Reflections

Are you a person who likes to take charge and take things into your own hands to make sure something is done right? If so, you are not alone. It is not of itself a bad thing, yet by doing so we can isolate ourselves from the very people that can help us out. Jesus never told us that life's events and happenings would be easy. In fact, he told us just the opposite. However, we hear in this Sunday's readings that we will find rest in Jesus when we become burdened and weary. How does that happen? Does he remove our load? Sometimes, but not normally. What he does offer to do is walk along with us, making our burden easier to bear. Our youth experienced this reality on their recent Mission Trip. They learned that by working together they could accomplish great things, which would have been quite challenging for any individual. A rope made up of several cords or strands is much stronger and holds up better than a single strand. A community working together can overcome nearly anything, whereas an individual may struggle or even fail. Keep that in mind the next time you think about attempting something on your own. Include Jesus, and maybe a friend or two.
