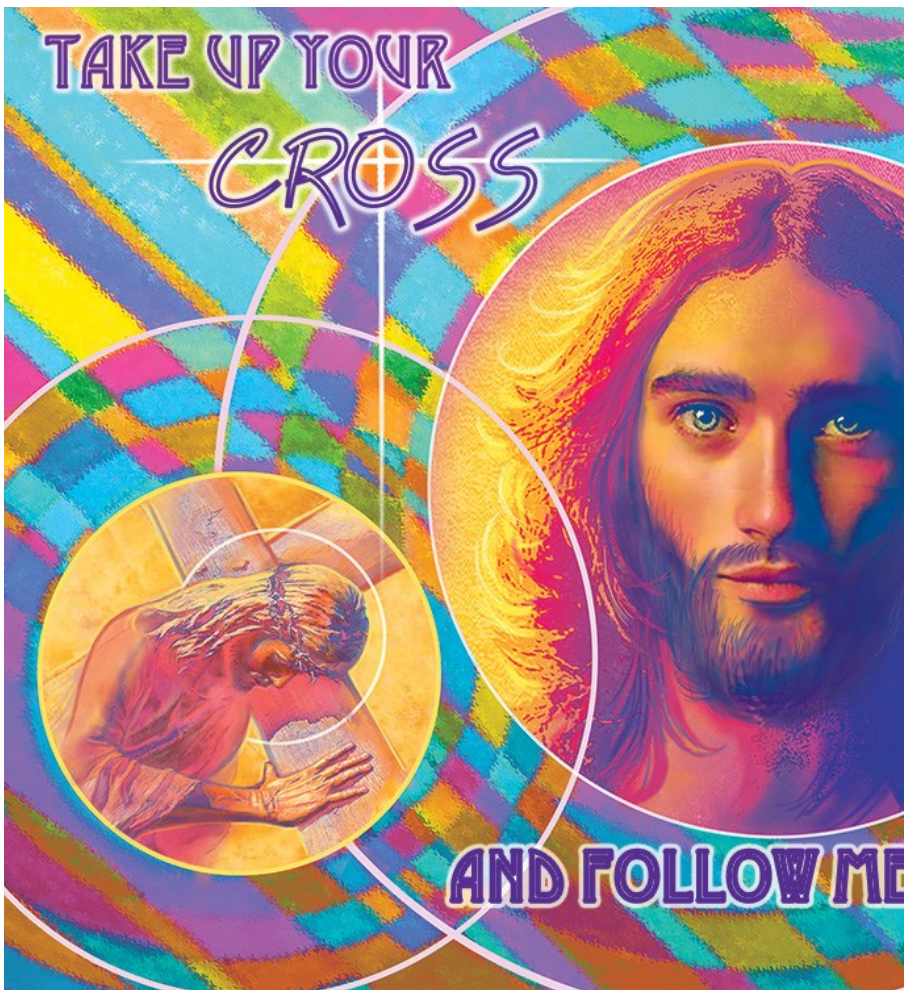

Sometimes things don't appear to us as they are. In the simplest sense, we see a reflection and mistake it for the actual object. In life things are often a bit more complicated. My reality may not align with that of another. Which one is "real" or correct? This is a bit of the struggle which Peter experienced in today's Gospel. Sometimes we believe that we are taking the right approach, doing or saying the right thing, when we are doing the opposite. We see this repeatedly in society, in our daily lives; it seems to be everywhere. We know that our ways are not always God's way. So how can we become better acquainted with God's way? The first step is to set aside the notion that my way must be right. This will help us in our relationships with others and create room for God to work in our lives. Continuing to spend time in the Word, either by reading or listening, and then taking some quiet time to reflect is a good second step. Then repeat again and again as necessary.

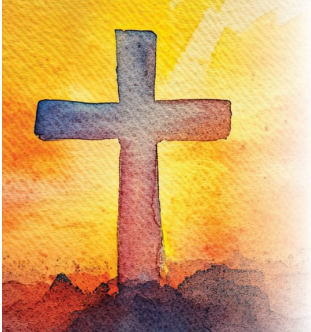
