EMMAUS AND THE MASS

Emmaus might as well be Brigadoon. We hear of it in this one story—and it's only in Luke—and then it disappears. The journey to Emmaus is one of the most beloved stories about Jesus, and yet the town is prob-

ably "mythical" in the truest sense. Like so much of life, this story is about the journey, not the destination. Running away from Jerusalem and their fears, probably going home in disillusionment, two of Jesus' disciples encounter a stranger on the road who, like a rabbi, is able to help them understand their experiences using his deep knowledge of scripture. Later, sharing a meal with him, they recognize the stranger as Jesus, and they return to Jerusalem to tell the others. How like our Mass—we hear the scriptures and an explanation of them, we share a meal, and then we go out to tell the good news. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co., Inc.

Pastoral Council Elections

According to our guidelines, three at-large members are elected to the Pastoral Council every three years. As the existing members have been serving since pre-COVID, it is time to allow them to step down. Each adult parish member will be asked to nominate three (3) candidates. You may nominate yourself. Nominations will take place via paper ballots at the weekend Masses on April 29-30. The votes will be tallied, and the candidates will be contacted to confirm that they would be willing to serve. Elections will take place at the weekend Masses on May 20-21. The Pastoral Council promotes the spiritual growth of the parish community and plans ways for the parish to carry out the mission of the Church. It is a consultative body which makes recommendations to the Parish Life Coordinator on major matters concerning the life and pastoral ministry of the parish. Pastoral Council members are to communicate with the parish community and provide feedback in both directions. Meetings are held every two months (6x per year).

Morning Prayer & Chaplet




Fr. Kevin Conroy Visit

This Wednesday at 4:00pm Fr. Kevin Conroy will be back in town to celebrate Mass with us. All are welcome. A light reception will follow afterwards.


