

***CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION**

EPISTLE LESSON Ephesians 2:11-22

¹¹ Therefore remember that formerly you, the Gentiles in the flesh—who are called “uncircumcision” by the so-called “circumcision” that is performed on the body by human hands— ¹² that you were at that time without the Messiah, alienated from the citizenship of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. ¹³ But now in Christ Jesus you who used to be far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴ For he is our peace, the one who made both groups into one and who destroyed the middle wall of partition, the hostility, ¹⁵ when he nullified in his flesh the law of commandments in decrees. He did this to create in himself one new man out of two, thus making peace, ¹⁶ and to reconcile them both in one body to God through the cross, by which the hostility has been killed. ¹⁷ And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, ¹⁸ so that through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹ So then you are no longer foreigners and noncitizens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of God’s household, ²⁰ because you have been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. ²¹ In him the whole building, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord, ²² in whom you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in the Spirit.

***HOLY GOSPEL**

Mark 6:30-44

The Holy Gospel according to Saint Mark, the sixth chapter.

Glory to You, O Lord.

³⁰ Then the apostles gathered around Jesus and told him everything they had done and taught. ³¹ He said to them, “Come with me privately to an isolated place and rest a while” (for many were coming and going, and there was no time to eat). ³² So they went away by themselves in a boat to some remote place. ³³ But many saw them leaving and recognized them, and they hurried on foot from all the towns and arrived there ahead of them. ³⁴ As Jesus came ashore he saw the large crowd and he had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he taught them many things.

³⁵ When it was already late, his disciples came to him and said, “This is an isolated place and it is already very late. ³⁶ Send them away so that they can go into the surrounding countryside and villages and buy something for themselves to eat.” ³⁷ But he answered them, “You give them something to eat.” And they said, “Should we go and buy bread for 200 silver coins and give it to them to eat?” ³⁸ He said to them, “How many loaves do you have? Go and see.” When they found out, they said, “Five—and two fish.” ³⁹ Then he directed them all to sit down in groups on the green grass. ⁴⁰ So they reclined in groups of hundreds and fifties. ⁴¹ He took the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. He gave them to his disciples to serve the people, and he divided the two fish among them all. ⁴² They all ate and were satisfied, ⁴³ and they picked up the broken pieces and fish that were left over, twelve baskets full. ⁴⁴ Now there were 5,000 men who ate the bread.

**Updated Mask Guidance from Faith's Reopening Workgroup
(6/30/21)**

- In our building, masks are optional for people who are fully vaccinated. Masks are recommended for people who are not fully vaccinated (per CDC guidance).
- We will continue to offer the "comfort zone" of 6' socially distant seating in the rear left-side of the Sanctuary for anyone who wishes to worship there.
- If you are fully vaccinated and still desire to wear a mask, please feel free to do so to increase your personal comfort or safety.
- If you're not feeling well and experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, we ask that you get tested and stay home.

As Christians we are called to "love our neighbors as ourselves." We show love to our neighbors by masking up when we're not fully vaccinated and getting vaccinated if we are able to. Our church community includes vulnerable people who need to be protected and loved in this way. Save The Date: VBS - August 2-5, 2021

• We are excited to announce that there will be an in person VBS this summer at Faith Lutheran Church from August 2-5. At Rainforest Explorers VBS, your children will look into the Bible, God's Holy Word, and discover that Jesus led the way!



Changes for this year:

Obviously, this year's in person VBS will be different from any of our prior in person VBS experiences. We wanted to give you a heads up of some of the things that will be different so you can plan accordingly.

1. **VBS will be Monday, August 2nd through Thursday, August 5th.** There will be no Friday sessions or Friday evening closing program.
2. **Each day will be shorter than our "typical" VBS.** It will begin at 9 AM each day. End time is still to be determined, but will likely be between 11:00-11:15 each day. We will provide more specific information as we get closer.
3. **Registration will be limited.** Due to current guidelines, each of our classrooms will have a maximum capacity. Therefore, we will put a "cap" on class size.
4. **This year our VBS will be for kindergarten through 8th grade.** Unfortunately, this means we will not have our 3 year old or 4 year old classes this year. This is due to space limitations and necessary health/safety protocols.
5. **Masks will be worn by all children and adults at all times.**
6. There will be no snacks this year to avoid having to deal with removal of masks, social distancing, etc.

There will be some other changes as well that we will notify you of as we get closer, but those are the ones we wanted to let you know about as you plan your summer. Registration for children will be available starting in the middle/end of May. We will email out the registration link once it is available.
