# April's Big Project = New Floor in the Parish Hall

That's right. We have finished the painting and the next step is to completely redo the floor. We'll begin that work right after Easter so that it can be completed by the Arts Festival on May 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Once that is done we'll focus on updating the lighting and replacing the kitchen shutter door with an electric door.



In May we'll begin working on the Playground and finalizing designs for our other Phase I projects.

# Stations of the Cross Every Friday during Lent at Noon.

On Wednesday evenings, we invite children & youth to join us for our own Lenten mid-week study. Come for supper, and then we'll go to the Children's Chapel to learn about the power of change & transformation. We'll look at stories of people from the Bible; make personal connections and dig into discussion with one another; and create fun, related activities as we learn together each week! **We still have two more weeks, April 2**nd **and April 9**th!

On Palm Sunday, we will again have a long line of acolytes processing carrying palms. The outdoor stations of the cross is back again for Good Friday. (As usual, our plan for inclement weather is to have it in the

undercroft.) Come to the South door anytime on April 18<sup>th</sup> between 10:00 and 5:00 to begin walking the stations. We will be gathering different beads at each cross that we will string together as we follow Jesus' journey to the resurrection.

Easter 2025 happens to fall on **3**<sup>rd</sup> **Sunday**, April 20<sup>th</sup>, so no one will want to miss out on the joy that's *blooming* during that time! Join us in singing "Jesus Paid it All" during the worship service and be sure to hang around for egg-hunting festivities after. Our **Easter Egg Hunt will follow 3**<sup>rd</sup> **Sunday Family Worship service**, so go to the Parish Hall for instructions before the fun!

While we recognize that Lent, Holy Week, and Easter can be a busy time for all families, we hope & pray that Holy Trinity will be *the* place for your kids and youth to grow together with Jesus

# Spring Clean-up Day Saturday, April 12<sup>th</sup>, 9am



Bring your rakes, gloves, brooms, and wheelbarrows/trash barrels, time to clean up all the pine needles & cones to prepare for the Arts Festival! We will also be doing general clean up around the outside of the building and pruning the rose gardens.



You can do both. Your donations to Holy Trinity and other charitable organizations are no longer deductible when the standard deduction option is taken. You may still be able to receive the benefits!

Payments made directly from your IRA to Holy Trinity will <u>not be counted as taxable income</u>. So if you can't deduct the contribution, this provision <u>removes the donation from taxable income</u>, giving you the same benefit as the deduction.

You must start taking RMDs by April 1 of the year after you turn 73. Let's say you celebrated your 73rd birthday on July 4, 2025. You must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) by April 1. You'll have to take another RMD by Dec. 31 and by Dec. 31 each year after that. (For tax year 2022, the age for starting RMDs was 72).

Also, people do not have to wait until they are 73 to make those gifts. They are REQUIRED once they're 73, but they are allowed to make the same type of gift at age 70 1/2 which is called a QCD, Qualified Charitable Distribution.

What to do? Contact your IRA provider and arrange for your donation to Holy Trinity to be made from your required minimum distribution. The check must go <u>directly</u> from the IRA fiduciary to Holy Trinity in order to qualify as <u>non-taxable</u> income. 



### 40 Years of Ringing!

Forty years ago on Palm Sunday, Holy Trinity heard the first strains of handbell music during the service. Six young teens, mostly 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> graders played "Were You There". The original 3 octave set of handbells was purchased by Bill and Diane Krueger as they felt that bells would be a good way for the teens to be active in the church music program. The first six ringers were Malia (Perkins) Pope, Jeanne (Dickinson) Gaertig, Jean Bates, Alisa Shonka, Charles Cumming, and Matt Krueger. Jeanne and Malia still ring today with the adult group!!! From the original 6, the program grew to 2 teen handbell choirs---Middle School and High School---with around 24 ringers a year from the late-1980s to around 2005. Besides providing service music, these bell choirs were active in the community with performances in other churches, at the State Capitol Tree Lighting Ceremony, twice in the Star City Parade, at the Children's Museum, with the East High orchestra, and by attending MANY teen handbell festivals. Today, with a smaller program, the youth play bells a couple of times a year.

# Church of the Holy Trinity Vestry Minutes February 17, 2025 – 7PM via Zoom

**Opening Prayer** Father Clay led us in prayer.

**Treasurer's Report**: A **Statement of Activities** (date range January 1, 2025, through January 30, 2025) was available along with the **Statement of Financial Position Comparison** (as of January 30, 2025). Also included was a **Statement of Cash Flows** (January 1, 2025, through January 30, 2025). Along with the numbers, the notes included explained the various income and expenses as the actual numbers related to the budgeted numbers.

To transfer \$900,000 from the quasi-endowment fund to instruments that carry less risk as resolved by the vestry at the board retreat, Jeanne reported that the financial committee had met with Edward Jones, Vanguard, and UBT to determine what instruments were available to meet this goal. The financial committee had decided to move the funds to UBT STFIT. After vestry discussion Mike Cover moved to diversify the funds and split the \$900,000 between Edward Jones and UBT STFIT. Jeanne seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Rector's Report** Father Clay shared that the parish hall upgrades will be the first improvements we will see taking shape. The children's ministry team is working on playground ideas. As soon as preliminary plans are available the vestry will have a chance to look at them.

An asbestos abatement company has looked at Holy Trinity's buildings and given us a written report. It will be reviewed by the master plan team and shared with the architect for consideration as we move forward with the Phase 1 project.

A formal proposal for architectural design services for Phase 1 Renovation of the Church of the Holy Trinity in Lincoln, Nebraska was presented to the vestry from Sinclair Hille. Liz Bavitz was available to answer questions posed by the vestry. To avoid a conflict of interest, Liz left the meeting as the vestry further discussed the contract as presented.

Matt Lundak moved that Holy Trinity retain Sinclair Hille Architects for Phase 1 of the Master Plan as submitted with the "not to exceed" base contract. Karla Bahm seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**Sr. Warden Report:** Corey had no formal report. He encouraged the vestry members to be aware of potential challenges some parishioners may be experiencing because of the changes taking place throughout the country.

**Jr. Warden Report:** Matt had no report.

**Closing Prayer:** Father Clay closed the meeting with a prayer written recently by Dan Coffman.

**Opening Prayer** Father Clay opened the meeting with prayer.

**Bible Study** The Vestry reflected on Isaiah 55:3-9. The group identified key concepts: God invites us into a relationship with him, he welcomes us while clarifying the difference between God and humans, he commits to us recognizing that we are only human and will make mistakes in our movement along the path of our life-long journey, he gives us choice followed with forgiveness as we inevitably make missteps. He gives us purpose "...witness to the peoples, ...leader and commander for the peoples." Most importantly this is a biblical Old Testament passage of great hope requiring our faith in God.

**Treasurer's Report**: A **Statement of Activities** (date range February 1, 2025, through February 28, 2025) was available along with the **Statement of Financial Position Comparison** (as of February 28, 2025). Also included was a **Summary of Restricted Net Assets** (February 1, 2025, through February 28, 2025) and a **Statement of Financial Position Comparison** (February 28, 2025). Along with these regular monthly reports was **Vanguard Statement of Activities Endowment & Columbarium Fund YTD Activity Through February 28, 2025.** A Monthly Executive Review accompanied the fiscal reports. As stated in the Executive Review, Holy Trinity is off to a great start for 2025!

Three Signatory Resolutions were presented individually. All three were presented in a motion by Jeanne Gaertig and seconded by Father Clay with unanimous approval by the vestry. Resolutions of: Union Bank and Trust Signatories, Edward Jones Signatories, Vanguard Signatories Resolution

Prior to the vote a discussion was held relating to the processes and procedures used as funds are accessed and moved for use. Holy Trinity has written documents that outline present procedures. Jeanne Gaertig will send those along for all vestry members to have on hand for their perusal.

**Rector's Report:** Father Clay gave an update and review on the Phase 1 Master Plan. Liz Bavitz supplied an additional narrative and a couple of handouts showing projected timelines for the projects. We then accompanied Father Clay to locations where action is taking place explaining the "what is happening" and "the why it is happening at this time" as related to the entire Phase 1 of the Master Plan.

A fresh pew card has been designed and was handed out. Additional spaces for placement of these materials are being developed so that each pew will have multiple slots rather than the present two.

Materials from the Holy Trinity Arts Festival committee were handed out with encouragement for us to share far and wide the information about the upcoming May 3<sup>rd</sup> event.

Father Clay shared that May 18<sup>th</sup> will be Confirmation Sunday. He is exploring options to combine the 10:30 a.m. service and the 1:30 p.m. Sudanese service with a potluck. At this time eleven students are slated for confirmation equally divided representing both congregation attendance times.

**Sr. Warden Report:** No report. Corey reflected on the fact that five years ago the Vestry officially offered the position of rector to Father Clay, the decision made sooner than had been anticipated. Unknown at the time of the offer, the country closed down shortly thereafter due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Jr. Warden Report:** No report.

**Closing Prayer:** Roxane led us in a prayer of gratitude to close the meeting.
