The prayer service, Christian Prayer: The Faith We Profess, will be held on Wednesday, October 22nd, at 7:00pm, in the Jack and Deb Miller Memorial Chapel at Ashland University, on the corner of College, King, and Claremont. Sponsored by the Ashland University Office of Christian Ministry, the service will offer an opportunity for Christians of every tradition to reflect, sing, pray, and profess the creedal faith that has defined what we believe since the year 325 AD. In gathering as one, we hope this celebration furthers the unity among Christians for which Jesus prayed in John 17:21, "that the world may come to believe." 
