Our children celebrate First Communion in Grade 3. Earlier participation in communion is at the discretion of parents or guardians.


The people walking in darkness shall see a great light! The people living in darkness, on them a light will shine! And the glory of God shall be shown, the will of God made known.


We lift them to the Lord.
