## **Holy Trinity Took Some Huge Steps of Faith in 2025**

**Master Plan Phase I** - Holy Trinity undertook a \$1.2 million project to upgrade infrastructure, renovate existing facilities, and add new ministry space such as All Saints Hall, the playground and Children's Chapel. All of this is to make our church stronger for the future. Funding was provided by the Legacy Society Fund and other committed donors. We'll be wrapping it all up by end of Spring 2026.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Worship** – In 2025 we introduced our 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday worship. It's designed to stay true to our traditional liturgy, while making it accessible for people of all ages. Every 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday we see children learn to love our traditions while helping our grownups experience God with new eyes. 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday attendance in ALL ages has gone up by almost 20%

**Youth Service Trip** – For the first time in over a decade, we took 20 youth and adults to Santee, NE to serve at the Church of Our Most Merciful Savior on the Lakota Sioux reservation. All of us experienced what servant leadership really looks like.

**Diocese of Nebraska Partnership** – Our Diocese has seen that God is at work in this church and recognized the possibilities for real impact. In 2025, the Clarkson Episcopal Foundation awarded us a \$90,000 grant to help support the staff we needed to grow ministry. For 2026 they have approved another \$70,000 grant.

**Plus So Much More** - All of this on top of the ministry that you are always doing: Arts Festival, Lenten programs, Easter worship, Confirmation worship with Anglo and Sudanese congregations, VBS, Kids Camps, Parents Night Out, Seniors Ministry, Outreach, Youth group and summer camp, men's ministry, confirmation, Music ministry, Bells choir, Dinner Circles, Bridge, and on and on.

**THANK YOU for making 2025 an extraordinary year!** I can't imagine being in any other parish than Holy Trinity.

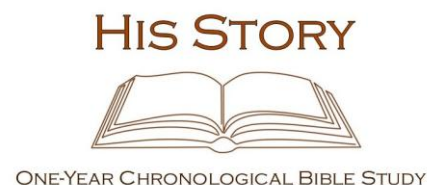
We will be reviewing our Annual Report for 2025 and electing new vestry and delegates for the new year.

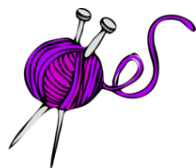

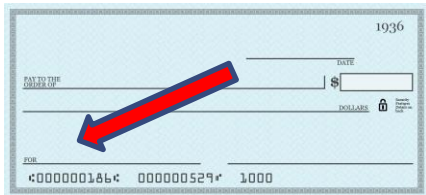

### Helping Your Church AND Yourself

You can do both. Your donations to Holy Trinity and other charitable organizations are no longer deductible when the standard deduction option is taken. You may still be able to receive the benefits!

Payments made directly from your IRA to Holy Trinity will not be counted as taxable income. So if you can't deduct the contribution, this provision removes the donation from taxable income, giving you the same benefit as the deduction.

You must start taking RMDs by April 1 of the year after you turn 73. Let's say you celebrated your 73rd birthday on July 4, you must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) by April 1 . You'll have to take another RMD by Dec. 31 and by Dec. 31 each year after that. (For tax year 2022, the age for starting RMDs was 72).

Also, people do not have to wait until they are 73 to make those gifts. They are REQUIRED once they're 73, but they are allowed to make the same type of gift at age 70 1/2 which is called a QCD, Qualified Charitable Distribution.

What to do? Contact your IRA provider and arrange for your donation to Holy Trinity to be made from your required minimum distribution. The check must go directly from the IRA fiduciary to Holy Trinity in order to qualify as non-taxable income. Contact Nicole Sherer or Rebecca Schultz at the church office for more information.
