Reading, studying, and applying the Word may require sacrifices, but the reward of knowing your Savior better and living a life pleasing to God is worth it." Our High Calling - "We are members of one another" (Ephesians 4:25c). "Now he who plants and he who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers" (1 Corinthians 3:8b). Here are three vital truths: One, as members of one family, we are called to work in unity and with interdependence. Two, though we work together, a future reward will be according to each person's individual labor. Three, though God can accomplish His work in the world in any number of ways, He has called us to be working partners with Him, calling us "fellow workers." Our sin separates us from the life of God, but God offers each of us a great gift: full pardon. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23). The question to be asked is, "Would you like to receive the gift of God today?" Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!
