

Amos, the Prophet from Tekoa

This summer, Dallas Myers will be teaching from the prophetic book of Amos. The setting is in the eighth century BC during the reign of the evil king of the Northern Kingdom, Jeroboam II. Amos, a shepherd from the small village of Tekoa, eleven miles south of Jerusalem, is the only prophet from Judah who prophesies against the Northern Kingdom. He predicts the downfall of six surrounding enemy nations, after which he addresses the sins of Judah, and finally the Northern Kingdom, a warning of divine judgment.

Having abandoned Jehovah-God, Jeroboam II promoted a false religion, thus Amos castigates the priests and socialite women, who presented offerings to gain favor, which God did not accept. They oppressed the poor and justice was lacking. Amos ends his book with a message of hope. In chapter nine, he predicts restoration, prosperity, and the return of the people of Israel to their land, promised as an eternal possession.

Dallas will use his extensive knowledge of Old Testament prophecy to teach how the message of Amos applies to the Middle East situation today and to every believer. The class will be in the gym from 10:30-11:30, after the fellowship time from 10:00-10:30. Please join us in this exciting study—you will not be disappointed!

Perception is not always reality. A pastor once intervened in a situation he believed was treating him and others unfairly. After others helped him reassess the situation, he arrived at a different conclusion, and he observed the following: "We get caught up in ourselves, we get triggered, we forget others, and we forget the Lord." Scripture reminds us, the first to plead his case seems right, until another comes and examines him" (Proverbs 18:17). Adam Clarke restates this: "Any man may, in the first instance, make out a fair tale, because he has the choice of circumstances and arguments. When the neighbor comes and searches him, he examines all . . . and brings out truth and fact."





The Apostles Peter and Paul believed and taught the same gospel message—Salvation is by faith through grace alone. Both men were commended by the early church and known for being committed to the same gospel message (Peter to the Jews and Paul to the Gentiles). Yet, an open conflict between them occurred at time it would be least expected: over a meal of friendship and fellowship. This is one of the tensest episodes in Scripture. Let's see what we can learn from Galatians 2:11-16.
