## **Holy Trinity is Walking “By Faith”**

Over the last few years we have been walking **By Faith**. We have been taking bold steps to follow God’s call. You’ve been doing that here, and the new life you see is the direct result of that faith.

So far this year we’ve grown by more than 15% in Average Sunday Attendance (ASA). Our 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Family Worship has attracted new families and young people. We average more than 20 children each month – many of them new to Holy Trinity. Our giving is up. Our engagement is up. More people are connecting to God and to one another. That is because you are walking **By Faith**.



The most visible sign of that is the work being done to renovate and improve our campus for the next generation. Previous generations poured themselves into building and sustaining these amazing facilities. The Master Plan is how we are leaving them better for the future. All of this will run us over \$1 million, but God has provided that through our Legacy Fund Endowment.

**We have not done a Capital Campaign for this because the real ASK is for you to support our Operating Budget.**

Your financial offerings to the Operating Budget will allow us to sustain our ministry growth. This budget supports the staff and the programs that are reaching new people and serving those who are here today.

That’s what we are asking of you. Please consider making a pledge to our Operating Budget. The diocese has been helping with a 3 year declining grant that gives us the time to grow into our size. But each year we need to step up our own internal support.

If you can help us to do that, please consider taking your own step of faith and pledging. Living **By Faith** is the most exciting adventure we will ever have. And the blessings are worth far more than the sacrifice.

For that reason, the Vestry has decided to name the new west entry “**All Saints Hall.**” It will be dedicated to all who have been a part of this church, past, present, and future. As the main doorway into the worship life of our parish, it seems only right that we dedicate it to God’s glory and in honor of ALL who make it possible.

To make that happen, we need more than a brass plaque. Our architects are working on ways to list the names of everyone who is part of the Holy Trinity story. We are looking through our records to compile names, but we need your help.

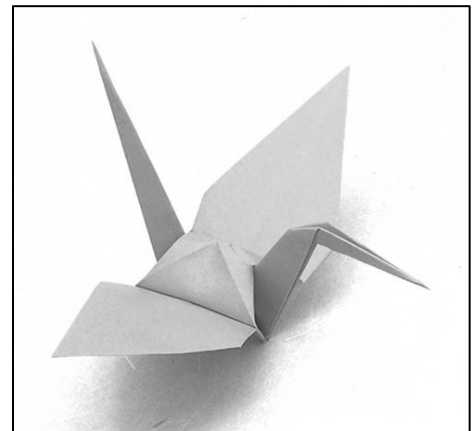
This joint effort is an ancient form of prayer. As many hands work, our hope for peace is lifted up as one voice.

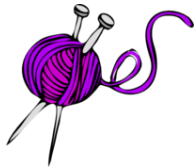

The BEST CHOICE labels are processed and the rebate distributed by the Outreach Committee.

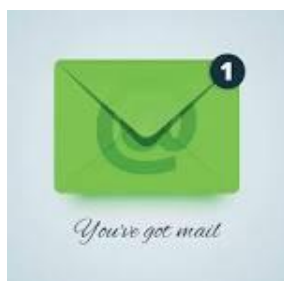

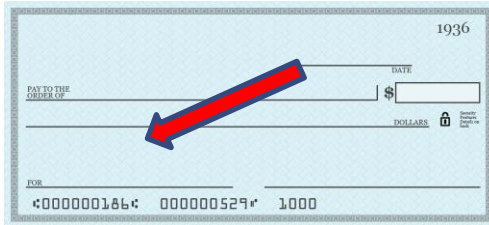

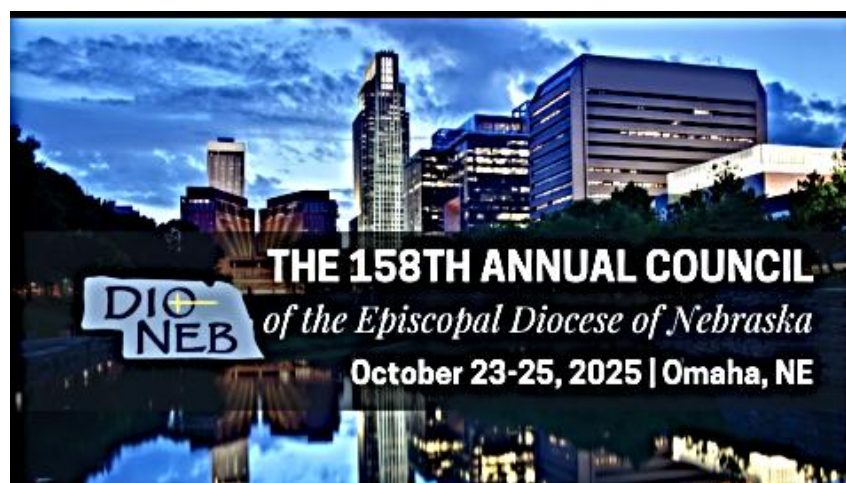

### Helping Your Church AND Yourself

You can do both. Your donations to Holy Trinity and other charitable organizations are no longer deductible when the standard deduction option is taken. You may still be able to receive the benefits!

Payments made directly from your IRA to Holy Trinity will not be counted as taxable income. So if you can't deduct the contribution, this provision removes the donation from taxable income, giving you the same benefit as the deduction.

You must start taking RMDs by April 1 of the year after you turn 73. Let's say you celebrated your 73rd birthday on July 4, 2025. You must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) by April 1. You'll have to take another RMD by Dec. 31 and by Dec. 31 each year after that. (For tax year 2022, the age for starting RMDs was 72).

Also, people do not have to wait until they are 73 to make those gifts. They are REQUIRED once they're 73, but they are allowed to make the same type of gift at age 70 1/2 which is called a QCD, Qualified Charitable Distribution.

What to do? Contact your IRA provider and arrange for your donation to Holy Trinity to be made from your required minimum distribution. The check must go directly from the IRA fiduciary to Holy Trinity in order to qualify as non-taxable income. Contact Nicole Sherer or Rebecca Schultz at the church office for more information.
