Isaiah 58: 1-12

Sermon Question: What, if anything, did you take away from today's sermon? What did you hear?

Discussion Questions:

1. What might God be calling you to say and do, not to earn salvation, but to "fulfill righteousness"?
2. When do you remember your baptismal promises?
3. When have I been inspired by someone else's faithfulness?
4. What are some gentle yet visible ways that I might witness to my faith?
5. Who do I know that could benefit from seeing God's light through me?
6. Where have you seen light, lately? How have you been light and how has that light been reflected back to you? And how are you called to be light tomorrow?
7. How would you describe "salt of the earth"? Who has been that in your life?
8. How do you understand what God has called the law and the prophets to fulfill and what Christ has called us to do? Where do they overlap? How do they support each other?
9. Why does Jesus lift up the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees in today's gospel?
10. How do we who are followers of Jesus do and teach the commandments?
11. How do the other lectionary readings (Isa 58:1-12 and 1 Cor 2:1-16) help us understand the greater righteousness to which Jesus calls us?
