### YOU Are Part of Our New "All Saints Hall"

One year ago, we were imagining what our facilities needed to be for the future. One year later, we are well into that work. I'm awestruck at how far we've come. God is doing something extraordinary here. He is using the gifts of those who've gone before, with those here now, to build a stronger Holy Trinity. It's an honor to be part of it all.

When most churches build something, they invite people to make donations to honor loved ones. Names are put on a brass plaque to say thanks. That's not bad, but it seems insufficient for us. It's taken more than just a few donors to get us here. Everyone who calls Holy Trinity home has made this future possible. ALL our names deserve to be on our new space and to be honored.

For that reason, the Vestry has decided to name the new west entry "All Saints Hall." It will be dedicated to all who have been a part of this church, past, present, and future. As the main doorway into the worship life of our parish, it seems only right that we dedicate it to God's glory and in honor of ALL who make it possible.

To make that happen, we need more than a brass plaque. We are working with an interior design team to discreetly, yet personally, list the names of everyone who is part of the Holy Trinity story. That is a lot of names - people who are here now, and people who were here in the past. We are looking through our records to compile those names, but we could use your help.

We are asking people to share the names of those who have gone before us here. So, who are the people that welcomed you when you first came? Who are the people you could tell stories about from years past? Give us the names and if you want, please share the stories too. We'll be gathering them as well, so that the story of ALL the SAINTS who have been here will be remembered.

Finally, if you can make a donation to help us complete this work, please do. Our Legacy Society Endowment has provided most of the funding we need, but the last 20% is still up to us. Together, we'll make it happen!


### Two New Programs that Help Us Connect to God and One Another!





### Building Use Forms-Yes! We still need these more than ever!





### **Helping Your Church AND Yourself**

You can do both. Your donations to Holy Trinity and other charitable organizations are no longer deductible when the standard deduction option is taken. You may still be able to receive the benefits!

Payments made directly from your IRA to Holy Trinity will <u>not be counted as taxable income</u>. So if you can't deduct the contribution, this provision <u>removes the donation from taxable income</u>, giving you the same benefit as the deduction.

You must start taking RMDs by April 1 of the year after you turn 73. Let's say you celebrated your 73rd birthday on July 4, 2025. You must take the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) by April 1. You'll have to take another RMD by Dec. 31 and by Dec. 31 each year after that. (For tax year 2022, the age for starting RMDs was 72).

Also, people do not have to wait until they are 73 to make those gifts. They are REQUIRED once they're 73, but they are allowed to make the same type of gift at age 70 1/2 which is called a QCD, Oualified Charitable Distribution.

What to do? Contact your IRA provider and arrange for your donation to Holy Trinity to be made from your required minimum distribution. The check must go <u>directly</u> from the IRA fiduciary to Holy Trinity in order to qualify as <u>non-taxable</u> income. ## Church of the Holy Trinity Vestry Minutes August 25, 2025

The Vestry of the Church of the Holy Trinity met August 25, 2025, in the Memorial Room. A quorum was in attendance. Present were Father Clay Lein; Senior Warden Corey Wasserberger; Junior Warden Matt Lundak; Treasurer Jeanne Gaertig; and Vestry Members Liz Bavitz, Michael Cover, Joe Fox, Don Rabbe and Bob Winter. Excused were Clerk Mary Vaughan; Vestry Members Karla Bahm and Roxane Graham.

Father Clay called the meeting to order at 7:02 p..m. and gave an opening prayer. He then led the Bible Study on Isaiah 58:9-12.

Gaertig led a discussion of the July 2025 Financial Statement. She also reported that the Finance Committee is working on an internal audit covering years 2023-2025. It is anticipated their work will be completed prior to beginning 2026 budget considerations.

Father Clay began his Rector's Report with discussion of Phase 1 Project Status. He distributed a Time Line indicating the scheduled start and completion dates for work on the West Addition, the Children's Chapel and the East Canopy. It is anticipated that the West Addition will be completed in December, the Children's Chapel in November, and the East Canopy in October. He anticipates work related to the Narthex will take approximately one week. Also, construction of the Playground Fence is anticipated to begin September 2. Bids for playground equipment exceeded expectations and were for many items not appropriate for the Engagement Playground style which will include a play zone, a water zone and others providing interaction activities. Completion of the Playground is anticipated prior to the May 2026 Arts Festival.

He discussed the Memorial Program for raising the amount between the money set aside at the onset and the possible final cost that results in a \$300,000 difference. He reported that parishioners have already given \$100,000 toward the project and believes that no fundraising campaign is needed or would be appropriate. Keeping the message before the people and their seeing the work as it progresses will provide all that is needed.

Father Clay wants to recognize the people who have contributed to the parish since its beginnings by gathering the names of all members and significant other persons who have called Holy Trinity their home. This would include those of today and those people yet to come throughout the years ahead. These names would be displayed in a permanent fashion in alphabetical order. Based upon Vestry discussion, he moved that the West Entry be named All Saints Hall. Second by Rabbe. Motion approved unanimously.

Fall Ministries will be somewhat restricted due to construction work. The entire parish will be encouraged to participate in His Story, a comprehensive chronological study of the Bible. Details will be presented through various methods and the study will begin September 22. A Sunday morning discussion class will be held with lay leadership. Other activities may arise in response to the study.

He also will encourage participation in Dinner Circles throughout the September to February period. He plans to invite members to two or three circles he will lead and encouraged the Vestry to also form groups. Mary Jo Tietgen will coordinate the Dinner Circles.

Wasserberger noted the beginning of Sunday School was upon us and asked members to remember and pray for the children and teachers. Lundak reported he will coordinate with the overall project contractor regarding possible sub-contractor work on various aspects of the project. It was noted that some Vestry and other parishioners have already volunteered to paint as needed.

There being no futher business to come before the Vestry, an excellent closing prayer was offered by Fox who was thanked by all and it was suggested he take on the task on a permanent basis. The meeting was adjourned at 8:18 p.m.

### Serving in September, 2025—New Process
