Waiting...

James 5.7-8 Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. 8 You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

A "Challenge" in Waiting
Matthew 11.2-3 Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples ³ and said to him, "Are you to one who is to come, or shall we look for another?"
The "Cure"
Matthew 11.4-6 And Iesus answered them. "Go and tell Iohn what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive their sight and the lame walk.

σκανδαλίζομαι (skandalizomai): "Το cause to stumble" (Be trapped/offended)

lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. ⁶ And blessed is the one

who is not offended by me."

Isaiah 35.3-6 Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. ⁴Say to those who have an anxious heart, "Be strong; fear not! Behold, your God will come with vengeance, with the recompense of God. He will come and save you." ⁵ Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶ then shall the lame man leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy.

Matthew 11.11-15 Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. ¹²From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force. ¹³ For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, ¹⁴ and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come. ¹⁵ He who has ears to hear, let him hear.
