


## Dr. Philip Paul



Dr. Paul has been practicing pediatrics in Miami since 1975 when he began what is now Kings Bay Pediatrics. He has been on staff at Baptist and South Miami Hospitals since that time and has courtesy privileges at Miami Children's Hospital.

Dr. Paul is originally from The Bronx, NY and graduated from Brandeis University in Massachusetts. While at Brandeis he majored in biology and played varsity lacrosse and wrestling. After completing his undergraduate degree, Dr.

From 1974-1975, Dr. Paul was Chief Resident in Pediatrics at the University of Miami, Jackson Memorial Hospital. After completing this residency, he became the Co-Director of the Pediatric Emergency Room at Jackson Memorial Hospital until 1983. His responsibilities included teaching interns, residents, and medical students. At that time, he started his private practice in pediatrics and held both jobs.

Dr. Paul is board certified in Pediatrics and a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics. He also served as treasurer of the Greater Miami Pediatric Society for several years.

Over the years, Dr. Paul has taken care of tens of thousands of children and adolescents and mentored many medical students. He is most proud to be the "grand-pediatrician" of many children of his former patients.
