Do you have someone that you listen to on the radio or online to get into God's Word? We all should have someone who is discipling us in one way or another. I have a guy I like to listen to online for his Bible classes. He likes to dig into God's Word, all while pointing out the funny and interesting parts of Scripture that are present in the text if you look a bit deeper. This is the case with so many things in the Bible as we look deeper. I was listening to his lesson about Abraham being visited by God, and then God informing Abraham what was going to happen with Sodom and Gomorrah. He then went into Lot's side of the story inside of Sodom. It is a fascinating tale where Abraham is still living in a tent out in the wilderness away from society, and Lot has moved in and become a leader in Sodom and started to integrate with this corrupt society. Abraham is waiting on God in the middle of nowhere, and Lot is living life with friends and family, and things are happening all around him. It was probably very exciting with festivals and fun, but also a place that was full of sin. The guy I listen to pointed out that at anytime people get together into bigger groups, like cities, there is more sin. It makes sense as the more people there are, the greater the chance for sin to happen, and then include others in the sin. What is hard about this passage—about Lot—is that it makes it look like Lot is almost as messy as the rest of Sodom, but 2 Peter gives us a glimpse into the heart of Lot in this moment:

2 Peter 2:6-8 "...if he condemned the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah by burning them to ashes, and made them an example of what is going to happen to the ungodly; and if he rescued Lot, a righteous man, who was distressed by the depraved conduct of the lawless (for that righteous man, living among them day after day, was tormented in his righteous soul by the lawless deeds he saw and heard)"

We find out from this passage that Lot was not a perfect man, but was still committed to the Lord and the Lord's concepts rather than Sodom's, and was considered righteous. The one sad thing is that Lot stayed in this city until God's angels dragged him and his family out of the city. They had a life there, and they realized that they would lose everything.

Please read Genesis 18 and 19 to see what other nuggets of gold you can find in this fascinating and crazy story. Just because it is summer, please do not give up the reading of God's Word, but take this time to listen, learn, and grow further than you have before!
