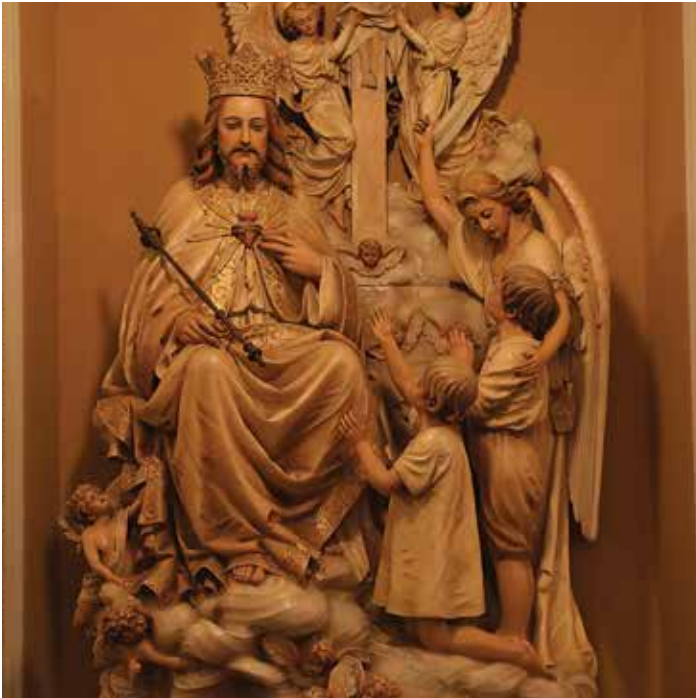

What an amazing start to a new school year here at Saint Sebastian Catholic School. We’ve started the school year off strong, having increased our school enrollment to 368 students, warmly embracing these new students into our school family. Due to popular demand, we also expanded our 3K program from two to three classes, joyfully educating our youngest 3-year old students and helping them build a strong foundation. Many of our students are hard at work, actively preparing to present their fall production of the Broadway musical, You’re a Good Man, Charlie Brown in November.

Our 8th grade Washington, D.C. trip is still a tradition, with our current 8th graders hosting fundraisers such as car washes and coffee sales to help offset the cost of their trip in May. We continue to offer our popular athletic offerings to our students such as volleyball, basketball, and track and field for our middle school students, and soccer for our youngest students in grades 4K - 4th grade. Our students learn to live out their faith by participating in uplifting and engaging class retreats. We also recognize our students monthly in their efforts to live out St. Sebastian School’s five CORE values: engage, inspire, grow, love and serve. And lastly, St. Sebastian School received the state’s highest five-star rating for “Significantly Exceeds Expectations” for educating its students.

At Saint Sebastian Catholic School, as our mission proclaims we are problem solvers, critical thinkers, and peacemakers. 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TEACHING CORE VALUES AS PART OF OUR MISSION

At St. Sebastian Catholic School, we place an emphasis on living out our CORE values celebrated in our school mission and highlighting our five CORE values:

ENGAGE • INSPIRE • GROW • LOVE • SERVE

These values were interwoven into our school mission statement and agreed upon by a number of our school constituents, including school administrators, school staff, School Advisory Committee, parents, and finally, our very own students represented by the Student Council.

We strive to teach our students to practice these CORE values in their everyday lives. Our teachers and school staff notice the way our CORE values and mission are lived in the halls, classrooms, and playground, as well as the empathy and kindness our students and staff embody in their everyday lives.

Throughout the school year, we celebrate the way our students live out these CORE values by recognizing students at our monthly CORE value assemblies. Each month, a CORE value is chosen (each CORE value is celebrated twice throughout the school year) as the value of the month. Students are nominated by teachers, school staff, and parents for exemplifying the highlighted CORE value by having a form filled out listing their name and reason they exemplify that CORE value. At the end of the month, a student from each class in every grade level is selected and honored at the monthly CORE value assembly.

Students are honored by receiving a certificate, having their photos taken, and receiving a dress down day. At the assembly, students are able to explain what these CORE values mean in various aspects of school life. For example, how does cleaning up in the cafeteria without being asked or inviting someone who doesn't have a group partner to be part of their group exemplify our CORE values.

Our CORE values truly exemplify the essence of what it means to "stand firm in our faith." Instilling these values in the lives of all our students and showing them examples of how to live out these values daily allows us to teach them lifelong character traits and values that will guide them throughout the rest of their lives. This is what it means *"to do everything in love."*



5TH GRADERS PARTICIPATE IN BIZTOWN

Every year, our 5th graders have the opportunity to "run the city" at BizTown, a Junior Achievement program that helps students learn important life skills. Our students prepared for this experience by embarking on a very important life lesson: job applications and interviewing. Students completed job applications and then interviewed for "positions" at BizTown such as reporters, bankers, cashiers, and sales associates. They prepare for this experience through daily lessons and curriculum to understand economy, the give and take of supplies and money, scarcity, the wants and needs of the people, loans and banking, and how to conduct themselves in a job, among other things. All of these are crucial life skills and help our students on the road to future success.

Junior Achievement's BizTown program combines in-class learning with the culmination of a school trip to visit Junior Achievement's simulated town, BizTown. BizTown consists of a large room which serves as a simulated town, which includes government offices, restaurants, retail stores, manufacturers, media outlets, utilities and other businesses. It even includes a town square with grass and walkways.

While at BizTown, students have the opportunity to operate banks, run restaurants, write checks, and even vote for mayor. Students are able to connect the dots between what they learn in school and the real world.

Following participation in the BizTown, students are able to:

- Discuss the roles they play as citizens, workers, and consumers in their community and relate those roles to the free enterprise system
- Discuss the importance of citizen rights and responsibilities in a community
- Demonstrate an understanding of the free enterprise system
- Build money management skills through a practical knowledge of economic concepts and banking practices
- Develop an understanding of basic business practices and responsibilities
- Display the soft skills necessary for successful participation in the world of work

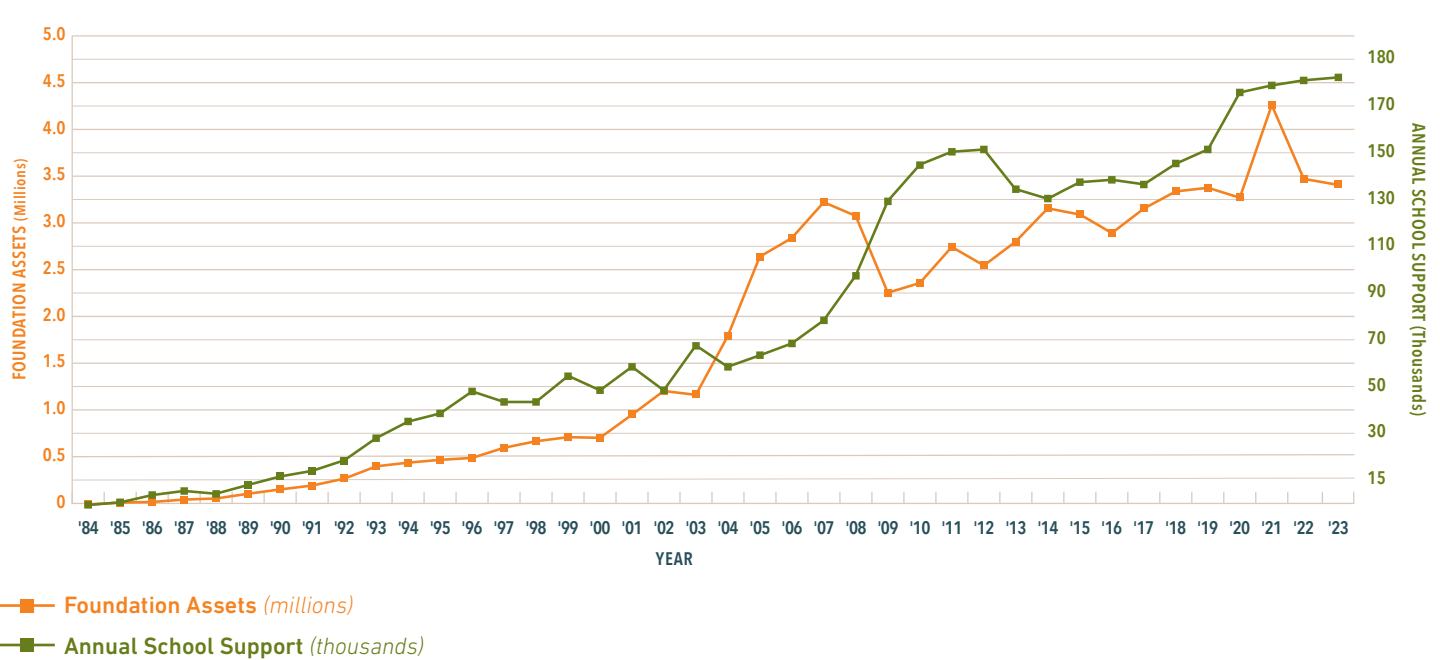
The School Foundation loaned the Parish money to help finance the tower project and the repair to the Church Hall elevator. The parish has made two of the five annual payments and the loan stands at \$149,000. The balance of the loan will be paid off as part of the Love One Another Campaign. The interest rate was set at 2% based on the recommendation of the Foundation's investment advisor. That interest rate benefits both the Foundation and the Parish.



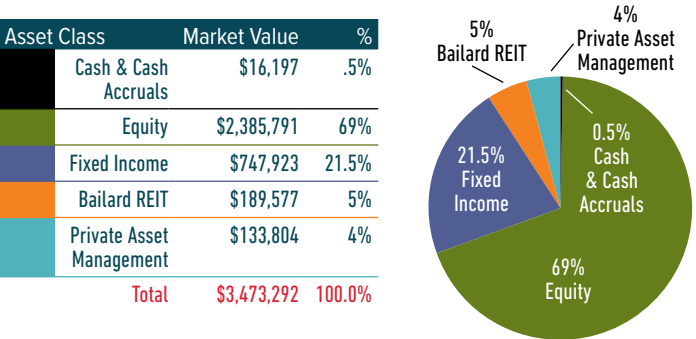

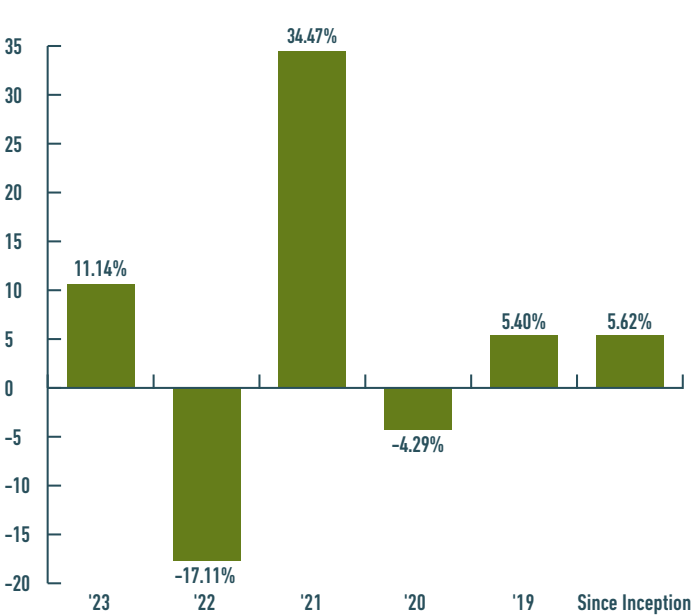
FOUNDATION ASSET AND SCHOOL SUPPORT GROWTH



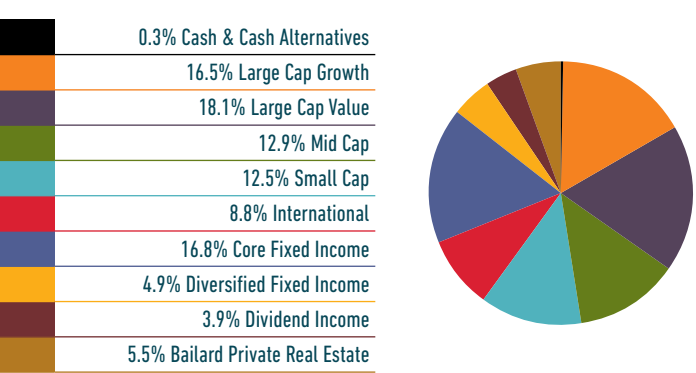
TOTAL BAIRD ASSETS: ASSET ALLOCATION
