Grief within the Gratitude

The Christmas season is perhaps the most joyous season of the year for Christians. We are reminded of God's great gift to us in the gift of His Son and the hope we have as believers through the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. We sing "Joy to the world, the Lord has come" and many other hymns and songs. Yet, some are not only filled with joy and gratitude but are reminded of loved ones who are no longer among us. Thankfully, as believers, we can navigate grief with gratitude. The Scriptures give us hope!

Christians understand grief is a component of the blessings promised in Scripture. Here is one example. Before giving His life for us, Jesus told those who believed in Him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice. You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy" (John 16:20). Their joy arrived on Resurrection morning!

Even so, in this season of glad tidings and joy it can still be difficult for those processing deep loss to find a way to express those emotions. What can be done to make the season as joyful as possible, while acknowledging the reality of pain people carry in their hearts? Commit yourself to listening well is a great start. We can also pray with those who grieve. When we do, we will often hear things not said in public. This will deepen our understanding of one another.

No one should suffer in silence. Let us, "Bear one another's burdens and so fulfill the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2). The highest virtue to be held among us is love (John 13:34; 1 Corinthians 13:13). "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law" (Romans 13:10). Rather than fear the expression of another's grief, let's show the love of Christ through attentive listening and responsive prayer. These are gifts to the one who needs to be heard.
