I would like to take this opportunity to thank the *Love One Another Capital Campaign* co-chairs, CJ Murray, and Sue Olson for the tremendous job they have done. Not forgetting my Trustees Rocky Marcoux, and Audrey Ticcioni and many volunteers including the Building and Grounds committee chaired by Holly Rutenbeck and Chris Bolle.

There is so much to be thankful for this time of year, especially the incredible work of our team toward advancing the *Love One Another Campaign* at St. Sebastian.

Before Thanksgiving weekend, we had \$1,351,110 pledged for our goal of \$3,520,133 from 83 families, that's 7% of our parish families. I know for now all the families and individuals have received a letter from me asking for your participation. If you haven't received it, please kindly let us know. It's my prayer we have 100% participation. If you haven't pledged, please prayerfully consider pledging towards this campaign. We have a lot to do to restore our Church and school. It's our time to continue to maintain our beautiful Church and school that prepare the future generations.

In the letter I sent, the goal is \$3,520,133. That amount, if reached, will not be able do everything on the list because the total is \$5,762,070. If every family and every individual participated, we will be able to do everything listed. Please be counted. We are about to wrap up the campaign. Please drop your pledge card in the offertory basket or drop box in the parish office and not to the Archdiocese as we are responsible for collecting pledges. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out to co-chairs, trustees, volunteers and me. I am counting on you. Thank you all for your continued support of our parish, may the good Lord continue blessing you. Be safe and healthy and always remember the less fortunate.
