When Your Child Is Not Feeling Well

Medicines

Medicines will be given to your child only with the written authorization of a parent, (forms available in the classroom.) Prescription drugs must be in their original containers. Over the counter medication should be labeled with first and last name, expiration date, and manufacturer instructions; and require a doctor's note. All medications will be kept in a locked box in the classroom or a locked box in the refrigerator.

Sick During the Day

Children should not be brought to school if they have any of the following:

***Fever (101 or higher) Children may return to school when they have been fever- free for 24 hours without the aid of medication.**

We use an auxiliary thermometer (under the arm). If your child has a fever of 101 using this thermometer, your child will be cared for in a private area and a parent will be called to pick them up.

Children are to be picked up in a timely manner.

- **Diarrhea** within the last 24 hours – (2 or more loose or watery stools)
(To return to school, your child must be Diarrhea free for 24 hours without aid of medication)
- **Red watery or draining eye(s)** - To return to school, your child must be treated with doctor prescribed eye drops.
- **Lice** - Your child can return to school after initial hair treatment is given
- **Skin rash or lesions** - To return to school your child must be fever free for 24 hours without aid of medication and no open lesions
- **Vomiting** - children can return when vomit free for 24 hours

Children will be sent home if any of the above mentioned illness occurs while here in the ACC to assure all children are taken care of.

Allergies

Asbury Children's Center has a policy to ensure the safety of children with allergies. Please advise the director of any allergies your child may have so that appropriate actions can be taken for his/her safety and comfort.
