expressed his delight to hear what God was doing through Moses, and he offered a sacrifice to God for delivering his people from bondage. (Exodus 18:5-12)

However, when Jethro saw that Moses was doing all the work of leadership by himself, he was not pleased, and he counseled his son-in-law to adapt to the increasing needs of the expanding nation he led:

"What you are doing is not good. You and these people who come to you will only wear yourselves out. The work is too heavy for you; you cannot handle it alone. Listen now to me and I will give you some advice, and may God be with you...select capable men from all the people - men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain - and appoint them as officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens...That will make your load lighter, since they will share it with you." (Exodus 18:17-22)

Moses followed the advice he was given and Israel flourished as a result.

A similar situation arose in the early church as they began to increase in number and the apostles who were called to lead God's people found a comparable remedy. They ordained men who could handle the day-to-day needs of the people so that their work of teaching God's Word and praying for the flock would not suffer. These men eventually came to be known in the church as deacons.

Our goal in adding men to this role at Montwood is not organizing for organization's sake, nor to increase the number of men listed in our weekly bulletin who have an official role or title. Our intent is that by appointing men to assist with the planning, logistics, and implementation of God's work in his church, the ministry of teaching the Word and prayer will continue unabated. We have grown and intend to continue growing and thus the burden of leading and serving our flock is one that must be shared by an expanding leadership team.
