#### From the Desk of Pastor David

#### **Treasures Old and New**

"Every disciple trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old" (Matthew 13:52) Jesus' words address an ongoing challenge in religion and other areas of our life. We need to hold on to the old treasures, the old traditions, for they help keep us grounded in the midst of change; yet we know that traditions must adapt to new circumstances and new challenges.

There are two current topics of tradition and change at Alleluia! that I wanted to let you know about.

First, the Church Council has been working for the past couple months on revising the congregation's constitution. A constitution is something people tend to consult only if they have a question and need some guidance. It is at moments of uncertainty or crisis that a written constitution—a well-defined tradition—is invaluable. The constitution tells us how to navigate a crisis not only according to custom but according to the legal rules that the congregation has adopted.

Over the past two years, congregational leaders have realized that Alleluia!'s constitution is not as clear as it needs to be on some governance issues, and so it does not offer the needed guidance. The current constitution also does not incorporate the recommended—and often required—language developed by the legal team at the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The Church Council is therefore working on clarifying some sections of the document and generally aligning our constitution with the requirements of the ELCA and the Northern Illinois Synod. According to our constitution, any changes to the constitution must be approved by a vote of the congregation. You will be hearing more details about all this in the weeks ahead.

The second topic bears on how we think about tradition in worship. I have recommended, and the Church Council has agreed, that we should replace the line in our statement of core values that says "We worship God, not tradition" with this statement: "Our life is centered in the worship of God as revealed in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ."

To say "We worship God, not tradition" suggests that traditional styles of worship are an impediment to true worship, or that defenders of traditional styles are standing in the way of true worship. That is not really fair to the variety of worship styles that exist in the ELCA and other churches. Furthermore, Alleluia!'s own worship is a mix of traditional and contemporary styles. It is more accurate and helpful to view all styles, whether labeled traditional or contemporary, as offering resources for the people of God. It is the responsibility of the pastors and worship leaders to draw on old and contemporary sources in order to best serve the worshiping life of the congregation.

"Every disciple trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old." Jesus calls us to be wise, discerning, faithful, and creative. As the church tries to balance tradition and change, it must seek above all to be faithful to the living God, who is always the same, and is making all things new.






















# Celebrating the Season at Alleluia!

<u>Confirmation Update:</u> The Prehistoric Pangean Bible Bunnies (6th Grade), Raging Mozambique Shrek Ballers (7th Grade), and the Oregon Fuschia Monkeys (8th Grade)

have been competing weekly in confirmation for points in what has been called the 'Clash of Classes.' Points are awarded for attendance, participation in church events, volunteering, and sermon notes. A huge congratulations to our Class of 2030, the Bible Bunnies, who won this first-ever season of Clash of Classes! Points will be set back to zero in January!

This month, students will be learning in Confirmation the Hebrew Bible (1/10), Law (1/17), Psalms (1/24), and the New Testament (1/31). We will not meet on 1/3.

<u>AYHigh Recap:</u> In December, we spent time exploring how we are 'Created to Be' Christmas People. High School Students deep dived into the biblical texts with the intention to see how God created familiar names of the Christmas story to be disciples and to be brave.



Students practiced what is called exegesis by taking the word 'discipleship' and breaking that term into 15 questions to find in the Christmas Story. In doing this, we learned and saw that these stories are wonderful examples of discipleship.

To see High School students also enjoying the time of Frosted Fellowship in the Underground Youth Center on Sunday Mornings between services is a treat! Come. Hang out. Chat life. Eat a donut!

<u>AYHigh - Created to Be Authentic:</u> In January, we will continue the exploration of the theme 'Created to Be.' This month's topic will be "Authentic." We are created to bring our whole real selves to be loved as we are by our Creator.

The ongoing theme for this year's lessons will be themes that will be covered at the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans!

Haven't been on a Tuesday Night? Come! The topics we cover at AYhigh are applicable to all high school students regardless if they plan to attend the 2024 Summer Trip or not!

**New Year to Get Involved:** As 2024 is upon us, now is a great time to get involved as a student or volunteer in Alleluia! Youth Ministry. If you are an adult who would like to volunteer in Confirmation (6th-8th) or AyHigh (9th-12th) please contact Youth Director Kurtis Arndt. You do **NOT** need to be an expert to help! In fact, leaders often learn in this space as well! If your student has yet to get to know these programs, please encourage them to come! Parental influence and guidance is a huge part of the Youth Ministry program.

High School Students are invited to come to AYHigh on Tuesday Nights (7-9pm), Frosted Fellowship on Sundays mornings (10-10:30am), and to volunteer for Confirmation on Wednesday nights (6-8pm). Three opportunities a week for them to gather! In all these spaces we grow in fellowship, Lutheran theology, and laugh along the way!

Confirmation Students meet on Wednesday Evenings (6:30-8:00pm). Confirmation is a time of faith formation as students prepare for their Affirmation of Baptism by covering topics of the New Testament, Old Testament, Lutheran Living, and Lutheran History and Catechism. Students also compete for points in the Clash of Classes throughout the week primarily on Sunday Mornings and Wednesday Nights. We ask that Confirmation students register to stay in the loop on all things Confirmation.

Youth Gathering Informational Meeting - Still Time To Learn and Sign Up!: On January 7th, families are invited to join High School Students in the Underground Youth Center after the 9am and 10:30am services to learn all about the summer trip to New Orleans for the ELCA Youth Gathering (Week of July 14th, 2024). This summer trip is a service trip, a cultural immersion trip, and an educational trip that is a TON of fun. We will be non-stop from 8am - 11pm every day for the entire trip! Having 35,000 High School Youth gather for service work, fellowship, and vocational exploration is something that only happens once every three years (next one is not until 2027)!

All current 8th - 12th grade families are invited. It is not a commitment to the trip, just an opportunity to come and learn all about this event! To be able to gather with potentially 8,000+ Lutheran Churches in the New Orleans Saints stadium is a life changing opportunity!

<u>Underground Renovations:</u> In order to best serve our High School Ministries, we have rearranged some furniture and games to create a High School Youth room for fellowship, teaching, and a place of retreat in the room next to the media room. Other aspects of this transformation have begun with the repainting of the walls, tools for teaching, and the start of brainstorming how we want to decorate that space to represent the excitement happening in the Youth Program.

In the long term, we have big dreams for this space to be continually transformed with decorations, memories, and new places for storage and sitting.
