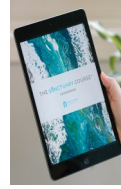

Church Directory Update



Sign-ups to have your photo taken for our new Church directory will continue after Mass this weekend. Photography sessions will be on Monday, December 1 and Tuesday December 2 from 2:00pm – 8:30pm in the Parish Hall. You may also schedule your photography appointment online by going to www.ucdir.com and clicking the appointment scheduling login on the right side, entering oh2918 in the Church Code field and entering photos in the Church Password field. Follow the prompts to schedule your family's appointment time. If you have 6 or more in your family, please use 2 consecutive time slots. The online scheduling option will only be available Monday through Friday.

2025 Mass Intentions

Linda has begun taking Mass Intention requests for the 2025 calendar year. Each person requesting Mass(es) will initially be limited to a total of 7 Mass requests. Initially only three weekend Masses may be requested in order to give everyone a fair chance to have a weekend Mass. Masses may be requested for living or deceased loved ones— Catholic or not. Each requested Mass may contain up to two names. All requests must be in writing and accompanied by stipend payment of \$10 per requested Mass. Lists and stipend payment may be dropped off at the office, mailed, or placed in a plain envelope marked "MASSES" and placed in the collection basket. No email or phone call requests will be accepted this year. As always, we will try to accommodate specific date requests, but will schedule on a first received basis. If specific dates are not available, the Mass will be scheduled as close as possible. Anyone wishing to schedule additional Masses (more than the 7 original) will be able to do so after March 1, 2024.

This weekend we celebrate two important days on the liturgical calendar: All Saints Day on Saturday (daytime) and the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls) on Sunday (and the Vigil). While it is a bit unfortunate that All Saints Day is moved out of the spotlight by falling on Saturday, it is likewise a blessing that All Souls Day gets celebrated on Sunday, overriding what would normally have been the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. So much for all the calendar notes. You might find it a bit peculiar that we are celebrating the dead on a Sunday, since every Sunday is a "little Easter" where we celebrate the Resurrection. But what a greater sign of hope is there for us and those who have gone before us than the Resurrection. There is a time for sorrow, and for many that sorrow is very real and present at this moment. This commemoration is not meant for us to put on a false smile, but it is intended to give us real hope that one day we will join the Saints and our loved ones in celebrating in the presence of our Lord.

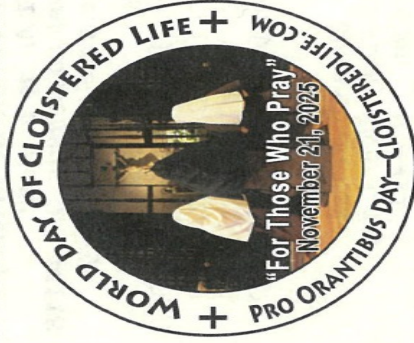
Sunday Breakfast Assistance

Pope Pius the XII instituted this worldwide event in 1953. Pope St. John Paul II expanded its celebration and encouraged Catholics to support this sublime vocation to be observed annually on the Memorial of Mary's Presentation in the Temple.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI has spoken of the tremendous value of the cloistered, contemplative life. He referred to such religious as "the heart" which provides blood to the rest of the Body of Christ. He noted that in their work and prayer, together with Christ, they are the "heart" of the Church, and in their desire for God's love they approach the ultimate goal.
