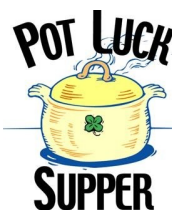

Epiphany House Blessing

Epiphany House Blessing The Epiphany commemorates the visit of the Magi to the infant Jesus, symbolizing Christ's manifestation to the world. This day is traditionally associated with blessings for homes, where families invite God's presence into their living spaces for the new year. The practice of chalking the door is a way to mark this blessing, inviting Christ's protection and grace into the home. To perform the blessing, families typically gather at their front door and use blessed chalk to inscribe the following on the doorframe:
· 20 + C + M + B + 26 (20: The first two digits of the year; C, M, B: The initials of the three Magi Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar which also stands for the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," meaning "may Christ bless this house."; 26: The last two digits of the year)
Gather all family members at the front door, making the Sign of the Cross. Beginning with a short prayer, make the sign of the cross over the door. If available, sprinkle holy water on the door and frame as a sign of blessing. Chalk the door with blessed chalk (from last year) to inscribe the year and initials on the doorframe. Finish by reciting prayers asking for God's blessing upon the home and all who enter it. You can use traditional prayers or create your own.

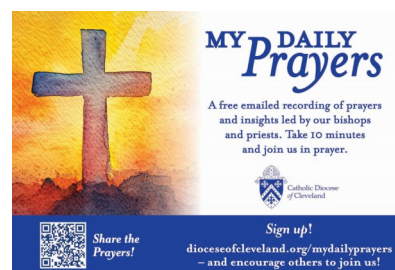
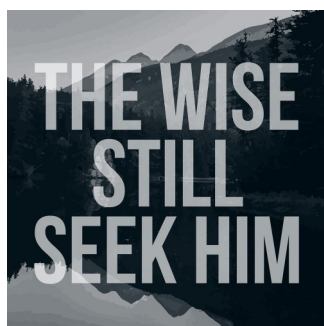

As we are off to an early start with winter weather, concerns have arisen regarding cancellations. Working together with Fr. Rod, Fr. Jim and the parishes of St Edward and St. Stephen, we have instituted a shared policy. Whenever the County of Ashland is placed under a Level 3 weather emergency (as listed on wmfd.com), during which all roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel, any scheduled Weekday, Saturday Vigil, Sunday, or Holy Day Masses during the time period of the Level 3 emergency status are canceled. Roman Catholics in the affected county, therefore, are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday/Holy Day Mass for the duration of a Level 3 weather emergency. All parish meetings and events are canceled, and the parish office will be closed. For weekday weather emergencies or Level 2 weather emergencies, if the local school district is closed, we will try to have Masses at the scheduled parishes; please use discretion on attending Mass under a Level 2 weather emergency. Parish offices will be closed and events and meetings at the parish are cancelled for the day. If Masses are canceled, Catholics are encouraged to participate in Holy Mass online; please check the bulletin for details.
