How often do you read something on your phone and it just seems like strange information or it doesn't make as much sense as it really should? Have you ever looked up a story only to find that it isn't actually real? I had this happen with a story I saw on social media in the office one day. Kaylee quickly pointed out that it sounded fake, and so away I went to investigate the information, because when Kaylee thinks a story sounds off, she is not typically wrong about it! Sure enough, the story was fake and had been exaggerated, and the details were not lining up. The real story was much simpler and not what social media had made of it: blown it up, added details, changed things, and made it more over the top than it was in any way.

Our American culture tends to do this. So it begs the question: How do you know that what you read online is real? Even on a well established website? What about on Wikipedia? We all tend to know that Wikipedia is going to be rampant with lies and just messy information that someone in their basement wrote because they thought it was funny. Our whole culture is under attack with understanding if something is true or not. It makes me wonder if people in 50 years will even know accurate things about World War I and II. *Do we know them accurately today? It makes you wonder. This was a question even in the Biblical times of the New Testament. There were lots of gods (pantheons of them) with a claim to being real and true. So how do you know that the God of the Bible is real and true? You have to do what I did on the internet with that story I read – research it. Study out the facts of the matter. This is what people in the New Testament would do if they were wise:*

Acts 17:10 “As soon as it was night, the believers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea. On arriving there, they went to the Jewish synagogue. **11** Now the Berean Jews were of more noble character than those in Thessalonica, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. **12** As a result, many of them believed, as did also a number of prominent Greek women and many Greek men.”

These Bereans were not just hearing Paul, but were going to the Old Testament Scriptures to ascertain if what Paul was saying added up with what God had been teaching the Jews over the centuries. They realized that things did add up and were legitimate. Paul taught this to Timothy as well:

2 Timothy 3:14 “But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, **15** and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. **16** All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, **17** so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.”

Paul encouraged Timothy by reminding him that Scripture is from the Lord and is useful in so many areas of life. How can you teach it, rebuke with it, correct others with it, and train in it if you do not know it? Search the Scriptures daily and you will find that God is real and true and active and working. You need to search the Bible daily to see and understand who God is so that you are well equipped and realize that He isn't some made up figure like Zeus or Odin, but is alive, active, and working every day. Search the Scriptures to know God more and find out everything you can about Him and so you know the truth of the story.
