There are many traditions and practices in the Catholic faith which sometimes need clarifying. Note, that I am talking about traditions with a small "t", not the Tradition which is part of our faith. One of these is the practice of ringing bells during Mass, especially during the consecration. This tradition dates to at least the thirteenth century. With the celebration of Mass in Latin, it was sometimes hard for the faithful to follow the parts of the Mass, as they would be praying the rosary or other devotional prayers. The priest often recited the prayers in a lower tone which made them hard to hear, and the design of many churches made it hard to see. The bells were rung at significant times during the Mass to alert the congregation, such as when the Holy Spirit was being called down and the bread and wine were being transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. But moving forward to the current day when Mass is said in the vernacular and most churches offer good visibility of the altar, there is still value in ringing bells to offer a joyful praise as during the Gloria on Easter. The practice is left as an option to each parish and is not dictated
