On Wednesdays through the Lenten season, we will be offering a Midday Holy Eucharist service.

This brief (typically 30 minutes) Worship service focuses on the Sacrament of Holy Communion, Scripture readings, a brief homily (mediation on Scripture), and prayer. The Lenten season is a perfect time to reflect upon the death and resurrection of Jesus for us and the world, and how Christian discipleship is a lifestyle that must be nurtured by God's Word and Holy Sacraments.

Traditionally, the season of Lent is a time when something is "given up" as a sacrifice to help us remember the ultimate sacrifice of Christ for us. Conversely, Lent can also be a time to "add" a spiritual discipline that supports our growth in faith. If this day and time is possible for you, perhaps this Eucharist service could serve just that purpose?
