

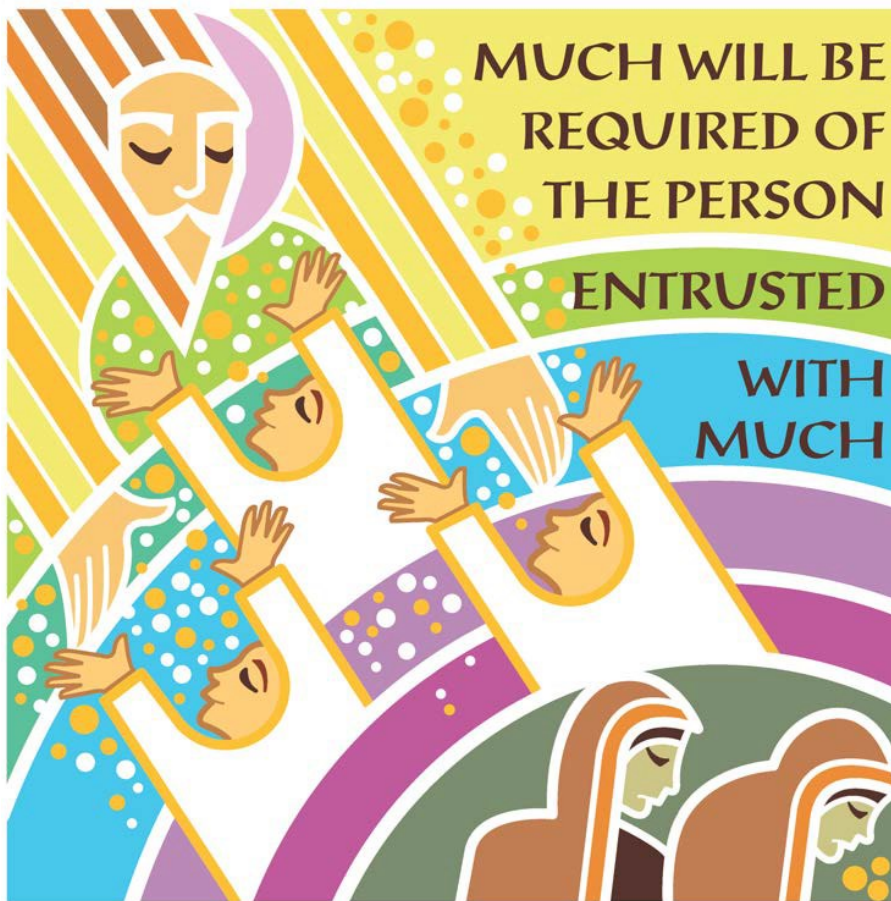

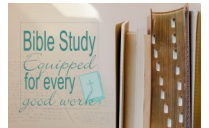

We once again hear about treasure in today's Gospel, and about being prepared. We are told that where our treasure is, there our heart will also be. We typically think of treasure as something that needs to be tucked away for safe keeping, like the farmer's grain in last Sunday's Gospel. We learn that earthly treasures do not do us any good once we leave this life. It is only the treasure that we give away that we can take with us at the end of our lives. While that sounds contradictory, so does much of what we are asked to believe. Much of Jesus' teaching went counter to the teachings of the day. So, what is it that we give away that will stay with us? Kind words, caring actions, a smile, or our time given freely go a long way to building the Kingdom of God here on earth. These kinds of treasures prepare us for when our Master arrives to take us back to our permanent home. This is not a somber thought, nor something only for those advanced in years. This is our faith, this is our belief! It is never too early to prepare for our heavenly future as we continue to go about our daily activity.


