#### From the Desk of Pastor David

#### The Body of Christ, Lutheran Style

The apostle Paul compared the church to a body made up of different parts. "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I don't need you!' And the head cannot say to the feet, 'I don't need you!' And "if the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body



were an ear, where would the sense of smell be?" (see 1 Corinthians 12). Just as the body needs hands, feet, eyes, and ears, the church needs people with different gifts working together to be the body of Christ.

At the congregational meeting in February, Church Council chair Gary Zoet spoke about the accomplishments of the past year, which were made possible by the diverse gifts God has given the people of Alleluia! and by the Spirit that brings us together to use our different roles for a common purpose. Paul writes, "Now there are a variety of gifts but the same Spirit, the same Lord." That is the glory of the body of Christ.

We should remember that the body of Christ goes beyond the people that gather at 103d Street and Book Road. It exists across space and time. One way we live out a broader vision of the church is by being part of the Northern Illinois Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

As a church structure, the ELCA falls in the middle of the spectrum of ways that churches can be structured. At one end of the spectrum are Baptist or Congregational traditions, in which each congregation is entirely independent, sovereign, and autonomous. At the other end of the spectrum is the Roman Catholic Church, in which congregations are formally linked to dioceses, bishops, and officials at the Vatican, and a great amount of top-down authority over congregations is exercised by the pope and the bishops.

The ELCA takes a middle route: each congregation has a good deal of autonomy, yet each congregation is linked for mutual support with a regional synod and with the national body that is the ELCA. The mutual support takes shape in such areas as mission, disaster relief, youth ministry, and ordained ministry.

For example, when it comes to choosing a minister, congregations in the ELCA are free to choose their own pastor—unlike in the Catholic Church, say, where the bishop assigns a pastor to the congregation. But an ELCA congregation isn't entirely autonomous in the call process. The synod plays a role by guiding and approving candidates for ordination and by helping congregations find pastors (and interim pastors) and helping pastors find positions. At the church-wide level, it's the ELCA, made up of synods from across the U.S., that sets theological guidelines for ministry and helps Lutheran seminaries share resources.

The diversity of gifts and roles in the body of Christ can at times make life more complicated and challenging than we would like it to be. But appreciating the diversity of gifts and roles in the church can also help us see more of what God is doing in the world and help us comprehend "the breadth, and length, and height, and depth of Christ's love," so that we "may be filled with the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:19).

# Honor Loved Ones with Engraved Leaves on Our Memorial Tree

- A Bit of History of our Alleluia! Artwork -

In 2008, Alleluia! worked with Professor Michael Strand and art students from the Center for Liturgical Art at Concordia University in Seward, NE to create original artwork for our church. These artists also created the large exclamation point (!) that greets people in the west parking lot.



The Tree of Life sculpture is located on the wall behind the communion table. Professor Strand developed a unique process for glazing and firing clay that takes as many as five separate firings to create the beautiful and unusual colors and patterns found on the tree.



Behind the Tree of Life on the wall facing 103rd St. is the Memorial Tree, its branches adorned with gold leaves that are engraved with names of loved ones. If you would like to purchase an engraved leaf in remembrance of a loved one, we ask a donation of \$150 for each leaf.




