What are you asking us to Pledge to?

Our Pledges are to the **Operating Budget**. That budget pays for all personnel, utilities, maintenance, programs, and administrative costs. It keeps the lights on, ministry happening and the building maintained.

Who's paying for the Master Plan?

75% of the cost of these new facility improvements are being funded from the Holy Trinity Legacy Fund. Other parishioners have also made gifts to cover the rest of the expenses out of their generosity.

When will you ask us to give to the Master Plan?

We do not plan on doing a capital campaign at this time. There may be ways that folks can make a contribution for something specific, but God is providing for the Master Plan.

That Frees us up to Focus on our Operating Budget

Our goal now is to grow into that stretch budget over the next three years. **By Faith**, we are trusting that God will provide through you and me. If what God is doing in this place feeds your soul and gives you hope for our future, I'd like to ask you to make a pledge to the Operating Budget.

Backpacks and Big Hearts August 26, 2025

Before many of us finished our first cup of coffee, a faithful crew from Holy Trinity Church was already in motion—packing food-filled backpacks with care, laughter and love. It was a summer Monday morning ritual fueled by kindness: these bags made their way to kiddos across our community, helping provide nourishing meals when school was out for the summer.



At first, they weren't sure what to expect. One church member and longtime volunteer, Ron, remembers the uncertainty clearly. He joined the church four years ago on Christmas Eve, and the following spring, Father Clay approached him with an opportunity to help with the Food Bank's BackPack Program. That conversation became the starting point of something quite a bit bigger than he imagined. For the last several years, volunteers from Holy Trinity Church have packed nearly all the backpacks for the Food Bank of Lincoln's Summer BackPack Program in Lincoln.

This summer, that meant 193 bags each week—an impressive total of 1,544 bags for the summer season!

With years of experience, their Monday morning routine was second nature. No instructions needed. The group—once just comprised of about six people, now close to 20—moved through the process with an unspoken coordination that came from a shared purpose, camaraderie and experience.

"It's kind of like a dairy farm," Ron said with a smile.
"Where the cows just know they have to be milked at a certain time—they walk in, they already know what station to go to and what to do."



Each backpack was filled with nutritious, shelf-stable food meant to last until Monday. Each one was packed with intention.

"We just want to do our part to help make it easier on the weekends for the kids," Ron said. "We are here to help those in need."

And when all the packing and sorting is done, there's a lasting sense of fulfillment—the kind that stays with you long after you leave. "It's going to be beneficial for somebody down the road," he said. "It's pretty much an honor on our part."

When asked what he would say if he could speak directly to the children or families receiving the backpacks?

He smiled and said gently, "Bon appétit."


have a favorite soup, you just love - feel free to bring it!) Beer and wine will be provided as well as tea, coffee, and soda. If you would like something different - please bring it along.





Helping Your Church AND Yourself

You can do both. Your donations to Holy Trinity and other charitable organizations are no longer deductible when the standard deduction option is taken. You may still be able to receive the benefits!

Payments made directly from your IRA to Holy Trinity will <u>not be counted as taxable income</u>. So if you can't deduct the contribution, this provision <u>removes the donation from taxable income</u>, giving you the same benefit as the deduction.

You must start taking RMDs by April 1 of the year after you turn 73. Let's say you celebrated your 73rd birthday on July 4, 2025. You must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) by April 1. You'll have to take another RMD by Dec. 31 and by Dec. 31 each year after that. (For tax year 2022, the age for starting RMDs was 72).

Also, people do not have to wait until they are 73 to make those gifts. They are REQUIRED once they're 73, but they are allowed to make the same type of gift at age 70 1/2 which is called a QCD, Qualified Charitable Distribution.

What to do? Contact your IRA provider and arrange for your donation to Holy Trinity to be made from your required minimum distribution. The check must go <u>directly</u> from the IRA fiduciary to Holy Trinity in order to qualify as <u>non-taxable</u> income. Church of The Holy Trinity Vestry Minutes October 20, 2025

The Vestry of Holy Trinity met October 20, 2025, in the church Memorial Room. Present were Father Clay Lein; Senior Warden Corey Wasserburger; Junior Warden Matt Lundak; Treasurer Jeanne Gaertig; Vestry Members Michael Cover, Joe Fox, Roxane Graham, Don Rabbe and Bob Winter. Excused Absent were Clerk Mary Vaughan and Vestry Members Liz Bavitz and Karla Bahm.

Father Clay called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. and gave an opening prayer. The Vestry then reflected on Psalm 22: 22-31. The Treasurer's Report was discussed and accepted as submitted.

A Phase One Project Cost Summary was presented by Father Clay. It noted the contract amount approved by the Vestry and the actual cost to date. It was noted that Hazardous Material Abatement is completed and presented expenditures in the eight other primary categories. Some construction-related damages to the Sunday School Craft Room were shown to the Vestry. The contractor will restore the room at no extra cost.

The Vestry will begin considering Plan 2026 and budget. The Finance Committee is working on an audit of past and current expenditures in anticipation of budget preparation. Father Clay noted the need to focus on catching up with what God has been doing and strengthening the church for the future. This will include raising volunteer and leadership engagement; growing ministry without adding staff; adding Invite, Welcome and Connect systems with volunteer staff; focus more on discipleship and connections; Finish Phase One project elements by Summer and continuing to revamp small church systems.

Wasserburger noted the current Vestry has three months remaining prior to the adoption of the budget and Annual Parish Meeting. It is important to remember the hard work of the staff and finance committee as well as considering what Vestry actions will be needed. The budget is a vision and he encouraged the members to ask questions, share their wisdom, and think about what action will be needed.

Father Clay led the Vestry to view the construction progress in the Children's Chapel and invited members to sign their names on the walls before they are covered with wall board. This is in keeping with the listing of names to be added in All Saints Hall. He also distributed Prayer Cards for This Season of Our Life asking members to daily pray for God's guidence in stewardship and in finding a Children's Ministry Leader.

Following a closing prayer by Lundak, the meeting adjourned at 8:03pm.
